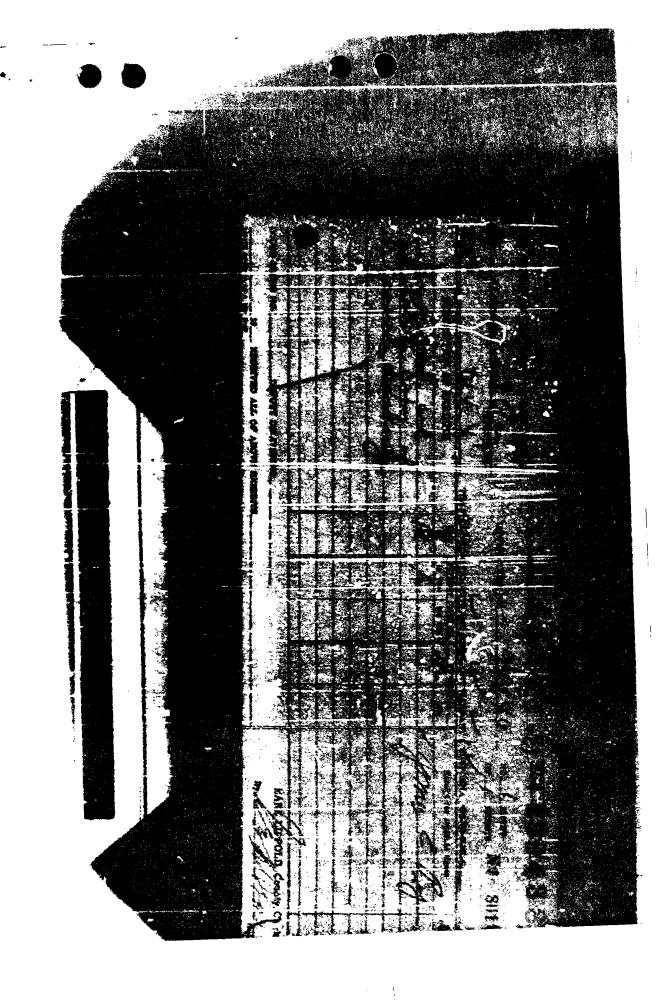

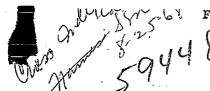

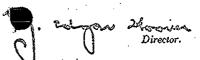

"Wichita, Kansas, September 19, 1968

"I Bill Gordon Steinhoff hereby make the following free, and voluntary statement to James F. Miller, who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me to induce me to make this statement. Agent Miller has furnished me a written document showing my rights which I have read and signed waving these rights.

"I was born on in St. Louis, Missouri, and have a High School education."

"While I was incarcerated in the Tennessee State Penitentiary in Nashville Tennessee sometime in 1964 & 1965 I was given the job as Head Clerk in the Prison Hospital. While on this job I met another inmate which I had done time with in the Missouri State Penitentiary by the Name of George Jones. We were both doing time in Nashville and had both escaped from Missouri. Jones from Moberly and myself from Jefferson City. Jones was sentenced to one year and myself to three years in Nashville. Jones was released some months before I was and was returned to the Penitentiary in Jefferson City.

"Another Inmate in Nashville by the Name of Gene Jacobs was admitted to the Prison Hospital Convelesant Ward although there was nothing the matter with him. I learned later that he was a City Councilman and was put in the Hospital so he could watch T.V. and eat out of the Hospital Kitchen. Although he was a patient in the Hospital he was allowed to go to the yard or any where else he wanted,

"One day while I was watching T.V. in the Convelasent Ward Jacobs started talking to me about my escaping from the Penitentiary and how I had done this. He asked me at this time if I knew Jimmy Ray who was confined in Missouri. I told him no that I did not know him

