TOMMY HARROLSON, manager and owner, G and H Liggett Rexall Drugstore, furnished the following information:

HARROLSON stated that cash-register receipts for cash purchases made in his drugstore are automatically dated by the cash register. He stated that each cash-register receipt carries the title

G and H

Rexall Drug

Columbus, Mississippi

Following this heading is the date of the purchase and below the date of the purchase is the amount of the purchase.

HARROLSON stated that each cash-register receipt has a number; however, these numbers are immaterial to the business of his store. He stated that when the numbers reach a level which he thinks is high, he flips a switch on the cash register and the numbers start over. Therefore, the numbers mean nothing and no information concerning the accounting procedure of the store is filed by these numbers.

HARROLSON continued that the only other tickets handled by his drugstore are charge tickets, which carry the name G and H Liggett Rexall Drugstore, Columbus, Mississippi. He stated that the date has to be written in by a clerk and the numbers on these receipts go only to 50.

HARROLSON stated that his drugstore does put price tags on some articles. He stated that these price tags are labeled Liggett Rexall, and then the price of the article is written on the price tag and the price tag is put on the article.

HARROLSON stated that sacks in which merchandise is placed do not carry the name of his drugstore. He stated that the only other labels used by his drugstore are the labels which are put on prescriptions and that these carry the name G and H Rexall Drugs, Columbus, Mississippi; however, these are not placed on toilet articles.

HARROLSON continued that Liggett Rexall Drugs is a chain operation throughout the South. He stated that his drugstore is the only Liggett Rexall Drugs in the state of Mississippi; however, other Liggett Rexall Drugs are predominant in Alabama, Georgia, and Florida.

HARROLSON was given a description of the unknown subject, and he stated he could not recall having sold any Head and Shoulders shampoo or Palmolive Rapid Shave to any individual answering this description.

He stated that they received three cars of beer with beer dated March 28, 1968, and that they received one car of beer with beer dated March 14, 1968, but none dated March 15, 1968.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM C. MEARNS, at Belzoni, Mississippi:

On April 6, 1968, Mayor HANK GANTZ, Belzoni, Mississippi, was advised concerning the description of the subject. He stated he knows of nobody in Humphreys County who meets the description who he believes would be involved in the assassination. GANTZ advised that Liggett - Rexall is a chain of drugstores owned by the Rexall Drugs. He stated that there used to be two Liggett - Rexall Stores on the Main Street in Memphis, Tennessee. He advised that there may be some Liggett -Rexall's in Birmingham, Alabama.

The following investigation was conducted at Columbus, Mississippi, on April 11, 1968, by SA BRENT W. WARBERG:

TOMMY HARROLSON, owner and manager, G&H Leggitt Rexall Drugs, Columbus, Mississippi, stated that gummed stickers used to mark merchandise in his store are marked with a black marking pencil. He stated that no code numbers are used on these stickers. HARROLSON continued that the Leggitt Rexall Drug Company does have several company owned stores and it is possible that the code used on the gummed labels in company stores may be standarized by the company. He continued that these codes generally give the wholesale price of the article and the date the article is marked. He stated the two outlets for Leggitt Drugs are at their main headquarters in Stanford, Connecticut, and at their southern warehouse in Jacksonville, Florida.

HARROLSON was shown photographs which displayed a tube of Head and Shoulders Shampoo, and an aerosol can of Palmolive Rapid Shave, and stated that according to the gummed labels these articles did not come from his store.

A composite photograph of the unknown subject was shown to HARROLSON and to the other employee of the drug store, SONNY SMITH. Both stated this person was unfamiliar to them.

On April 8, 1968, Mr. HILLIS MC LEMORE, Manager, Graham Paper Company, 750 Ricks, Jackson, Mississippi, advised SA PAUL R. ALKER that the name "Homestead" is the trade name for paper bags distributed by Graham Paper Company. He stated the bag could have been manufactured in a number of mills which manufacture bags for Graham under the trade name and that possibly the point of manufacture could be identified by examination of the bag itself at St. Louis. He stated that they might be able to recognize the die used to imprint the trade name, as there would probably be some slight difference at each of the mills.

He stated that 90 percent of the business in the State of Mississippi is sales to jobbers, who in turn sell to individual stores or retailers. He stated his territory covers central Mississippi, but that he does go up as far as Greenville and Indianola on the west side of the state, but drops down to Macon on the east of the state. Mr. MC LEMORE stated that the Memphis distributor, CHRIS REHKOPF, covers northern Mississippi and that the New Orleans Office covers southern Mississippi. He stated that if given the size of the bag each distributor could tell to which jobbers he had sold bags of that size within the past three months. He stated it would then be necessary to find out from the jobbers to whom they had sold bags.

C. H. HESTER, 801-12th Avenue North, was contacted at his place of employment, the Mississippi National Guard, Amory, Mississippi. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and he furnished the following information:

HESTER stated that his father-in-law, FLOYD AGNEW, is currently the manager at the Ramada Inn in Mobile, Alabama. He stated his father-in-law's address is 2212 St. Teresa, Mobile, Alabama.

