CRAIG stated to HEALEY that they (not otherwise described) were going to execute the mayor and vice mayor of Atlanta, Georgia. HEALEY also stated that CRAIG bears a strong resemblance to photographs he has seen of JAMES EARL RAY who is presently being sought by the FBI in connection with the assasination of KING. CG 65-122 indicates HEALEY furnished information to the FBI which pertained to the German American Bund. HEALEY at that time as well as at the present time is a writer who publishes magazines. CG indices being reviewed and results will be furnished, if pertinent. Subsequent to indice review Chicago will evaluate and give consideration to reinterviewing HEALEY, for any additional information he may have and also to detemine if he has informant potential. On the previous Sunday evening she had been at the Rogues Roost Country Club, Bridgeport, with JOAN BAXTER, who is employed at Bristol Laboratories and resided at the same address, tekephone 633-9833. She stated that they observed a man who was there between 9:00 and 9:30 PM whom she believes to be identical to JAMES EARL RAY, whose photograph she had observed in the newspaper. She stated she believed this man to be identical with RAY in physical description also. She stated meas driving a new convertible, either Oldsmobile or Pontiac, with New York plates, color maroon or deep red with a white top. She stated he began to follow them home as they left in their car but turned off into the Madison Motel on the Bridgeport-Lakeport Road.

On April 24, 1968, Mr. LEONARD WOOD, owner, and WILFRED FOUNTAIN, Madison Motel, Bridgeport-Bakeport Road, Bridgeport, N. Y., advised that they had had no motel units rented to transients during the previous weekend. The photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT was displayed to FOUNTAIN and WOOD and they advised they did not recognize the photograph as anyone known to them or anyone who had been in the bar of the Madison Motel, over the previous weekend.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LEE M. QUICK:

On April 24, 1968, the photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT on the wanted flyer was displayed to PAULINE LA CASSE and JOAN BAXTER, 7848 Rinaldo West, Bridgeport, New York, and to JACK BULLOCK, Rogues Roost Country Club, Bridgeport, N. Y., and all advised this photograph of ERIC STARVO GALT was not identical with the individual who was in the Rogues Roost Country Club Sunday night.

On May 7, 1968, Mrs. BERNARD NASKLLI, 111 Treeland Circle, Syracuse, New York, advised on that date she had a new milkman who delivered milk to her residence for the Byrne Dairy and she believed this individual was identical possibly with JAMES EARL RAY after seeing the newly released photogram taken in January, 1968, which she had observed on a news program on television.

On May 8, 1968, Mr. RONALD KELLY, Byrne Bairy, Syracuse, N. Y., advised that a man who was new was delivering milk on May 7 in the area around 111 Treeland Circle and this man had been hired on May 1. He stated this man was FRANK FENNER who was originally from Syracuse, N. Y., and who had been employed for may years by Crouse-Heinz Company at Syracuse, N. Y., in addition to other employment, all of which had been checked by him personally prior to hiring FENNER.

Mr. BONALD EROTON, Textile Marking Machine Company, 2204 Rrie Manlevard, East, Syracuse, New York, advised upon examining a color photograph of a tes-shirt and pair of men's shorts, both of which bore a laundry mank on a red colored tape, that this laundry mark was made by a therms-seel machine, that the code on the tape, which he could state was not code recommended by the company, was undoubtedly QZB-6. He further stated that undoubtedly this mark had been made by a machine which was in good condition with a new ribbon and that in all probability the clathing had not been worn since the laundry mark was put on the garments.

Mr. NOTON stated that the mark was made by a machine which was rather unusual in that out of a total of approximately 3,500 such machines made, this particular mark would have been made by one of between five and ten machines.

He stated that this code marking was made by a machine which had five character designation. He noted that the dash in the code was also a character. He stated that these characters would be as follows:

The first two characters would be 15 point type and the last three characters would be 18 point type with the middle character, that is the latter 8 in the above code, a narrow rather than a regular size type.

Mr. EXCRES noted that the nomes! make-up of thermoses! machines with five characters would be for the first three characters to be 15 point type and the last two characters, 18 regular point type.

Mr. Excres made records available which disclosed the identities of locations of machines capable of producing the above code.

At Gloversville, New York

On April 15, 1968, Mr. CALVIN J. SPRUNG, in charge of laundry markings, Robinson and Smith Inc., 335 North Main Street, advised they had never used any letters in their markings. He stated he has been there for 40 years and noted they mark all laundry item by item.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JOSEPH HOLIDAY:

At Windsor, Vermont

On April 16, 1968, Mr. CHARLES BENTON, Williams, Laundry, 7 Maple Street, advised that only dry cleaning/done at the Windsor plant at present. He stated the laundry for that business is all handled at the company plant at Claremont, New Hampshire, which he believes still uses thermo-1 marking system. Mr. BENTON stated the person to contact at the Claremont plant is Mr. KENNETH DAVIS, 80 Hanever Street, Claremont, N. H.

The following investigation was conducted by SA FRED P. LIST:

At Burlington, Verment

On April 16, 1968, Miss MARIE TATRO, Machine Operator, Beardsley Cleaning Company, 315 Shelburne Road, advised the tape of her machine is white and only numbers are used.

At St. Johnsbury, Vermont

Miss DORIS RAY, Machine Operator, Palmer Brothers Cleaning, Eastern Avenue, advised the tape used in her machine is white and the numbers are bigger than the letters and there are two dash marks, one above the other, which appear between each number or letter, not identical to that shown in the photograph.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROBERT S. REA:

Mrs. MARY TARBIO, Phil's Cleaners, Manlius Mart, Manlius, N. Y., advised on April 18, 1968, that they put thermo-sealed marks on shirts only. They noted the laundry is done by another establishment which does not use the thermo-sealed system.

On April 18, 1968, Mr. RAY ADEN, Manager, Oswego County Cleaners Inc., 135 East Bridge Street, Oswego, N. Y., advised as follows:

The laundry places tape on all laundry as well as cleaning items individually, however, neither 02B-6 nor 20R-3 have ever been used. He noted they do have a similar code to that appearing in both tapes but they have never used these particular codes.

He stated the records also showed that the above shipment had been picked up at the Ilion, New York, plant on March 30, 1966, by a driver whose name appears to be RON COTTON, an