Jacobs asked me if I would help some one personally. escape if I could and I told him yes. He said no more about this matter for about two weeks but during this time he bought me Cigarettes and other things from the Commissary. One day Gene asked me if I would be willing to take some money to Missouri with me and give it to George Jones who was already there, asked him how much and what I would get for it. He told me that I would get Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars for myself if I would give Jones Five Hundred Dollars to help another inmate get away from the Penitentiary. agreeded to do this, although I did not know who was to escape. A few days later Gene received a visit from his wife and when he returned he gave me Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars in Cash. He gave me Five One Hundred Dollar Bills, a Fifty, Five Twentys and Ten, Ten Dollar Bills. Upon my release about Oct. 1965 I was picked Lt. Orvil Turner the Warrant Officer from the Missouri State Penitentiary and another man acting as guard which I did not know. The morning I dressed out in Nashville I put on a pair of boxer shorts which I had cut in the front seam and inserted all but One Hundred and Fifty Dollars. This Hundred and Fifty Dollars I placed in my sock as I knew they made you take your shoes off and searched your socks before they handcuffed you. As Lt. Turner was searching me he felt the bottom of my socks and felt this lump and asked me what it was and I said it was my money. He asked me where I got it and I told him I had been saving it. He turned to the Officer from the Nashville Penitentiary who was present all this time and asked him what he should do with it. They went into the Deputy Wardens Office and when he returned he said it would be placed in my property as the Deputy Warden said he couldn't take as I had it in my possession. Although this money is not allowed in the Penitentiary. When I returned

to the State Penitentiary in Missouri I told them I had had trouble with some other inmates which I named and wanted to be placed in Maximum Security, I knew that Lt. James Stewart was the Officer in charge there and liked me. Although the Inmates I named were no longer in the Penitentiary they placed me in Maximum Security. This money was taken into Maximum Security by my self and I was never searched as Lt. Stewart knew me. I removed this money from my shorts and placed it in a pair of new socks which I had three pairs of I sealed the wrapper back up and they were never bothered. One day my cell mate was talking to me about wishing he had some Green Money to buy some powder with and I told him that he would have to get it when he went to population. This Inmate's name was Frank Downey. A few days later they were taking me some where up front and I told Downey that I had some money in my socks and if they did anything to me to be sure and hold it for me. returned to my cell and found that Downey did not bother my socks so I forgot it. Downey was released to Population a few days later and I was alone in this cell. About a week later I asked the walk man if he would sell me a carton of cigarettes for a ten dollar bill as I had none and could not obtain any from the Inmate Canteen for another week. He said he would. The next day I asked this Inmate about the Cigarettes and he said that he would bring them around a little later. He did this and I gave him a ten dollar bill which I learned later he gave to the Sgt, in Maximum Security by the Name of Hendley. About four days later myself and three other inmates were allowed to go to the Exercise yard. While I was out there Lt. Stewart came up and sit down by me and said that he had heard that I had some square money. I told him that I did not, that he must be talking about the money Lt. Turner found in my sock in Nashville. He did not question me any further about this matter. I had already asked Lt. Stewart about a job as his clerk in Maximum Security and he told me he would see about it. The following

week I asked Lt. Stewart again about the job and he said that if I would give him the money he would get it for The next day I gave Lt. Stewart Five Ten Dollar Bills. The following week I was assigned as clerk in Maximum Security. One day while going after the mail with the Sgt. I saw George Jones in Control Center and he came up to the Treasurers Office where I waited while the Sgt. went and picked up the mail. It was at this time that I gave Jones the Five One Hundred Dollar Bills, When I gave Jones the money he was expecting it but he didn't say what it would be used for. I returned to Maximum Security and about three weeks later I quit my job in Maximum Security and went to Population. I was out about three months and Jones said that it would be better if people thought we were enemys. So I told the Warden that Jones, and some other Inmates were after me and I went back to work in Maximum Security. After a few months I returned to Population and went to work as Night Clerk in Control Center, On this job I had the run of the Penitentiary and could eat any time I wanted to do so. After a few days Jones who was the head baker in the bakery shop in the kitchen sent me word to come down and eat breakfast with him early. I started eating breakfast with Jones before the Morning Meal was fixed. We got to talking one morning about Dr. Martin Luther King getting killed and how they were hunting Jimmy Ray for questioning in this. I told him at this time I had my doubts wheather he did it or not. But Jones seemed to think he had. Jones told me how he had been questioned about helping Jimmy escape in the bread box. Jones never told me who he gave the Five Hundred Dollars to and I never mentioned it. For several days Jones would talk about Jimmy escaping and how it made the Warden look bad and he was sure glad he got away. I was released from Prison later and have had no contact with George Jones since then.

