On May 7, 1969, these facts were discussed with Assistant United States Attorney MILTON C. BRANCH, Denver, Colorado, who declined prosecution as there is no real victim.

In view of the contents of this letter it has been disseminated to Secret Service, Denver, Colorado. It is also being furnished for the information of WFO inasmuch as the letter was originally mailed to the National Radio Institute in Washington, D. C.



I receive letters from my sister in Berlin regularly. On the average, it takes about six days; lately, it has gone up to ten days on occasion.

I have not received sample copies either of the first or of the second article, although I heard from my sister that it (sic) appeared.

Naturally, I would like to know whether my articles are in accordance with your desires and it would be also helpful to know if and when the third article will appear and, particularly, whether you are interested in the subject which I proposed in my last letter.

Perhaps an article about the truly monstrous: scandal of the Ray trial would be in order (Ray is the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.). Ray had broken out of jail before King's assassination. He had no means of support. Even so, he was able to evade the police in Memphis, which, reportedly, did not set up a single road block. Ray was able to fly to Canada and, from there, to London and Lisbon. He must, therefore, have had people who helped him - people who paid him for the assassination and, later, financed him. Even so, the Court allowed Ray to confess the murder and, thereby, avoid capital punishment. After that, the trial came to an end in two days. questions were asked about the men-behind-the-scenes and even though Ray, still in the Courtroom, declared he could not possibly accept the theory that he had acted alone and without help, he was not asked who had helped him. An hour later, Ray was on his way to the jailhouse. This whole case - if at all possible - is even worse than President Kennedy's assassination.

Perhaps you could let me know shortly whether you are interested in an article on this case and how long it should be.

	Mr. JOHN RAY, 1982 Arsenal, St. Louis, Missouri, stated he had received a telephone call from his brother, JERRY RAY, from Jacksonville, Florida, during the late evening hours of April 30, 1969, in which JERRY told him he was traveling with the family's civil attorney, J. B. STONEK, of Savannah, Georgia; that he had just finished a speaking engagement at Jacksonville and was just leaving, with STONER, for a brief visit in Memphis, Tennessee, after which he would reside in Savannah with STONER, and travel between there and Memphis periodically.
	JOHN RAY stated he had absolutely no opinion as to the existence of a conspiracy in the KING assassination. He denied that his brother JERRY had ever furnished him any credible evidence or information regarding any such conspiracy. He offere the opinion that, if his brother JERRY had made statements to the press regarding the existence of a conspiracy, they would undoubtedly have been based on information JERRY had received from their brother, JAMES EARL RAY.

He failed to indicate to her his purpose in leaving, or his destination, but promised to telephone her. He has not called her, and she had no knowledge or information as to his whereabouts. She had no reason to believe her brother, JOHN RAY, had any more information.

She denied knowledge of any evidence or information which might form the basis for any statements allegedly made to the press by JERRY RAY as to the existence of a conspiracy in the KING assassination. Mr. JOHN RAY, 1982 Arsenal, St. Louis, Missouri, stated he had received a telephone call from his brother, JERRY RAY, from Jacksonville, Florida, during the late evening hours of April 30, 1969, in which JERRY told him he was traveling with the family's civil attorney, J. B. STONER, of Savannah, Georgia; that he had just finished a speaking engagement at Jacksonville and was just leaving, with STONER, for a brief visit in Memphis, Tennessee, after which he would reside in Savannah with STONER, and travel between there and Memphis periodically.

JOHN RAY stated he had absolutely no opinion as to the existence of a conspiracy in the KING assassination. He denied that his brother JERRY had ever furnished him any credible evidence or information regarding any such conspiracy. He offered the opinion that, if his brother JERRY had made statements to the press regarding the existence of a conspiracy, they would undoubtedly have been based on information JERRY had received from their brother, JAMES EARL RAY.

During the course of interview with MC COY an attempt should be made to determine his motives and circumstances under which he contacted the offices of the NSRP and obtained these tapes. Pursuant to Section 107S, Volume IV, Manual of Instructions, MC COY should be cautioned against any future public disclosure of his past association with the FBI. Any questions which he might have in the future should be resolved by contacting the FBI. It is suggested that Richmond should accept the tapes and any other material which MC COY desires to make available to the FBI, however, no effort should be made to direct his activities.

