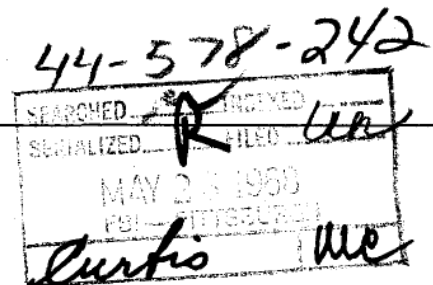

On 5-17-68 Mr. HARVEY COBB, Owner, L & M Cylinders, 2078 Lane Avenue North, Jacksonville, Florida, was contacted and interviewed regarding two possible past employees of L & M Cylinder known as "RED" (LNU) and (FNU) FOLKS.

Mr. COBB advised that "RED'S" real name is CHARLES EDWARD UNDERHILL, 2606 Orchard Street, Jacksonville, Florida. UNDERHILL was employed at L & M Cylinders from June until August, 1966, and it was obvious to Mr. COBB that UNDERHILL was a militant hater of the Negro race. Mr. COBB further advised that he had no record for a past employee having the last name FOLKS and feels sure he has never hired anyone by that name.

Mr. COBB stated that a close friend of "RED" (UNDERHILL's) at the time they were working for him was PAUL BRADY DYAL, 275 Willowbranch Street, Jacksonville, Florida. DYAL worked for L & M Cylinders from May until August, 1966, and was also quite adamant for his hatred for the Negro race.

Mr. COBB was shown several photographs of JAMES EARL RAY and stated definitely that neither Mr. UNDERHILL nor Mr. DYAL in any way resembled RAY.

These tags may be ordered by letter, wire or telephone or in person and are sent to whatever address is indicated if the person identifies himself as being in the entertainment field or in the military service. A route address is issued on the tag receipt.

This being a mail order tag, there is no indication that GREATHOUSE has been in Selma, Ala., or Dallas County, and in the absence of such information, there is no investigation to be made by the Mobile Office in an effort to locate GREATHOUSE.

SAVANNAH. Will attempt to locate WALLACE GREATHOUSE through General Delivery, Peach Orchard Branch, Augusta, Ga., in order that he may be contacted to determine if he could possibly be identical with JAMES EARL RAY.

CLEVELAND. Will contact sources at Alliance, Ohio, to develop address of complainant BOB CONROY and interview him in person concerning the individual seen by him.

In the event this investigation at Cleveland and Savannah does not result in location of WALLACE GREATHOUSE, it is suggested that Cleveland attempt to trace him through the James H. Drews Shows by contact with "Billboard Magazine", Cincinnati, Ohio.

On 5/9/68, Mr. ROBERT T. CONROY, 815 Parkway Avenue, Alliance, Ohio, was contacted. CONROY indicated he had telephoned the FBI in Washington, after he had seen a man who resembled RAY, coming out of Turner's Drugstore, Alliance, Ohio. CONROY stated that he was downtown, driving in his own car when he observed this individual, who appeared to be, or at least resembled RAY. He stated he went around the dock, came back and copied a license number after he observed this man enter an old green vehicle which he believed to be a Chrysler product. This license was copied down by himself and he then telephoned the FBI in Washington giving them the details as he recalled same. In regards to distance, CONROY said that he was on the opposite side of the street when this man left the drugstore and he again observed him after driving around the block from a distance of 30 or so feet, but did not get a good view, since the man was in the car. CONROY was not absolutely sure that this individual was RAY, however, indicated he wished to aid the FBI in any conceivable way possible, therefore, had immediately or soon thereafter telephoned Washington. CONROY had no additional information to add to the above facts or elaborate on the information furnished Washington.

On 5/17/68 efforts to contact JAMES H. DEWE were negative, the neighbors explaining that he was on the road with a show up north and his whereabouts was unknown.

On 5/17/68 HARVIN BARKETT, operator of the Club 13 and a girle show, who is familiar carnival workers who winter quarter in Augusta, Ga., advised that WALLACE GREATHOUSE was unfamiliar to him. He did not know the itinerary for the Brew Show or the show's present whereabouts.

On 5/18/68 Mrs. FRANCES KIRSCH, Credit Bureau of Augusta, Ga., and Sgt. WILLIAM E. KIRKMAN, Record Bureau, Augusta, Ga., PD, both advised a search of their records failed to locate any names identifiable with GREATHOUSE.

On 5/20/68 WILLIAM ROWLAND, Richmond County License Inspector, Augusta, Ga., advised he received a call from JAMES H. DEWE concerning a license for the Exchange Club Fair in Augusta and learned that DEWE was staying at the Holiday Inn #1 at Charleston, W. Va., for this week. He was playing shopping centers around Charleston, W. Va., for the next week or ten days following 5/20/68 and could be contacted at Area Code 304 343-1821.