"During my conversations with Jones he told me that Jimmy Ray had gone out in the bread box. Jones did not say he helped him but he seemed to know an awful lot about it and talked about it all the time. NC 44-760

"I have typed this statement at my own suggestion and the information contained therein is from memory. I do not wish to testify to this matter as I fear some thing may happen to myself or my family. I would be willing to cooperate as long as there is no publicity.

He claimed he did not know what JACOBS was incarcerated for but he had heard something to the effect that it might have to do with some type of election violation.

8/30/68

On August 23, 1968, Mr. HAKVEY A. KINGMEAN and Mrs. CLARA S. KLINGEMAN. Sympers, Indian Trail Restaurant, 507 Chestnut Street, Winnetka, Illinois, phone HI 6-1703, residence 391 Linden, Winnetka, Illinois, phone HI 6-2932, were interviewed jointly in the conference room at the Winnetka, Illinois, Police Department, after being introduced to the interviewing Agents by Chief DON DERNING (NA), Winnetka, Illinois, Police Department.

They advised that on Tuesday, August 70, 1968; they were contacted by <u>VILLIAN BRADFORD RVIE, Nartselié, Asbama,</u> who is the author of "Three Lives for Mississippi". Hr. MVIE was accompanied by Mr. (First Name Unknown) MANSKN, who is a photographer for "Lock" magazine. Mr. HUTE exhibited letters which he claimed were from JAMES BANG RAY and were addressed to a Mississippi attorney. These letters were purportedly given to HULK by the attorney. HULE told then that he had obtained all conmercial rights to RAY's story and for this he has agreed to underwrite the costs of MAY's defense in the forthcoming marder trial in Memphis. Termessee. The aforecentioned letters were writted on half sheets of yellow legal foolscap and both of the KLIKSMARs stated that they recognized the handwriting on these papers as that of the subject RAT, when they knew under the name of JOHN RATMS. At this point, the KLINGHANS were exhibited several photographs of the subject, JAMES EARL RAY, along with other photographs and they both positively identified JAMES EARL RAY as a man employed by them from May 3, 1967, to June 24,1967, as a dishwisher and cook's beloer. The KLLMGMANs verified the foregoing statement by furnishing to the interviewing Agents their payroll ledger sheet. A review of the ledger sheet reveals the following information:

They also made available the following listed payroll checks will drawn on the Winnetka Trust and Savings Bank bearing the identification in the upper left-hand corner of Indian Trail Restaurant, Inc., 507 Chestmat Street, Winnetka, Illinois, 60003, made out to either JOHN L. RAYNS of JOHN RAYNS and signed by MARVEY A. KLINGEMAN. The checks are endorsed by JUHN L. RAYNS or JOHN RAYNS, two of which have the eddress 1648 Lunt, Chicago, undermeath the signature. These checks are as follows:

The foregoing checks total 5664.34.

Mr. KLINGEPAN advised that to the best of his recollection at this time, the last check, Number 5357, was mailed to RAY's brother, name unrecalled, in Northbrook, Illinois, at RAY's request since he left his employment prior to receipt of the check, stating that he was going to work on boats with his brother. As Mr. KLINGEMAN recalls, he received a letter from RAY requesting that the pay due be sent to his brother.

Both of the KLINGEMANS characterized JAMES BAN.
BAY as an excellent employee, quiet, attentive, prompt,
polite, a very good worker, but to their knowledge,
had no friends or visitors during the time of his
employment. They did recall that during the subject's
last week of employment, he received three or four phone
calls from a male individual who streed that he was RAY's brother.
They could not recall the individual's name, nor did they
believe that they would recognize this person's voice if they
heard it again.

