PROFESSIONAL SUMMARY

Inmate No. 10101 Age 27 Date 7-19-55

This Professional Summary is being prepared at the request of the United States Penitentiary at Leavenworth, Kansas, where this former inmate is serving a sentence of 3 years and 9 months for Forging Money Orders. This request was forwarded from the Joliet Diagnostic Depot. The material in this Summary is derived from the files of the Criminologist and should be regarded as confidential.

Inmate was received at the Joliet Diagnostic Depot 6-13-52, to serve a sentence of 1 to 2 years for Robbery. He had held up a taxicab driver in Chicago, taking his vehicle, and was apprehended shortly thereafter by the police, who shot him during the capture. He admitted his guilt, stating that he was heavily intoxicated and had used a pipe in place of a gun, placing it at the back of the driver's body. He had previously been on a 2-year probation in Los Angeles, California, for burglary, he being caught in the act of entering a restaurant from a back stairway.


He was born at Alton, Illinois, [redacted], the oldest of three children, his father working regularly as a railroad brakeman until his death in 1917. He was raised primarily in Quincy, Illinois, where he graduated from eighth grade and later had some high school training under the G. I. Bill. He was in the Army between 2-18-46 and 12-23-46, when he was honorably discharged for lack of adaptability. He had been in Chicago for a short time prior to the offense, and had had several short term jobs as a factory hand or store room worker. He was unmarried, and seemed to be somewhat of a solitary person, with occasional alcoholic excesses.

On the Army Alpha examination, he scored 111, or superior. It was thought that he had no systematic delinquent traits, and segregation at Pontiac was recommended.

At Pontiac, he requested a farm assignment, and was so placed, after a short period in the inmates' kitchen. He worked as a cook in the farm dormitory, and a halper in the officers quarters, and was always considered an average worker. He had no punishment reports.

The latest medical report in our possession, dated 1-30-53, is essentially negative, and he was never referred to the psychiatrist for any unusual or abnormal behavior. Our office had a couple of routine contacts with him, and it appeared that he had been behaving unstaticly ever since leaving the Army, and that he was subject to impulsive delinquent behavior in connection with drinking, which, in turn, was related to his tendency to become easily discouraged. Our last contact with him was on 2-19-54.

He was discharged by expiration of sentence on 3-12-54.

PRESENT OFFENSES:

Official Versions: On April 1, 1955, Ray entered a plea of guilty to an information in one count charging him with forging the endorsement on a U.S. Post Office money order and he was sentenced to serve one and a half years. On July 1, 1955 another information was filed against him in three counts, charging offenses at Hot Springs National Park, Arkansas. He was also charged in an information with an offense connected with a money order at Tallahassee, Florida. He received a total of three and three-fourths years for these various offenses.

The facts which were brought out in this case indicate that on March 7, 1965 the U.S. Post Office at Kellerville, Illinois was burglarized and sixty-six blank U.S. Postal Money Orders and the office validating stamp were stolen. The following day at Aiton, Illinois an unsuccessful attempt was made to cash one of these stolen money orders. Several other money orders were cashed at various places, and it was finally learned that Ray and his co-defendant, Walter Terry Rife, our 72497-L, were the persons who were attempting to cash these money orders. At the time of their apprehension thirty four of the money orders which had been stolen from the post office were found hidden under the dash above the glove compartment in the automobile, all of which had been dated and stamped with the validating stamp and some which had been made out ready for cashing while others had not.

Through questioning and admissions on the part of Ray and Rife, all of the sixty six money orders were accounted for with the exception of two, and Ray has admitted cashing one of them at a luggage store in Kansas City, Kansas and Rife admits cashing one of them at Miami Beach, Florida. Thus the entire group of sixty six money orders has actually been accounted for. Following their apprehension the Postal Inspectors obtained from the room occupied by Ray and Rife a quantity of merchandise they had acquired by passing the money orders and this merchandise was eventually returned to the persons from whom it was secured by this fraud.

