

- Further to paragraph 10 of PCR dated 19 APR 68, MACNAN was re-interviewed and shown the photograph of RAY which appears on F.B.I. Identification Orders 4182 and Wanted Flyer 442. He stated that on his trip to Nassau via U.S.A., he had seen the same photographs of RAY in US newspapers and that he did not recognize RAY as being identical to SEGAL.
- Further to paragraph 7 of PCR dated 7 MAY 66, "C" Division C.I.S. will forward copies of F.B.I. I.O. #4182 to major police forces in the Province of Quebec who are known to maintain latent fingerprints files. These I.O.s will be forwarded along with a covering letter requesting that RAY's fingerprints be compared against those they may have on file. Only affirmative replies are being requested.
- Further to memorandum from the A/Officer i/c C.I.B. dated in Ottawa 6 MAY 68, the F.B.I. Wanted Flyers are being retained at G.I.S. level pending confirmation of our request as indicated in paragraph 9 of PCK dated 7 MAY 68.
- Further to memorandum from the A/Officer i/c 0.1.8. dated in Ottawa 7 MAY 68, and appended to F. J. I. correspondence, Ginette BORMAN N née Lafunete will be interviewed in respect to her knowledge of RAY.
- Insofar as EDMONDSON's allegations that all hoodlums are familiar with the procedure to get Camadian passports, this is not contradicted at this point as the same application documents are readily available for any honest citizen who wishes a passport. As a primary requisite, the wanted person needs a birth certificate under a new name. Past experience in this line has shown that sometimes in order to obtain a birth certificate under an assumed name, a wanted person reads the obituary column of newspapers or visits a graveyard and reads inscription on headstones. From these two sources, he finds a deceased person of approximately his age as well as some family background. Using the deceased person's name, he writes to the Registrar of Births (includes in his letter the nominal price of a birth certificate) and requests a copy of his birth certificate which, in turn, is mailed to him at a given address. Under his assumed name, the wanted person then completes a passport application form or has this done through an intermediary, includes the necessary fee and in due course receives his passport by mail again at a given address.

#### 10 MAY 68

At approximately 9:30 a.m. of this date, Mr. F.N. OWNETTA, Customs Representative, US Treasury Department, Montreal, P.O., presented himself at this office and handed over to the undersigned a piece of yellow o onion skin paper (24" x 14") and part of what is believed to be the cover

of a matchbook which bears the following inscription on the face:

The onion skin paper bears the following notation written in block letters:

#### THINGS TO DO

3 - Stokely Carmichael.

Photostat copies of paper received from Mr. CORNETTA are attached hereto. Original is retained at this point and covered by Montreal GIS Exhibit Report 68/38. Copies attached.

- 7. Mr. CORNETTA explained that he had obtained these papers from Mr. STEPHEN, the Night Menager of the Sheraton-Mt.Royal Hotel in Montreal, P.Q. These papers had originally been found on the 9 MAY 68 in the main hallway of the fourth floor of the hotel by a client, Mrs. H.R. JOSEPH, P.G. Box 96 Northridge, California, U.S.A., telephone 782-0080, who was occupying room 4008 at the hotel. On receipt of STEFHEN's call, CORNETTA had proceeded to the hotel and had spoken to Mr. and Mrs. JOSEPH who had wanted that these items be turned over to the F.B.I. Whilst at the hotel, CORNETTA requested that hotel security collect all papers from the refuse closet in the proximity of the hallway where Mrs. JOSEPH had picked up the papers as it was suspected that the papers had originally been disposed of in a hotel room waste paper basket and had been dropped on the hallway floor by a cleaning maid when transferring paper wastes from her cleaning cart to the refuse closet.
- that she had picked up the papers in the main hallway of the fourth floor around 10:00 p.m. of the 9 MAY 66 in the proximity of the refuse closet. The onion skin paper had been folded in four and the section of the matchbook cover was next to it. Mrs. JOSEPH had added that she first noticed these papers in the hallway during the late afternoon of the 9th around 4:00 p.m. and had walked by them on various occasions until she decided to pick them up for no reason at all. On having noticed the context of the onion skin paper, hotel security had been called and the papers handed over to Mr. THOMPSON of the Security Department who had in turn, handed them over to Mr. STEPHEN.
- 9. At the conclusion of the interview, Mrs. JOSEPH was asked to point out where she had picked up the papers and this is indicated as (c) on the attached diagram of the section of the fourthfloor concerned.
- 10. Mr. C. BARTER, i/c Security for the hotel was then contacted and handed over a cardboard box which contained all refuse collected from the closet in the area concerned. This refuse had been gathered by

Enquiries conducted into the procedure followed by the cleaning staff revealed that there were 131 rooms for rent on the floor concerned and that the refuse closet was used only by the staff in the floor section concerned. It was also mentioned that refuse in the hotel was collected on a daily basis at 8:00 a.m. every morning.
- Mr. René JALETTE, Credit Manager of the hotel, verified his guests' registry record for the 9 MAY 68 covering rooms 4001 to 4043 inclusive and the following rooms were reported as being occupied after 3:00 p.m. of the 9 MAY 68 before Mrs. JOSEPH noticed the paper in the hall-way. - Hotel cleaning maids employed in the area concerned were interviewed and no information of value was obtained. They viewed the photographs of RAY with negative results. One more cleaning maid remains to be interviewed and this will be reported on accordingly.
- Refuse collected from the closet has been examined and no documentation which could be directly linked to exhibit items 1 and 2 of Exhibit Report #68/38 was found. Eleven (11) pieces of paper and envelopes containing various writings were however found and are being retained at this point and are covered in item 3 of Exhibit Report 68/38. In respect to items 3-1 to 3-5 inclusive, all these papers were found folded together and enquiries conducted at the Sheraton-Mt. Royal Hotel revealed that W. J. DUTRIE of 4745 Picadilly Street, Vancouver, B.C., was registered in Room 4019 from the 4 MAY 68 and he checked out of the hotel at 2:22 p.m. of the 9 MAY 68. Further report in respect to items 3-6 to 3-11 inclusive will be submitted. In respect to item #2 of Exhibit Report 68/38, it has been established that the portion of the matchbook cover concerns the ST.MORITZ Hotel of New York City, N.Y. The George Clark Association of 1010 Ste-Catherine West, Montreal, are the local representatives of ST.MORITZ Hotel. They were contacted and they advised that the matchbooks of the ST.MORITZ Hotel are only available at the said hote; however, the George Clark Association office does have a few on hand for advertising purposes. In the event it is deemed necessary to compare the handwriting on the exhibit item #1 of Exhibit Report #68/38, original copies of hotel registration cards will be obtained under authority of a search warrant.