In conversation with Mr. HUIE, the KLINGNMANS received the following information on a confidential basis and advised that they were rather rejuctant to divulge it, but felt that it was their duty as citizens. They requested that this information be maintained on a confidential basis within the FBI. They advised that they contacted Chief DEENING because of his reputation and are now following his advice in furnishing this information to the FBI:

Mr. Will dowed the KLINGDMAN'S letters from RAY in which RAY listed employment at the Indian Trail Restaurant. (It should be noted that this restaurant is an old, large, upper class restaurant, of excellent reputation. Chief DEDNING advised that the KLINGBMAN themselves have an excellent reputation within the community and that he holds then in very high regard). HULB told them that RAY had served seven years of a twenty-year sentence at Jefferson, Missouri, prison, during which time he had eight visitors, one of whom was his brother, however, WIIE did not identify which emo. Prior to his escape, RAY had stashed away a rezon, green prison trousers which had been dyed black, and 12 hersey bars in anticipation that he would have to go without food for some time. RAY also had \$300 in his shoe. He ascaped in a bred truck and welked to Chicago, Illinois, from Jefferson City, Missouri, which took him about eight days. (The KLINGWANs do recall that when the subject first appored at the restaurant, his feet were swollen and that their sister-in-law gave him two Ace bandages to use which he returned three or four days later. This supposedly was mentioned in the letter in MUE's possession).

Thereafter, RAY read the advertisement in the Tribune wheeln the KLINGSMAN's had advertised for help in the restaurant. NUIE said that the subject in the letter

mentioned that the employment at the Indian Trail Restaurant was the "high point of his life".

HUIE mentioned that RAY had had only three jobs in his life, one of which was in a whoe factory outside of East St. Louis, Illinois, which we prior to his going to prison the last time. He also said that during the time RAY was employed at the restaurant, he was "tapped on the shoulder" by an individual who recognized him and who threatened to reveal his identity to the police and cause RAY's return to prison if he, RAY, did not work for this person. HUIE said that RAY was given \$1,200 during the initial centacts, by the alleged compirators, and was ultimately paid \$15,000, but was due to receive more.

Again, seconding to MUIE, RAY was told to go to Canada to investigate the difficulty of crossing the bonder. Supposedly RAY made two trips through the Detroit Tunnel into Canada. He also made a third trip to Canada, date and sequence not given, and "was instructed to obtain a 40-year-old newspaper, get the memor of the males born that dte, and search the current phone directory for similar names. He was then to surveil the individuals with similar names to determine whether or not his physical description was similar to theirs. Thereafter, he talephoned persons of his like description, utilizing a pretent, and thereby found a mane who had never applied for a passport. RAY then applied for a passport in this name.

The KLINGHAMS advised that they were not sure that they were furnishing this information in its proper sequence, but that to the hest of their recollection, the information preceding and following was given to them in this order by HUIR. Thereefter, HAT was given more money to purchase a Mustang which was to be driven to Acapuice, Mexico, for the purpose of obtaining a tourist sticker. He then drawn through Hemico to the West Coast and had out there to receive further instructions from the other individuals in the alleged comspiracy. HUIR stand that RAT was flown to Atlanta from the West Coast, but the time was not right, there was no action and was sent back to California. He was also told to be in Mississippi at a castain time and place. Supposedly Meyerend MaRTIN LUMBER KING, JR. was at an Holiday Inn Motel in Atlanta, Georgia, when RAT was flown there.

Subsequently, RAY was given money to obtain binoculars and a shotgun and was to go to Hemphis to be subswhere at 3 p.m. in room 312 or 13. Supposedly there were other individuals who also came to this room and there was a Negre male who purportedly called KING out to the beloomy. According to HULE, the actual marderer of KING was not RAY, although RAY was present and at a later time (probably the trial) RAY will identify the murderer. RAY did pick up the rifle, ran to his car, and sped to a rendesvous in Atlanta, Georgia. He was supposed to pick up a "bundle of manay", however, the conspirators did not appear. RAY allegadly spent neveral days or hours at this apartment in Atlanta, Georgia, avaiting the errival of his "fallow conspirators".