King Killer Eludes Wide FBI Hunt

and Jack Anderson

The FBI's failure to apprehend the assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King has led to reports that J. Edgar Hoover is not interested in catching the murderer. The reports are based partly on the fact that Hoover and King were not on good terms, Hoover having publicly branded King as "the most notorious liar in the world."

We have checked into the operations of the FBI in this respect and are convinced that it is conducting perhaps the most painstaking exhaustive manhunt ever before undertaken in the United States. Its G-men have checked every bar ever patronized by James Earl Ray, every flophouse he ever stopped at, every cantina in Mexico he ever visited. It has collected an amazing array of evidence, all linking Ray with the murder.

That he has not been found may be due, first, to the possibility that he himself was murdered by those who hired him to kill Dr. King; or, second, that he is hiding in some remote Mexican village.

If he has money — and apparently he had — Ray might be able to live in a distant part of Mexico indefinitely. The Mexico City police are efficient and co-operative, but police in the remote areas are not. In some villages few Mexicans can read or write, and

radio news of the outside world does not penetrate.

Studied Crime Fiction

What the FBI has established about King's assassin was that he was a professional killer who had studied the suspense writing of Ian Fleming and Ayn Rand. His pseudonym, Eric Starvo Galt, for instance, was taken from both authors.

Yet, while a student of crime he was also a bungler. For he left behind the murder rifle with his fingerprints on it and, wrapped around the rifle a bedspread which contained strands of his hair. He also left behind a blue zipper bag containing a brush with hair matching those on the bedspread.

All the evidence we have been able to gather points to the probability that Ray was hired to kill Dr. King. He broke out of the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23, 1967, after boasting to fellow prisoners that he intended to make a big "score" on the outside. He remarked to one inmate that he might try to collect a rumored \$1 million bounty that supposedly had been offered by "a businessmen's group" for the death of Dr. King.

Four months later, on Aug. 30, 1967, he opened a safe deposit box in the Birmingham Trust National Bank and suddenly began passing out crisp \$20 bills like a big spender.

He paid \$499 for dancing instruction, then quit after only a few lessons. He spent \$395 for mail-order photographic equipment that he didn't know how to operate.

He shelled out money for a bartending course, but showed no interest in working behind any bar. He also took a course in lock-picking from a correspondence school in Michigan. His white Mustang cost \$1995, which he paid in cash. He drove it from Mexico to Montreal, from Los Angeles to New Orleans.

Occasionally he slipped \$20 to bar girls and prostitutes. In Mexico he lived with a prostitute in small towns like Jalisco and Puerto Vallarta where prices were cheap. Once he posed in sun glasses for a picture with his Mexican prostitute. In Los Angeles, he advertised in the hippie newspaper that he would like to meet "a passionate married woman." He also paid \$1 to the Swinger's Club for the names and addresses of five girls.

All told, Ray spent an estimated \$10,000 in seven months. Yet he never held a job, and committed no crimes following his escape from the Missouri penitentiary that the FBI has discovered. Previously he had been involved in a long list of filling station and other robberies. But after his escape he became a loner, in some respects became another Lee Harvey Oswald. Meanwhile, he sought to establish

a new identity as Eric Starvo Galt.

Careful Plans

It seems likely that Ray planned the murder of Dr. King for several months. He finally purchased the Remington rifle in Birmingham on March 30, then moved to a boarding house in Atlanta. In his room, agents found a map of Atlanta with four locations circled.

They were Dr. King's residence, his headquarters at the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Ray's boarding house and the spot where he abandoned his Mustang after the murder. In the middle of the map was also a clear thumbprint from Ray's right thumb.

Evidently, Ray changed his mind about waylaying King in Atlanta and followed him to Memphis instead.

If white extremists put up the blood money it was probably not the Ku Klux Klan or the Minute Men, for they are an impatient lot who would not have waited for several months for Ray to get results.

Black extremists have also not been ruled out. They might have sought to get rid of King in order to remove the prophet of nonviolence.

No Trust in Hoover

The search for the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. is more than a manhunt for James Earle Ray, alias Eric Starvo Galt. For the search is that of a troubled nation trying to locate its soul, of a republic in search of its own value system.

Presidential aspirant Hubert Humphrey came close to the truth a few days ago when he said we are not lost, that

we are a nation growing up and trying to find better ways. The assassination of Dr. King has intensified the search for better ways and I suspect there will be a good deal of foundation shaking, in high places at that, before the entire matter is put to rest.

I am speaking specifically of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and its director, J. Edgar Hoover.

It is open public knowledge that Hoover deeply disliked Martin Luther King. He once referred to King as "the most notorious liar in the nation." Now Hoover is called upon to locate King's assassin.

There are a few black people indeed who believe Hoover will work overtime in this search. This feeling is not without some foundation; either the FBI is inept or the bungling of the King case is intentional.

►The FBI issued a report that James Earle Ray took dancing lessons in New Orleans in 1964-65. The FBI's own files show that Ray was in prison at the time.