Inmate's Version: Other than to admit that he had gone on a spree of cashing these money orders, Ray had no further information to give and no statement to make.

Previous Institutional Adjustments: Ray was committed to the Illinois State Penitentiary on July 13, 1952 to serve one to two years for robbery. On May 6, 1952 he had held up a Red Top cab driver at gun point and took from him \$11.00 belonging to the cab company, and then ordered the cab driver out of the cab and drove off in the cab. He was apprehended shortly thereafter by police who shot him during the capture and he admitted his guilt. He claims that he was heavily intoxicated at the time and had used a pipe in place of a gun, placing it at the back of the driver's body. He had a good adjustment at the Pontiac Division of Illinois State Prison, was assigned to their honor farm where he worked as a cook in the farm dormitory and as a helper in the officer's quarters. He was considered an average worker and had no punishment reports. He was discharged by expiration of sentence March 12, 1954.

FAMILY BACKGROUND:

Ray says that both of his parents were born in the state of Illinois and that they

are both now deceased. He says his father died of a heart attack in 1947 and his mother died in 1949 of causes not given. He claims that he is an only child.

PERSONAL HISTORY:

It would appear that Ray was born at Alton, Illinois on March 10, 1928 the only child of parents and resided in the parental home in Alton until about 16 years of age. However, during this period of time he frequently visited with his paternal grandparents in Quincy, Illinois. When he was about 18 years of age he joined the U.S. Army where he remained from February 19, 1946 until December 25, 1948 when he received an honorable discharge under Article of War 615-360 inaptness and lack of adaptability for military service. He had foreign service from July 16, 1946 to December 21, 1948. Following discharge from military service he resided for a short time at Quincy, Illinois and then moved to Chicago where he stayed for about six months and then went on out to Los Angeles, California. He was convicted of a burglary in Los Angeles and when released on probation from that sentence he returned to Chicago where he lived alone until he was committed to the Illinois State Penitentiary in 1952. Since his release from the Illinois State Penitentiary he has been rather nomadic, but considers Quincy, Illinois as his residence.

Ray claims that he completed eight grades at St. Mary's School in Alton, Illinois and that while residing in Chicago in 1952 he attended the Academy of Adults and obtained the equivalent of a two year high-school education.

Ray has not had much of an employment history. The last employment he had was with an uncle in Quincy, Illinois and he refused to reveal the name of the uncle to the U.S. Probation Officer. However, he gave us the name of William Mahor, 1138 E. 7th St., Alton, Illinois. He also gave us the name of an aunt, Lucille Ryan, 601 W. 12th St., Quincy, Illinois. Neither of these parties has answered our inquiry. He claims that from August, 1951 to May of 1952 he was employed by the Berg Erickson Corp., in Chicago, Illinois and that employment was terminated when he was sent to the penitentiary for robbery. Other employment prior to this is listed under the employment section of page one of the classification study.

Ray has never been married.

EVALUATION, RESOURCES & PLANS:

Ray has no property and says he has no particular plans for the future at this time. He would like to work on a farm, pointing out that he was a trusty at the Illinois State Penitentiary. He admits drinking to excess at times. Just what motivates him to commit crime is not known.

ADMISSION UNIT REPORT:

This man has a good attitude towards his sentence. He has no resentments and states that he feels as though the Court gave him a break. His adjustment in the population should be good. States that he had no difficulties while on a previous sentence in Illinois. This man seemed to be a rather nervous person while being interviewed but was cooperative with the program while in this unit. He states that he would like to work in the kitchen as a helper. He stated that he worked on the farm while serving time at Pontiac, Ill. He keeps himself clean

RE: CONSIDER FOR TRANSFER TO THE HONOR FARM

Ray is serving an aggregate sentence of 3 Years and 9 Months, which he received on 7-1-55 in the U. S. District Court at Kansas City, Mo., for forging postal money orders. He was committed to this institution on 7-7-55 and became eligible for parole consideration on 9-30-56. He declined to file for parole. Ray is in Medium Custody, has no detainers lodged against him and, since commitment to this institution, has received one disciplinary report. That occurred on 9-13-55 for being not dependable, lack of interest in his job. On this occasion he was given 30 days restriction and a job change. His conditional release date of 5-20-58 has been advanced to 4-30-58, by his having earned 20 days of APT on his Bakery assignment as of 8-31-57.

