HILL stated that at approximately 7:00 PM, this date, he walked pass two white males changing a tire at 3rd and K. Sts, NW. It was a 1967 dark blue Cougar bearing Michigan plates, but no tag number obtained. HILL stated that one of the men very strongly resembled the picture of JAMES EARL RAY, which he carries in his pocket. UNSUB in question according to HILL was same height, weight, etc. and was wearing a bow tie, same as in the picture he carries.

HILL stated he stopped a MPD scout car and they advised him to contact the FBI. The UNSUBS had since left the scene when police contacted, and heading toward New York Ave. NW.

HILL stated he is a Negro and feels the FBI is either unconcerned or lacks interest in the case. He repeatedly asked the legality of dealing with people like RAY in "our own way". He further stated that the FBI is one organization he does trust and would voluntarily contact WFO of any furhter information concerning the case.

JAMES TROY GOOCH, Jr. was contacted at the District of Columbia jail and consented to be interviewed after acknowledging the contents of the Waiver of Rights form, which he refused to sign.

He stated that he had arrived in Washington, D. C. from Richmond, Virginia, via Greyhound Bus, at approximately twelve noon on April 4, 1968. He stated that the bus fare was \$3.80, and that upon his arrival in Washington, D. C., he shipped his two suitcases back to his parents home at 5210 Crest Drive, Kansas City, Kansas. He stated that he had lunch near the terminal and then started drinking before looking for a job. He stated that he got drunk and then was arrested by the Metropolitan Police Department, but refused to discuss the reasons for his arrest.

He admitted having a .38 caliber snub nose revolver and forty-five rounds of ammunition in his possession. He denied knowing the gun was stolen, stating that he purchased it from a bum on Madison Street, in Chicago, in February, 1968. He stated that he purchased the gun for his personal protection, as he travels a good deal, and paid \$25.00 for it. He stated that he has never been in Denver, Colorado, and was working for Manpower, Incorporated, Cleveland, Ohio, in October, 1967.

He stated that he has never known anyone by the name of JAMES EARL RAY or ERIC STARBO GALT, and denied any complicity in the murder of MARTIN LUTHER KING. He stated that he has never been in Memphis, Birmingham, or Atlanta. He stated that he had worked approximately three to four weeks in Richmond for Employers Overload Company.



#### **Biggest Search in History?**

## Ray Hunt Stumps

By THOMAS TALBURT Scripps-Howard Staff Writer

What is probably the biggest manhunt in history - the search for the slayer of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. - runs into a blank wall on Peachtree-st in Atlanta. The trail ends there.

For four weeks, the will-o'-the-wisp suspect has eluded one of the massive manhunts since dropping from sight in Atlanta on April 5 - the day after Dr. King was shot on a Memphis motel balcony.

Authorities in at least half a dozen other countries also are on the lookout for the elusive man first identified under his alias. Eric Starvo Galt, and later identified by the FBI as James Earl Ray, a drifter and habitual criminal who escaped from the Missouri State Penitentiary on April 23 1967

#### TRAIL ENDS

Altho the FBI has branded Ray its No. 1 quarry and blanketed the nation with "wanted" posters bearing his picture, Ray's trail ends with the recollections of two Atlanta cab drivers who identified him first from sketches, and later from a photograph, as the man they picked up as a passenger April 5.

One of the drivers said he picked up Ray in downtown Atlanta and drove him only two blocks to 12th and Peachtree Streets, when Ray suddenly asked to be let out. The driver said he remembered Ray because of the briefness of his trip.

The second driver, who like the first, is employed by the Atlanta Million Cab Co., said that on the evening of April 5 he drove Ray to the corner of 13th street and Crescent avenue, a block west of Peachtree street.

"That's the last known, verified trace of the man we want," a Federal official said today.

Reports that Ray was seen later the night of April 5 in a shabby Atlanta nightclub have not verified - nor have the thousands of tips which have flooded the FBI from citizens eager to aid the hunt for Dr. King's killer.