According to MUIR, the plan was for RAY to go to Mexico, but immediately fly north to throw off pursuit and to steer all investigation to Mexico. However, since the conspirators did not appear in Atlanta, RAY fled to Camba thereafter utilizing his knowledge to obtain a passport and fled to England.

The KLINGHAMS advised that the rest of HJIE's story substantially follows the newspaper accounts which appeared after subject RAY's arrest in Regiand. They did note that HUIE stated that RAY did rob a bank in Logdon because he "got real low on money". HUIE at no time identified the alleged fellow conspirators of RAY. He did swear the KLINGHAMS to secrecy and told them that he would mail the "Look" proofs on September 10,1968, and the story would be in the Howenber 10,1968, issue of Look magazine. Both Hr. and Hrs. KLINGHAM advised that they would make these proofs available to the interviewing agents for review.

The KLINGHAM advised that HAY began working for them as a dishwasher and because of his excallent attitude was advanced to cook's helper. During the time he was in their amploy, they did not observe him in a car, nor did they know him to own an extempile. He had no visitors, he did not year glasses, he had no women friends, nor did he make any advances toward the female personnel employed at the restaurang and they noted that his hair was "less bushy" during the time he was at the restaurant than shown in the photographs.

They are not sure how be came to work from his apartment, but believe heatght have becoment at the Eden's Expressively by WILLIE PERRY and PRED BURRS, who were also employees at the restaurant.

His conduct was excellent and they cannot recall him making any comments one way or another about members of the Negro race and specifically no comments whatsoever concerning MAKITA LUINER KING, JR. NAY made no reference to his previous employment, but did mention that he was in Brimerhaven, Germany, during World War II. They advised that when BAT received the phone calls during his last weak of employment he seemed to be disturbed and that his concentration on his work was not as good as it usually was.

They then recalled that according to HVIE, that when JAMES EARL RAY left England, he was going to lisbon to get to Africa, however, he was unable to do so which is when he returned to England and held up a bank receiving about \$200 in lost. They again stated that the information funnished to them by HULE came from betters which EAY had written to his attorney, who is turn turned them over to the author. Also Mr. KLINGSMAN stated that in one of the letters which he believed was to the attorney from RAY, while he was in London, England, there was a drawing identifying a location which appeared to be Diversey Street and Shaffield Avenue in Chicago, Illinois.

At the conclusion of the interview, the Klingmans again requested that this information be reintained in confidence and expressed a willingness to co-operate with the VSI in ay way possible.

Mr. DUNNELLY advised the photograph of JAMES SAEL RAY looks familiar to him; however, he could not be certain if this person was identical with the wan who registered as JUMN LARRY MAYUS.

Mr. DOMNLAN advised the individual he recalled as being identical with the man who used the name JOSN LABRY RAYMS and who excupied the rear basement apartment had trouble with his feet. He recalled this individual had to reb some kind of preparation on to his feet. Mr. DOMNLAN stated this man did not have any visitors and he did not know of any associates of this individual. 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on barges. He also recalled that when Mr. RAYMS left the apartment, he said he was going to Canada and was going to look for a job in Canada. Mr. DONNELLY could not recall if this man received any mail while he stayed at the apartment.

Mr. DONNELLY said he did not know if Mr. RAYMS had a car or where he worked. He did not know what of type of work he did, but he did know he left the apartment every day as if to go to work.

Mr. DONNELLY described JOHN LARRY RAYMS as a white, male, age 30 to 40, medium height, slender build, dark bair.

Hr. DONNELLY advised after looking at the xerox copy of page 13 of the rent record book that it appeared the next person to rent the rear basement apartment was GEORGE WASHINGTON WACHS, Jr.

Ar. DOWNELLY stated that someone of the individuals who had lived in his apartments had told him he was moving out of the apartment to go home and stand trial for murdering his brother-in-law. However, Mr. DOWNELLY was unable to recall who had made this statement to him, and he did not know if this statement had been made by Mr. NAYMS or some other person.

