Enclosed to Memphis are 15 copies of FD-302 of interview with SARAH M. HALE, 1825 Lafayette, SLMO, 11-21-68.

Review of SL file failed to identify 1825 Lafayette with any known activities of RAY.

It was noted, however, JOHN EUGENE GAVRON stated 4-29 and 5-1-68, he and RAY frequented a bar, believed to be Ruby's Bar, later known as The Haven Bar, on Lafayette just west of 18th St. during 1959. (See SL report of SA HAROLD R. DOBSON, 5-10-68, cover pages R & S.) GAWRON subsequently advised on 5-14-68, the correct name of the bar was Opal's Bar, later known as The Haven Bar, (See SL report of SA DOBSON. 6-25-68, cover page Y).

OPAL HIGHLY advised on 5-15-68, she had operated Opal's Bar at 1805 Lafayette from 1947 to 1961. She was unable to recall RAY as having been a patron but recalled JACK (LNU). whose description fitted GAWRON, as a frequent customer. (See 6-25-68 SL report, page 84)

The current SL City Directory lists SARAH M. HALE as the resident at 1825 Lafayette, SLMO.

This address was observed by SA DOBSON on 11-21-68, to be a two-story single-family brick dwelling. Mrs. HALE advised him on the same date she had resided there for the past 22 years. She has never rented any portion of the premises to other persons during this period. She was unable to identify the names utilized by RAY or photographs of him as pertaining to any person she has ever known. She was likewise unable to recall ever having been acquainted with any member of RAY's family.

Mr. CHARLIE TRONCALE, owner-manager, Granada Hotel, 2230 Fourth Avenue, North, made available the guest registration cards for his hotel during the period August 22 - 28, 1967, inclusive. A review of these cards resulted in the location of guest registration No. 9022 for one JOHN L. RAYNS, residence 1825 Lafayette St., St. Louis, Mo., who checked in at 9:05 a.m. on Saturday, August 26, 1967, and was assigned to Room 210 by Desk Clerk ADRIAN M. KOONCE at a rate of \$4.50. No record was maintained as to the time of checkout or method of travel. The card reflected the guest had luggage. The original of this card has been forwarded to the FBI Laboratory at Washington, D. C., for appropriate handwriting comparison.

A record was obtained of the names and addresses (where recorded) of the approximately 150 guests, other than permanent residents, during the period for which the cards were reviewed and two copies of the list are being transmitted to the Memphis FBI Office. No guest card was observed for any "RAOUL" or similar name during the period involved.

Upon observing the guest registration card of RAYNS, Mr. ADRIAN M. KOONCE identified his initials as having roomed RAYNS, but stated that due to the elapsed time he had no independent recollection of him. He stated he had previously been exhibited a photograph of JAMES EARL RAY and was unable to identify that individual.

No further information was obtainable from Mr. KOONCE or other personnel of the Granada Hotel.



GEORGE SEYMOUR HELLER, 1337 West Fargo, Chicago, Illinois, phone 262-4854, was interviewed at his place of employment, the Bernard Harwich branch of the Jewish Community Centers of Chicago, 3003 West Touhy, Chicago, Illinois, phone RO 1, 9100, where he is employed as a social group work r. Mr. HELLER advised that some time in the summer of 1967, he ran an ad in the "Chicago Tribune" for the sale of a 1959 Chrysler, green over white. He said that the manager of the Sunoco Station, Lunt and Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, named MAURICE (LNU), acted as his agent. After the ad had been run in the paper, he received a call from MAURICE (LNU), telling him that a party had called about the car and would be at the gas station. HELLER went to the gas station and waited for the purchaser to arrive. first observed the purchaser alone walking into the gas sta-This individual was dressed in a green jacket, dressed almost as in a government issued fatigue jacket and green pants. He was neat and clean and had no unusual characteristics. Mr. HELLER was exhibited a group of nine photographs, three of which were photographs taken at different times of JAMES EARL RAY. Mr. HELLER picked out photo number 00416 dated January 4, 1966, and stated that this photograph would be the closest resemblance to the purchaser of his car; however, he could not state definitely that the individual represented by this photograph was identical to the purchaser. He also advised that he has seen numerous photographs of JAMES EARL RAY in the news media and has never once associated him with the purchaser of his Chrysler He was shown additional photographs of RAY and stated that he could not say that RAY was identical to the purchaser.

