





DIAGRAM OF SHOOTING SCENE—Sketch shows the doors leading from behind podium at Embossy

Mr. HARRY BENSON stated that he is a photographer for the London Daily Express, London, England, and also for the Black Star Publishing Company, Photographs, 450 Park Avenue South, New York, New York. He resides at 181 West 73rd Street, New York, New York, Apartment 6A, telephone number 249-0284.

On the evening of June 4-5, 1968, he was in Los Angeles, California, at the Ambassador Hotel. 


DIAGRAM OF SHOOTING SCENE—Sketch shows the doors leading from behind pedium at Embossy





DIAGRAM OF SHOOTING SCENE--Sketch shows the doors leading from behind pedium at Embossy