Ray has been working in the Bakery since 3-8-56. He is assigned as a bench hand, working nights, and has consistently earned outstanding work reports. He is a vocational trainee in the Bakery and has been receiving MFT on this assignment since 11-1-56. He also receives a \$10 per month monetary grant, which was effective 4-1-57, to continue through January 1958. He will be eligible for certification on his vocational training program on 9-4-57. Ray is a Catholic and the Chaplain reports that he is negligent and indifferent toward his religious duties. The records of the Education Department indicate that Ray has completed courses in Spanish, Constitutional Government and Typing. He is also enrolled in courses in Baking Theory, Related Training, and in Applied English and Elementary Vocabulary.

Ray is 29 years old. He is serving his second institutional sentence. He has no escape record. During a previous sentence at the Pontiac Branch of the Illinois State Prison, he was assigned to their honor farm, where he worked as a cook in the farm dormitory and as a helper in the officers' quarters. He was considered an average worker and had no punishment reports. He was discharged by expiration of sentence 3-12-54, after completing a 1- to 2-year sentence for robbery. Ray has requested assignment to our Honor Farm. Although his parents are deceased, he indicates he maintains correspondence with an aunt, a Lucille Ryan, residing in Quincy, Ill., his place of legal residence.

The Medical Dept. reports that Ray has not been referred for formal psychiatric examination to date, that he is physically fit for transfer to the Honor Farm, and that he has not been critically ill and is working regularly.

RECOMMENDATION: On November 1, 1956, Ray was approved for meritorious good time and on March 18, 1957, he was given \$10.00 a month April thru January. When the Classification Committee recommended his transfer to the Farm it was also recommended that he retain the monetary portion of the award. Inmate has completed Vocational Training. He has had only one conduct violation which occurred within two months after his arrival here July 7, 1955.

He was received at this institution on July 7, 1955. Ray became eligible for parole consideration on Sept. 30, 1955, but he has never filed application for a parole interview. At the time of initial classification, Ray was placed under medium custody and assigned to the Fixe Department. He remained on such assignment until Sept. 15, 1955 when he was reassigned to the Paint Shop. On Sept. 12, 1957, Ray was approved for our Honor Farm but was never actually transferred to such assignment due to the fact that he did not feel he could live in an Honor Farm Dormitory because they are integrated. Due to this fact, he was never placed under such status. He was assigned to our Bakery where he remained until released on CR. Ray has no detainers on file against him and has received a total of one disciplinary report. This report occurred on Sept. 13, 1955 when he was reported for lack of interest in his job. For this report, he was placed under thirty days restriction and given a job change.

On Nov. 1, 1956 Ray was approved for ACT only and remained under such status until his release. He was also granted a monetary award of \$10 per month for April of 1957 thru Jan. 1958 on a 1/75 basis.

Release plans call for Ray to return to his place of conviction in Kansas City, Missouri where he will reside alone. He was referred to our Employment Placement Service who in turn referred him to Mr. Robert Lutz, Employment Counsellor, Mo. State Employment Service, 1411 Walnut Street, Kansas City, Missouri.

Ray is being released with a total of \$99.33 in his personal account, \$64.70 is being given to him in cash. The remaining \$34.63 is being forwarded to the USPO, Kansas City, Missouri. Ray was also given a \$1 for bus fare to Kansas City.

He will be under supervision until Oct. 2, 1958.