He said that his overall impression of RAY was that he was "lanky" and of the "hillbilly type". He commented that RAY was extremely quiet and said no more than a dozen words during their conversation, which was completely about the Chrysler. RAY made no comment as to his residence, employment, or any other matters of a personal nature. RAY also made no comment concerning the reason for the purchase of the car and in fact seemed to have very little interest

He appeared to be purchasing it merely for transportation. RAY also did not argue about the price and paid in cash the \$200, which was HELLER's asking price. 

But under our system of justice, Huie observed, a conspiracy is difficult to prove without the defendant speaking out. "Indeed, I undertook the writing of Ray's life for the primary purpose of persuading him to become a government witness, an informant in the case, naming others who took part.

"While Arthur Hanes was his attorney, I had high hopes this would be done, because Hanes holds the same view of Ray's role in the affair as myself.

"Now that Percy Foreman has taken over from Hanes as Ray's attorney, the question of whether Ray testifies becomes another kettle of fish. Foreman has a reputation for winning to think about."

Huie, who is preparing a book on the life of Ray, was interviewed in his motel room, where he was waiting for the weather to clear to permit his departure from the Lambert-St. Louis Field. He was bound for New York, to discuss the details of the book with Dell publishers.

Escape From Prison

"Ray's account of how he escaped from the prison on April 23, 1967—by going over the wall -was fanciful and probably a damned lie," Huie said. "After checking with Warden Harold Swenson and others at the prison I am pretty well convinced that he got out as they say he did-by hiding in a large bread box on a truck taking out bakery products."

Huie said that he intended to insert the authorities' account of Ray's escape in the third installment of a series of articles on Ray that he is writing for Look Magazine. The third article will appear in February. Ray's version of the escape appeared in the first article.

Huie was not visibly disturbed by Ray's falsehood. "It's not the first time that I've caught him in a lie. Ray has practized deception since the day he was ...

him to tell the truth. He is not only a loner by nature, he is a born fabricator."

Strangely enough, Huie said, most of the information that Ray has related in the 30,000 City and the State Hospital at handwritten words he has provided Huie from his jail cell in Memphis have checked out to be true.

To support the statement, Huie displayed several maps drawn by Ray of locales in Canada, Mexico and the United States where he had stayed for periods after his escape from the Missouri prison. "In almost all instances, I have been able to verify every detail with landladies, bartenders, prostitutes and other persons with whom he came in contact at those places," Huie said.

Huie has paid \$30,000 to Ray for the exclusive rights to his life story. The money was subsequently turned over to Hanes for legal fees. Huie said whether he pays additional money to Ray will depend on whether Foreman permits Ray to continue supplying material to Huie.

Huie said that he decided against talking to Ray's two brothers who live in St. Louis, John Larry Ray and Jerry Ray. "They are part of James Ray's miserable existence that preceded April 1967 — the start of the period that I am most interested in," Huie said.

Huie said he has logged about 25,000 miles the last few months tracing Ray's odyssey that ended with his arrest in London last June 8. "I believe I know where Ray spent every night in those 15 months," he said.

The experience has convinced Huie that Ray was a dupe in a complex scheme to kill Dr. King, perpetrated by a bitter white group that hopes to achieve a violent racial conflict in the United States.

As Huie described it in one article, "Dr. King was to be murdered for effect. His murder was planned, not by impulsive men who hated him personally, though they probably did hate him, but by calculating men

about \$25,000 and came from New Orleans.