In view of the wide spread publicity MC COY received through "The Thunderbolt", it is felt that he should not be operated as an informant in the future, even though he may desire to again cooperate with the FBI.



#### JAMES LUTHER BEVEL

The New York Times on March 18, 1969, carried a story concerning an interview of JAMES BEVEL in which BEVEL stated a letter was turned over to the Memphis Police on approximately April 3, 1968, which contained information that Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., was to be assassinated while in Memphis.

A source, who has furnished reliable information in the past and who is familiar with Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) activities in the Philadelphia area, advised in April 1969 that BEVEL was in a mental hospital in New York.

On May 18, 1969, a track meet was held at Villanova University, Villanova, Pa., and the proceeds from the track meet were sent to SCLC.

A second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised he was present with Rev. RALPH ABERNATHY, Director, SCLC, at the track meet. This source advised while with ABERNATHY he met BEVEL at the track meet. Source stated BEVEL was extremely quiet and did not act in his usual manner. Source stated he mentioned this to Rev. ABERNATHY who stated, "BEVEL is in another world." Nothing further was said.

On May 20, 1969, the first source contacted people active in SCLC in Philadelphia and was told BEVEL is no longer in Philadelphia. One person stated "BEVEL is in New York,"

A warrant for the arrest of Eric Starvo Galt, alias James Earl Ray, convicted killer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., is still on file in the office of U. S. Marshal Roy L. Call in Birmingham.

Issued at the order of then U. S. Atty. Gen. Ramsay Clark, the warrant was signed by Joseph H. Gamble, then special agent in charge of the

FBI in Birmingham.

The warrant, issued April 17, 1968, charged Eric Galt and "an individual whom he alleged to be his brother," with conspiracy to "injure, oppress, threaten or intimidate Martin Luther King Jr."

Marshall Call said the last official communication he had with the Department of Justice in Washington concerning the Galt warrant was June 10, 1968.

"We have to hold it until it is dismissed by the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice," the marshal said.

the marshal Ordinarily, would notify authorities at a prison in which a fugitive was already serving that he was wanted in Birmingham on a charge. In the case of the warrant for Galt, alias Ray, however, the marshal said he had not notified prison authorities in Nashville where Ray is imprisoned for the April, 1968, slaying of Dr. King.

"In my opinion this warrant will be dismissed since no evidence of conspiracy has been preved," Call said.

## Re: JAMES BEVEL, MN, Memphis

From Sunday, 6/8/69, through 6/13/69, Rev. JAMES BEVEL, male Negro, a Baptist Minister and recent leader of Southern Christin Leadership Conference (SCLC) is to be in Memphis to preach a revival at Tree of Life Baptist Church, 407 East McLemore, pastored by Rev. ISIAH ROWSER.

ROWSER and REVEL attended Theology School together and have since remained as close friends.

At the BTU class at Tree of Life Sunday evening, 6/8/69, BEVEL was asked, "Do you know about the 4/4/68 killing of MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.?" BEVEL replied that in the past, prior to KING's death, he was usually accompanied by and protected by several U.S. Secret Service Agents and other Federal Government Agents and that on the 4/68 trip, these Federal Agents were not with him, giving the killer an opportunity to kill KING. BEVEL said he knew who killed KING but would not tell. ME 353 got the impression BEVEL was inferring that someone in the Federal Government had KING killed.

He was asked regarding the current alleged split in leadership in SCLC, a so-called powere struggle between Rev. RALPH ARERNATHY and JESSE JACKSON, and REVEL denied that such a split exists.

# Re: INVADERS

ME 353 heard from a relative that 10-12 alleged Invaders came to hear HEVEL speak on the night of 6/11/69. They purportedly sat on the front row and behaved themselves.

# Re: JOE CALHOUN

JOE CALHOUN, currently working in the Black Arcade (Dashiki Shop, 241 Linden) is believed to be the brother of GAYLON CALHOUN, who until recently was a MSU student and BSA member and also was inducted into the U.S. Army around the end of May, 1969.