Reference is made to telexes Q268, Q274, Q275 and Q281 emanating from Quebec Sub/Division.

### 21 APR. 68

- At approximately 11:30 A.M. a telephone call was received at this office from Major Wilbur HISCOCK of the Consulate General of the United States of America to the effect he had been alerted one Jean-Guy MERINEUA of Ste. Foy, P.Q. had reported having seen the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther KING in the City of Quebec during the week-end of 19/21 Apr. 68.
- Mr. Jean-Guy MERINEAU of 2596 Pontleroy Avenue, Ste-Foy. Quebec was interrogated and he advised he was a part-time waiter at the Marquis de Montcalm cocktail bar forming part of Universal Motel situated at 2300 Chemin Ste. Foy, Ste-Foy, Quebec. He asserted that during the evening of 20 Apr. 68 a male tourist had crashed a private party on three different occasions and because of his intoxicated condition was each and every time evicted from the premises.
- Mr. MERINEAU furthered that following his awakening this morning he began perusing the newspaper - Dimanche-Matin -21 Apr. 68 edition - and he believed the individual who had given him a hectic previous evening strongly resembled James Earl RAY @ Eric Starvo GALT. Subsequent investigation resulted in ascertaining two other barmen and a bellboy of the said establishment shared the opinion of Mr. MERINEAU the alien had facial features and composure highly resembling that of James Earl RAY whose portrait appeared in local newspapers.
- It was later determined the suspect had been registered in room 240 at Universal Motel and had checked-in at the hour of 2:00 PM on 19 Apr. 68. He surrendered the room in the proximity of 11:00 A.M. on 21-4-68 and it was established beyond a reasonable doubt subject occupied the said room in company with a woman and another couple.
- The registration motel card showed the male occupants 6. of the double-bed room had inscribed their identities as being Robert BILLINGS of 190 Temple Avenue, Old Orchard Beach, Maine and Paul TIBELETTE of 5 Wildwood Lane equally of Old Orchard Beach. The license number of the vehicle in which they travelled was shown as 117-492 - State of Maine. Our "J" Division HQ. reported the markers were registered to one Stanley PAYSON of 50 Moody Street, Saco, Maine for a 1967 Dodge convertible. SERIA

- At the time of my arrival at the motel room 240 had been thoroughly scrubbed by the cleaning women and all walls and furniture had been cleaned with a damp cloth. This precluded any attempt to examine the quarters for latent finger-prints. Sixteen (16) empty bottles of spirits bearing the labels Rheingold, Dawson and Haffenreffer lager beer as well as Seagrams whiskey and Lawrence vodka said to have been removed from the room in question were taken into custody for examination by the N.C.O. 1/c Quebec Identification Section. Several prints suitable for comparison were found on the bottles, however, none compared with those of the sought killer.
- At a later date employees of the Marquis de Montcalm cocktail bar were displayed F.B.I. Wanted Flyer 442-A and after viewing same they were less convinced the individual who had caused them inconvenience during the evening of 20-4-68 was in fact the murderer of Dr. Martin Luther KING. Two waiters advised the person in question had an indented scar near the left eye which was very conspicuous. The F.B.I. wanted circular indicated RAY has a small scar on the centre of his forehead and palm of his right hand.
- Mr. Michel ROY of 384 Proulx Avenue, Ville Vanier, P.Q., was reported to have been the desk clerk at the motel when the suspect arrived and departed. He was interrogated and advised subject produced his driver's license as ways of identifying himself when the checked-in at the motel. Mr. ROY added the person in question was in possession of a State of Maine driver's permit in favour of Paul TIBBLETTE of 5 Wildwood Lane, Old Orchard Beach, Me. He added Mr. TIBBLETTE had difficulty locating the registration certificate for the car he was operating, and therefore, he and TIBBLETTE proceeded outdoors to verify the license number of the vehicle. He described the automobile as a late model Dodge convertible.
- According to Mr. Michel ROY the suspect bore no similarities to James Earl RAY. He described Mr. TIBBLETTE as being 32 or 33 years of age, 6'l" to 6'2", long thin face, 165 to 170 lbs., wearing a sports jacket with red insignia and bushy curly hair. He added this same person had rented a room at the motel on a previous occasion during the fall of 1967. He did not see the other occupants of the vehicle as they entered the establishment through a side entrance.
- It was found payment for the rooming facilities was paid in advance in U.S. currency and charges amounted to \$21.00. Investigation also revealed the motel is equipped with an electronic switch board and they have no control of telephone calls made locally. Long-distance calls are made direct with the operator of the Bell Telephone Co. who later advises the accounting department of the motel the cost of the call. Customers are billed accordingly and records are destroyed once payment has been settled.