HESTER stated he does not know very much about his father-in-law's operation of the Amory Steam Laundry, but he does recall that when laundry was marked, it was marked in indelible ink on the garment and the marking had the initials of the garment owner, then a single numeral designation which was utilized for route delivery in and around the Amory, Mississippi, area. He stated he did not know what brand of machinery is father-in-law utilized at the laundry.

M. D. HOOD was contacted at his place of employment, Hood Laundry. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent. He furnished the following information:

HOOD stated that he purchased the Amory Steam Laundry during the first part of 1964 from FLOYD AGNEW. He stated that he sold the laundry in May, 1964, to W. J. DUNCAN. HOOD continued that during the time he operated the laundry, he knew of no marking machine utilized by the laundry other than the national marking machines that are presently at that laundry. He stated if there was a Thermoseal machine in use prior to his owning the laundry, Mr. AGNEW would have this information. He stated he did not know AGNEW's location, except that he lived in Mobile, Alabama; however, AGNEW's son-in-law, C. H. HESTER, would know AGNEW's address.

W. J. DUNCAN was contacted at his place of employment, Duncan Steam Laundry. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent. He furnished the following information:

DUNCAN stated he is the owner-manager of the Duncan Steam Laundry. He stated he purchased this laundry from M. D. HOOD in May, 1964, and took over operation on May 4, 1964. He stated the laundry was originally known as the Amory Steam Laundry.

DUNCAN stated that he has two marking machines, which he uses to mark laundry. He stated that both of these machines are national marking machines which are manufactured by the National Marking Machine Company, Cincinnatic Ohio. The serial numbers of these machines are 1158-C and 1155-C.

DUNCAN continued that when he took over operation of the laundry, there were also three other marking machines; however, these machines were obsolete and broken down. He stated two of them were national marking machines and the other was a perfection marker which was manufactured in Denver, Colorado. He stated that the machines now in operation were there when he took operation of the laundry and to his knowledge, had been in use at the laundry for several years prior to his taking over control.

DUNCAN stated that his marking machines do not use tape. He marks laundry right on the garment. The ink utilized is indelible black ink. He stated the only code he uses has the initials of the persons or the owner of the laundry, and a dash and a number designation, which is utilized for deliveries by his laundry in the surrounding area. This number designation goes from one to five; the number one being deliveries in Amory, Mississippi, and orders which are brought into the laundry and picked up at the laundry.

Numbers two through five are route numbers, the routes of which are designated by the laundry. He stated that he knew nothing concerning a Thermoseal machine but the previous owner, M. D. HOOD, may know if a Thermoseal machine was utilized by the laundry.

He said he was mistaken regarding the Thermo-Seal machine bearing Serial Number 31214 and Serial Number 31215 having been given to the University of Mississippi at Oxford, Mississippi two or three years ago.

He said a complete check of the records of the Mississippi State Laundry discloses that the two marking machines referred to above were turned over to the Ellisville State School, Ellisville, Mississippi in August, 1965, by the authorities at the Mississippi State Laundry, State College, Mississippi.

The following investigation was conducted at Amory, Mississippi, on April 12, 1968, by SA BRENT W. WARBERG:

ROBERT P. HOOD, co-owner, Hood Brothers Laundry, advised that when he and his brother, M. D. HOOD, purchased the Amory Steam Laundry from FLOYD AGNEW there was an inventory on all laundry equipment made. He stated the original copy of this inventory is maintained with the Bank of Amory, Amory, Mississippi.

HOOD continued that when they originally purchased the laundry there was an abandoned building located in back of the laundry building. This building was filled with old clothing which AGNEW had used for rental clothing, and was also filled with dilapidated machinery. He stated the clothing was sold and the machinery was taken to a dump and disposed of. He stated that if the Amory Steam Laundry had a Thermo-Seal marking machine and it was not listed with the inventory, then this machine was dumped with the dilapidated machinery.

HOOD also stated that the only marking machine which they brought to their present location from the Amory Steam Laundry was a National marking machine which bears Serial Number 1736X10. He stated that at no time does he recall that the Amory Steam Laundry had a Thermo-Seal marking machine.

JOHN B. WRIGHT, Vice President and Cashier, Bank of Amory, made available the original copy of the inventory which was made when ROBERT P. HOOD and M. D. HOOD purchased the Amory Steam Laundry from FLOYD AGNEW. A review of this inventory failed to reflect the purchase of a Thermo-Seal marking machine.

M. E. TOOTLE, Manager, base laundry, Keesler Air Force Base, advised that his business employs four Thermo-Seal machines manufactured by Textile Marking Machines Company, Syracuse, New York.

Mr. TOOTLE advised that to the best of his knowledge, his is the only laundry on the Gulf Coast which utilizes the Thermo-Seal marking machines. He advised that the machine is supplied with tapes which come in eleven various colors, including the color red and he stated his employees merely rotate the color and that therefore, colors have no significance per se.