The FBI has deduced that Ray drove the ap-

proximately 450 miles from Memphis to Atlanta after Dr. King was slain the evening of April 4. A white Mustang, matching one spotted leaving the scene of Dr. King's murder and bearing license tags issued to Eric Starvo Galt, was abandoned in Atlanta shortly after dawn on April 5.

The theory that Dr. King's assassin was aided in actually committing the act now is questioned by some Federal officials.

Attorney General Ramsey Clark, who ruled out a conspiracy shortly after Dr. King was killed, has said again recently that there is reason to believe the assassination "was the work of one man."

The fact the FBI charged Ray, under his assumed name of Galt, of conspiring with an "alleged brother" against Dr. King, was seen as legal device to enable the FBI to take over th murder investigation - normally a state fund

GOOCH was interviewed at D. C. jail by SA WAYNE R. GILBERT on 4/26/68. From interview and observation, it was determined that GOOCH had arrived in Washington, D. C. from Richmond, Virginia on the morning of 4/4/68. GOOCH is a wino who had 67¢ in his possession at the time of his arrest for stealing a car. He is an individual of low mentality and does not in any way resemble JAMES EARL RAY. Fingerprint comparisons were made, but GOOCH'S prints were not identical to those of JAMES EARL RAY.

In view of the above, GOOCH is no longer being considered a suspect in this case, and no additional investigation will be conducted in his regard.

# Search for King's assassin a now spreads into Australia

Australia has been asked by the FBI to make a "routine check" of whether James Earl Ray, sought in the murder of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., has applied for a visa to go to that country, an embassy official said.

The official emphasized, however, that "Australian authorities have no evidence at all that the person concerned (Ray) is in Australia."

American sources also underscored the routine nature of the request. They said it would be logical to as s u me t h a t similar requests either had or would be made of other nations in which Ray might seek refuge. The FBI had no comment on the embassy official's statement.

ay, also known under alias of Eric Starvo

Galt, has been the target of a widespread search since Dr. King was shot to death as he stood on the balcony of a Memphis, Tenn. motel. He was felled by a rifle bullet believed to have been fired from a nearby rooming house.

RAY, WHO has been charged with murder by Memphis officials, was added to the FBI's most wanted list after a check of more than 53,000 fingerprints disclosed that prints found in a bathroom of the rooming house were identical to those of the wanted man. He also faces a federal conspiracy charge.

Ray escaped from Missouri state penitentiary in April, 1967, while serving a 20-year sentence for arms robbery and auto theft.

The Australian embassy

official said:

"At the request of the FBI, Australian authorities are doing a routine check of records to see if there has been a visa application for Australia by the per use for whom a federal warf is outstanding in connect or with the death of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr."

Ray's Brother Makes Appeal, Disappears

CHICAGO (AP) — Jerry Ray, brother of the man ought on a charge of murdering the Rev. Dr. Martin wither King Jr., has quit his job at a suburban golf club and disappeared, the Chicago Tribune said today.

Ray's disappearance was reported a few hours after he appealed through an interview with another Chicago newspaper, the Sun-Times, for his brother, James Earl Ray, to surrender, "if he is still alive."

The Tribune quoted an official at the Sportsman Country Chub near Northbrook as saying that Jerry Ray, 32, Jerry Ray quit his job as a maintenance man a lay after his photograph appeared in a national magazine. "We don't know where he went," he said. "I guess he got tired of being interviewed."

Approximately one week prior to the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING, a man closely resembling the photograph of JAMES EARL RAY printed in yesterday's newspapers, came to SANDERS home at 3310 Brothers Place, S.E. The man inquired about renting an apartment from SANDERS. The man stated he had seen an advertisement regarding the apartment in the newspaper supposedly placed by a Shelton Real Estate Company. SANDERS had never seen the man before and has not seen him since. SANDERS told the man he did not have an apartment and the man left without furnishing any information about himself or where he could be located. SANDERS said the man fit the description of JAMES EARL RAY that appeared in the newspaper regarding age, height, weight and other visible features.

SANDERS could furnish no further information about the man.
