On August 22, 1978, Captain Thomas H. Smith, Homicide Bureau, Memphis Police Department, Memphis, Tennessee, telephonically contacted the Memphis Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and advised he had received two letters regarding the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., which he wished to make available to the FBI. 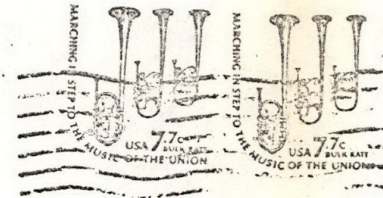

Other tenants of the hotel advised him to have
it checked, first, but he paid no attention and
it moved to the right side of his neck.

He was informed that it was cancer and he
had requested the V A take care of him.

The V A couldn't do anything.

He died in late summer of 1977 in his room
at that address.

Rememo of Supervisor JOSEPH C. BALL, 1/24/79.

This case was reopened as an inmate at the Dade County Jail, EDWARD HARAMEY, claimed that he could identify the "second killer" of KING.

Subsequent investigation has determined that THOMAS RICHARD D'AMURA, a cellmate of HARAMEY, was the possessor of information about an assassination. This information did not relate to the assassination of KING but to the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY.

D'AMURA was subsequently interviewed and this interview is being recorded on an FD-302. Copies of this FD-302 will subsequently be forwarded to the Bureau and Dallas by airtel cover.

It is recommended that this case be closed administratively and MM File# 89-35 (main file re assassination of KENNEDY) be reopened and assigned to the writer for the purpose of submitting D'AMURA's information to the Bureau and Dallas.