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GLORIA BONNELLY 2731 North Sheffield Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, telephone number LA 5-0691, was interviewed at her residence. Mrs. DONNELLY advised she and her husband, EDWARD, own the building at 2731 North Sheffield. Mrs. DONNELLY stated that they rent apartments in the basement and on the second floor of their building.

Mrs. DONNELLY reviewed the Rest Becord Book maintained for the rentals at 2731 North Sheffield, and determined there was an entry dated April 30, 1967, showing a rental to a JOHN LARRY RAYES. Mrs. DONNELLY stated the handwriting on the entry would be the handwriting of the person renting the room. This person occupied the rear basement apartment.

Mrs. DONNELLY advised from the Rept Record Book she could not determine how long this individual stayed at the appriment; however, the best she could recall at this time was that Mr. RAYES stayed there approximately three or four weeks. Mrs. DONNELLY advised the apartment is rented by the week and the rental is \$12, or \$13 a week.

Mrs. DONNELLY stated she had some difficulty recalling this individual but to the best of her recollection he was a quiet man who did not associate with anyone else in the building and did not have any friends or visitors come by the apartment. She further recalled Mr. RAYMS had complained of his feet hurting. She sate on one or two occasions when she was in the rear basement apartment while he was renting it, she noticed he had a lot of books and had bought some cooking utensils.

Nes. DONNELLY said that Hr. BAYMS received one letter that she knew of while he stayed at the apartment. This letter was from some place in Canada; after receiving this letter, Mr. RAYMS came up and told them he was going to move and go to Canada. He said he was going to work in Canada. Hrs. DONNELLY advised he said something about trying to get on a ship; however, she could not recall any further details of this comment. Hrs. DONNELLY said that

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after receiving the letter, RAYMS moved the same day. He did not leave a forwarding address or indicate where he was going; however, he left the distinct impression he was going to Canada in answer to the letter received.

Mrs. DONNELLY advised that while Mr. RAYMS mented the basement aparament, he went to work, or at least left the house daily by 7:00 a.m. She advised she could not recall Mr. RAYMS having any type of car.

Mrs. PONNELLY said that her aunt, JEAN WILES, who had resided with her rented the apartment to Mr. REAMS. Mrs. DONNELLY advised JEAN WILES passed away on May 1, 1968; she recalled her aunt told her this man came into the apartment as a result of seeing an advertisement in the local newspaper called "The Booster". Mrs. DONNELLY advised this is a neighborhood paper and they run advertisements in this paper whenever they have a vacancy.

Mrs. DONNELLY stated the only ones in the building now who would have been in the building at the time Mr. RAYES occupied the basement apartment are ANNIE KEEGAN and EDWARD SPERLING. She stated that these two persons rent rooms on the second floor.

Mrs. DONNELLY advised DOROTHY LEHNING and her daughter, PHYLLIS, had occupied the front basement apartment for approximately two years. They moved some time in the spring of 1967, and may have been living in the front basement apartment at the same time that Mr. RAYMS was living in the rear basement apartment.

Mrs. DONNELLY reviewed her Rent Records, and from these records she advised an individual named <u>CEONGE</u>
WASHINGTON WACHS, JR. appeared to be the next man to rept the rear basement apartment. The record book showed that Mr. WACHS rented this apartment on May 17, 1967, or June 17, 1967.

We. DONNELLY stated there is currently a disconnected phone in the rear basement apartment. She did not know how long this phone had been in the apartment or if it had been connected when Mr. RAYMS lived in the apartment. Mrs. DONNELLY checked this phone and determined the number on the phone is 327-0336.

Mrs. DONNELLY stated she could not recall Mr. BAYMS leaving anything behind when he left other than

some cooking utensils, which would have been left in the apartment for the use of other occupants of that apartment.

Mrs. DONNELLY described JOHN L. RAYMS as follows: a white male, in his late 20's or early 30's, tall and thin, dark hair. She could not be more specific in her description.

Mrs. DONNELLY made available page number 13 of her Rent Record Book which that aimed the signature of JOHN LARRY RAYNS.