He dismissed the argument that Ray's bumbling career as a petty holdup man and burglar indicated a general lack of intelligence. "Ray has a sharp criminal mind. He has done some self-educating in prison and is far from being a stupid man."

Ray's trial was postponed last month to March 3 to give Foreman time to prepare his defense. The trial will be held in Shelby County Criminal Court at Memphis, where Dr. King was shot to death by a sniper when standing on a motel balcony.

Huie said that the book on the assassination, which will be called, "They Slew the Dreamer," will be his last nonfiction work. He has written 17 books, including "Three Lives for Mississippi," based on the murder of three civil rights workers in Neshoba county, Mississippi.

His present assignment, he remarked, has been particularly demanding. "I've passed my fifty-eighth birthday, but today, snowbound and with a bad cold, I feel more like 100.

"When I finish this book, I plan to go back home to Hartselle (Afa.) and relax and play golf every day. I've got a home down there and even though I have to keep my old riot gun handy in case some of the neighbors act up it's still a nice pláce to live."

She described GREEVES as: White male, 30-31 years, 5'11-6' tall, medium build, long light brown hair with 2" scar on right side of forehead. GREEVES purchased the residence where MRS. COOKSEY's daughter lived, 6452 Alamo, Clayton, St. Louis Co., Mo., approximately one month prior to the date of interview.

On the same date MR. THOMAS KILCELLIN, Assistant Sales Manager, PEPSI COLA BOTTLING CO., SLMO, advised SA DE FONCE, CLIFFORD GREEVES, residence - 11057 Margate Hall, Bridgeton, Mo., had been employed as a driver by the Co. since 4-10-59. His route area covers University City, Mo. Co. records, confirmed by GREEVES' supervisor, showed GREEVES was on duty 3-28 and 29, and 4-3,4,5-68. KILCELLIN described GREEVES as: White male, 32 years of age, 5'9", 160 #, with light brown hair. KILCELLIN observed a photo of RAY and stated GREEVES bore no resemblance to him.



Ray Pleads Guilty; 99-Year Sentence

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (UPI)— James Earl Ray, indicating he was part of an assassination conspiracy, pleaded guilty today to the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and a jury, by prearrangement, sentenced him to 99 years in prison.

The state presented a handful of witnesses and, an hour and 55 minutes after the sudden trial started, Ray was convict-

ed. He made the guilty plea in return for the 99-year sentence, rather than take the chance of being sentenced to die had he gone on with his scheduled April 7 trial.

A jury must try all cases in Tennessee— even in guilty pleas - since the jury sets the penalty. All 12 jurors-two of them Negroes-agreed to the deal of a 99-year sentence before they were sworn in.

The jury simply voted by hand in their seats, never leaving the courtroom.

Ray's attorney, famed trial lawyer Percey Foreman, and today wearing the same dark told the jury that they were convinced Ray alone killed King with a rifle shot last April 4, and there was no conspiracy.

At that point Ray stood up. "Your honor, I'd like to say something. I agree with all these stipulations, but I don't agree with these theories on the conspiracy."

Judge W. Preston Battle asked Ray if he was trying to change his guilty plea. Ray said "no sir," and spoke no more about the conspiracy.

Ray waived all rights for appeal, for a new trial or for any other legal maneuvers in exchange for 99-year the sentence—which he said was all that had been promised him.

Foreman asked Friday for a hearing, and rumors that Ray would switch his plea to guilty had been prevalent since then. Ray entered the courtroom today wearing the same dark blue checked suit and light blue shirt which he wore at earlier hearings.

The white-haired Foremanwho claims to have lost only one client to the electric chairarose and announced "Your honor, we have a petition for a waiver of trial and a change of plea to guilty."

Battle told Ray that "this is a compromise and settlement on a plea of guilty to murder in the first degree and 99 years in the penitentiary."

"Is this what you want to do? Battle asked.

"Yes, I do," Ray replied. The jury was led in for a trial expected to last no more than a few days. The state must make a brief case against Ray before it can rest.