He further stated that the marking system which he devised for himself, reflects the lot number, employees initials, and bundle number. Mr. TOOTLE advised that his company did not use either of the following codings:

02B-6 or D2B-6.

Mr. TOOTLE made available the following samples from his Thermo-Seal machines as indicated below for submission to the FBI Laboratory for analysis and comparison:

THOMAS N. BEARD, JR., Officer Manager, Long's Laundry and Cleaners, 130 East Main Street, Tupleo, Mississippi, after being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and the nature of the inquiry, advised that his organization has two Thermal-seal marking machines manufactured by Textile Marking Machine Company, Syracuse, New York. Mr. BEARD stated that these marking machines are used only on laundry and are not used on dry-cleaning.

Mr. BEARD stated that the code '02B6" or "D2B6" are not codes used by his company. Mr. BEARD made available two samples of marking tapes, one sample being a striped white and blue tape with the number 66B 1 and a pink tag tape with number 67 B 1 on it. Mr. BEARD stated that the first numerals appearing before the letter are numbered 1 to 100 which denotes the lot number. He stated the letter B would be the first hundred tickets in the lot number, and after 100, would appear a double letter; for example, BB. Mr. BEARD stated the last number, #1, would be the ticket number in the lot. Mr. BEARD stated that his above two colors are the only two colors used by his laundry, and that they do not use a red-colored marking tape.

Mr. BEARD could offer no information concerning the identity of the laundry using the code 02B 6 or D2B 6. He stated that each individual laundry uses their own code.

Mr. BEARD stated that inasmuch as his company was in the process of running full production on laundry,

he could not change his machines to stamp out a code number 02B 6 inasmuch as he would have to run his machine completely through its series and then start over, and this would be impractical to do at the present time.

Mr. BEARD further advised that his company does not keep permanent records concerning customers; however, stated that the following names were not familiar to him:

JOHN WILLARD; HARVEY LOWMEYER; HARVEY LOWMYER or ERIC STARVAL GALT

Mr. BEARD stated that the above machines, which bears serial numbers 11803 and 11804, are the only textile marking machine company machines used by his company in Tupelo, Mississippi. He further stated that he knows of no other laundries in Tupelo, Mississippi, that use this marking machine.

On April 11, 1968, the following individuals were contacted. These contacts represent all dry cleaning and laundry establishments in the Pascagoula-Moss Point area. Persons contacted also stated that the names of JOHN WILLARD and ERIC STARVO GALT are unknown to them:







On 3/18/68, CAROLYN PEYTON, 3190 Sharp, Memphis, Tennessee, telephonically advised the Memphis Office that after viewing the photograph in the newspaper of ERIC STARVO GALT, that she believes GALT would be identical with a person whom she say in Kansas in 1966. She stated that in March, 1966, she was a nurse at Memorial Hospital, Manhattan, Kansas, and that in March, 1966, a Merchant Marine checked into the hospital who claimed to have a back injury. She stated that this individual advised the hospital that he was travelling from Los Angeles to Kansas City, and that the pain in his back became so intense, that he had to check into the hospital at Manhattan.

FEYTON stated this individual was in the hospital for several weeks, but that he was finally dismissed because he had attempted to get drunk while in the hospital. She further stated that the doctors could not find any injury to this individual's back, and that he was dismissed without any medication being administered. However, during the period of time he was in the hospital, he was constantly asking for drugs and pain reliever, although he was only supposed to received this every three hours.

Gentlemen: - I realize that you are flooded with calls and letters from all kinds of Crackpots and my theory may not hold water but if I might have just one thought that would help, in the least, in solving the slaying of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. I would I-would be glad I wrote you. First, that famous letter from Birmingham Jail, mentioned that the writings of Mohandus Ghandi put the whole idea of peaceful resistance in his mind. Ghandi was his hero and he suffered all kinds of persecutions, for his cause. He fasted for days, burned his feet and gave his life, a martyr to the Cause to the poverty of India. Dr. King studied the crucifiction of Christ, also of Paul, Peter and the beheading of John the Baptist and other martyrs. He relished being thrown in jail and the many hardships and persecutions, the insults and shame which he was subjucted to. He said he had conquered the fear of death, so you see what I am leading up to --suicide. Just before Easter, the funeral just before Good Friday, Just in time to get the Civil rights bill passed before adjurnment. He believed his death would accomplish more than he could do otherwise, and rightly so. Please study the film of his last sermon. "I have reached the pinnacle of fullfillment" ect. How was he killed. By a paid professional killer. Maybe a white man, maybe negro, he did not come out the front door and drop his gun, that would have been stupid, he escaped out back and hid some place near and was probably with the "morners" in the street. He had no idea of being apprehended. He was experienced in killing and knew all the tricks of the This tradegy was long and well planned. trade. Dr. King saw no harm in it, as he thought the means were not as important as the end. He wanted his cause to win so badly that he was willing and anxious to die if necessary. I hope you will find the real culpret and I hope no more innocent blocd will be spilled. I'm sorry to take so much of your valuable time, but I just had to get it off my Thanks: chest.