►Somebody, somehow, managed to circulate the wrong fingerprints for Ray. Up until the latter part of this week the Georgia Bureau of Investigations had wrong prints for Ray; had he been arrested in Atlanta on the day he abandoned the white Mustang he would not have been identified as Ray.

►The FBI has pre-empted local police from the case by declaring the King murder a conspiracy. Thus the full burden of the investigation rests with the FBI. It guards it jealously; King has been dead a month now and the FBI is yet to ask the cooperation of the Los Angeles police department: Yet Ray lived in Los Angeles for several months and it is known that he made at least three trips from Los Angeles to New Orleans and that he carried a Los Angeles

man with him on one occasion.

►Shortly after I discovered telephone booths in Los Angeles from which Ray allegedly made phone calls, the FBI moved in and confiscated the telephone company records. They and only they know what those records reveal.

LET ME make it plain, very plain: America's blacks never have and do not now trust either J. Edgar Hoover or the FBI. Those of us who have been assigned to cover civil rights stories in the South know all too well how much the FBI can fumble when it does not wish to solve a case.

The suspicion is defended by the fact that the FBI "leaked" a story to newsmen that suggested that a Negro with an animus toward King was behind the assassination. The story was completely false, but if newsmen had written it, Dr. King would have been smeared even in his grave.

The FBI attempt to discredit the dead civil rights leader was so blatant that even white reporters who knew of the story recoiled in fury.

J. Edgar Hoover would do his nation a great service if he were to admit publicly his dislike for Dr. King and then share the hunt for the assassin with a less prejudiced agency.

Perhaps the cause of justice would be better served if the investigation was placed under the guidance of a Warren-type commission composed of both black and whites.

The murder of Dr. King was an organized and well planned exercise. This was not the deed of "some white nut." Rather there is a sense in which society itself committed the act; and it is certain that powerful men in American society were part of the deed most foul.

Unlike Caesar's wife, J. Edgar Hoover is not above reproach when it comes to the civil rights issue. Let Hoover then clear the air by either removing himself from the investigation or sharing the hunt with men and organizations that command the faith of those whose cause King championed.

Each Special Agent in Charge and Legal Attache is instructed to promptly remind their established cooperative news sources, in a discreet and tactful manner, of the existence of substantial reward money for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the killer of Dr. Martin Luther King. This money now totals at least \$100,000. The FBI should not, however, be publicized as the source of this reminder.

While the Bureau's continuing policy is to encourage the public to furnish information to law enforcement authorities as a matter of good citizenship, without expectation of financial reward, it is fully recognized that monetary rewards are often necessary to motivate some individuals. The knowledge of the existence of the substantial rewards available in the Murkin case could possibly prove of value in the solution of this major investigation.

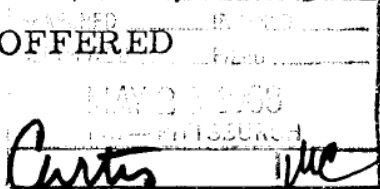

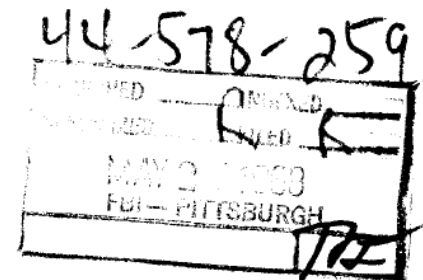

On 4/25/68, Rev. HAL ROBINSON, Bidwell Presbyterian Church, 1509 Bidwell St., advised the writer that he had met an individual in a restaurant earlier that day who had confided in him that he had information regarding the murder of Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. Rev. ROBINSON did not know this individual's name, but stated that he resided in Room 404 at the North Side YMCA.

On 4/25/68, it was determined that CHARLES E. RUMFORD resided in Room 404 at the North Side YMCA. RUMFORD was not in, and attempts to contact him were negative until 5/14/68.

On 5/14/68, RUMFORD was interviewed and advised that he had been in contact with one JAMES A. POUNCEY, 216 S. Albany, Tampa, Fla., who had told him that KING was going to be assassinated three weeks before the assassination occurred. RUMFORD stated that he had previously furnished all this information to SAs CHARLES HUGHES and GARDNER at the St. Petersburg, Fla., Resident Agency.

RUMFORD then proceeded to ramble on about his political career and the governors and judges that he knew. He also stated that he had attempted to see President JOHNSON several weeks ago, and as a result, was locked up in a "hut house" for three days. RUMFORD offered to work in an undercover assignment to locate POUNCEY but stated that he would have to spread the word that the FBI was looking for him in order to avoid suspicion. 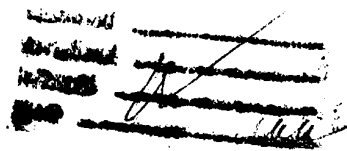
