### AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On April 18, 1968, Mrs. HARLEY HERRALD, 974 Cornelius Street, advised SA's WALLACE A. CROSSMON and EDWARD JOSEPH MURPHY as follows:

At 6:35 p.m. on April 17, 1968, Mrs. HERRALD received a person-to-person telephone call from one DAVID HAWKINS. HAWKINS stated that he was "on the run" and was leaving New Orleans, Louisiana, on the morning of April 18, 1968, arriving in El Paso, Texas, in 24 hours. HERRALD asked HAWKINS why he was "on the run", and he replied, "you might say from the family". When HERRALD asked HAWKINS if he was in trouble, HAWKINS replied "I will tell you when I get there".

HERRALD knew HAWKINS when both of them served in the United States Army in Germany during the period from 1955 through 1957 and had corresponded by mail since that time. HAWKINS is about 40 years of age and closely fits the description of the unknown subject. HAWKINS underwent psychiatric treatment in Florida following his release from the United States Army in 1957 and 1958, the reason for treatment not known. The fact that HAWKINS closely resembles the description of the unknown subject, that HAWKINS has had psychiatric problems in the past, and that he was "on the run" indicated to HERRALD the possibility that HAWKINS was the unknown subject.

HAWKINS has resided with his brother, BERNARD HAWKINS, Rfd. #1, Box 18, Wellborn, Florida, since his release from the United States Army in late 1957 or early 1958. Mrs. HERRAID received a letter from HAWKINS postmarked Wellborn,

On 5/9/68, WFO received information that RAY, as ERIC S. GALT, as early as December, 1967, was inquiring as to procedures to enter Rhodesia. In view of this, WFO recommended that plans be effected with the Passport Office, United States Department of State, to arrange for a systematic review of all passport applications received since RAY's prison escape in April, 1967.

This project was commenced and over 700,000 of a total of about 2,100,000 applications were reviewed before the project was halted on 6/4/68, as a result of investigative developments from a similar project in Canada.

As many as 36 Agents a day were used in this review which in some instances consisted of round-the-clock work. Miss FRANCES G. KNIGHT, Director, Passport Office, and Mr. ROBERT D. JOHNSON, Deputy Director, Passport Office, were most cooperative in arranging for this review.

Miss KNIGHT unhesitatingly made available the full facilities of the Passport Office and Mr. JCHNSON made arrangements for passport employees to be on duty in order that WFO's search could be continued during other than normal working hours. He also arranged for Agent personnel to use the garage facilities of the Passport Office in view of the absence of public transportation available to Agent personnel arriving for work or departing from work at the Passport Office at midnight.

It is recommended that the Director send a letter to Miss KNIGHT expressing appreciation for her warm and whole-

ROBERT F. BENNETT, Washington Representative, Public Relations Office, J. C. Penney, Incorporated, Executive Building, 1030 15th Street, North West said he learned from his father Senator WALLACE BENNETT of Utah, the following:

On April 3, 1968, the day before the assassination of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, a group of industrialists in the Chicago area who have business interests in Utah gave a cocktail reception for Senator WALLACE BEANETT. Afterwards a smaller group of five or six of these industrialists had dinner with Senator BENNETT. One of these persons said a man who used to work for him was the personal chauffeur for Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING and this man came to him for advice. The chauffeur for KING said KING required him to carry over \$200,000.00 in cash in a black bag at all times. The chauffeur was concerned about his job as a chauffeur inasmuch as he recognized the possibility of being robbed or KING himself being killed for the money.

The industrialist advised the chauffeur to quit but to furnish KING another reason for quitting.

ROBERT BENNETT said the host of the dinner was CHARLEY BARR, Standard Oil of Indiana, telephone 312 431-6314, Chicago, Illinois. Also BARR was present at the dinner and could furnish the names of the persons present including the name of the person who formerly employed KING's chaufeur and related the information about a black bag containing \$200,000.00. ROBERT BENNETT added he had contacted his father Senator BENNETT for the name of the person but his father could not recall the name of the individual who related the incident.
