

1 I'm at--my phone number is 652-7062, and the address is
2 153½ North Arnaz, A-r-n-a-z, Drive, Beverly Hills, 90211.
3 But that--that was my--my key recollection. I thought, well,
4 now isn't that strange here we thought it was just a serious
5 thing, he's bleeding out of his ear, and then it turned out
6 to be he was bleeding in his ear. And I think they
7 determined that at the hospital when they started to clean
8 him up.

9 Q Were you with Mr. Sheets the next time that you
10 saw--

11 A Yes, uh huh. It was either two or three days
12 later. Of course, it must be hell for you when you bring
13 two people and one gives one version.

14 MR. MINER: And the other version.

15 (Overlapping voices)

16 A I don't know how close I tie in with--

17 MR. MINER: I've never heard two people recount
18 a story that they saw a couple hours before, or ten minutes
19 before.

20 A Yeah, yeah, this goes back--I knew--

21 MR. MINER: Much less two years before.

22 A Well, it--

23 MR. MINER: Because people see things with their
24 mind, not with their eyes. They're not cameras, and they
25 edit what they see. And it is always that way.

26 Q BY LT. HERNANDEZ: This is our card, sir; has

1 anyone from any other law enforcement agency or newspapers
2 or magazines or anything talked to you about this?

3 A No, no.

4 Q Okay, are you aware of the court order that was
5 put out by Judge Alarcon relative to the information and so
6 forth?

7 A Well, I just read it superficially in the paper.

8 Q Well, you see everyone that we have been talking
9 to, we have to caution about this because we don't know at
10 this point--we don't know who we will need as witnesses,
11 who will be essential to the case, who will be called by
12 the district attorneys at the time of the trial. And for
13 that reason we have to assume that every witness is a
14 potential witness.

15 A Yes.

16 Q And we would like to advise the people that if
17 they are contacted by anyone--that's the reason I give you
18 that card--for you to refer them to us and not discuss the
19 case with them.

20 A I was curious as to how Millard got into this.
21 I--I know when we--we just by happenstance ran into
22 Alfillisch at Hollywood Park not too long ago; and when
23 he told us that that quiet kid was the one, well naturally
24 we were thrown, absolutely thrown, and--and then, you know,
25 we said, well, my God, was that the kid who--that fell?
26 And is that the fall because always when you read about it,

1 they said Santa Anita, Santa Anita.

2 Q Uh huh. Uh huh.

3 A That--

4 Q Well, this is the kid and that was the fall that
5 they referred to--

6 A Yeah.

7 Q --and, of course, it's--we're going at this
8 with an open mind.

9 A Right.

10 Q We're trying to talk to anyone that might offer
11 any kind of a lead.

12 A If I can be of any assistance, why--

13 LT. HERNANDEZ: Well, we'll go look at the
14 photographs.

Joan went to the hotel with another Kennedy Girl by the name of Toni Rothberg (I-679). She arrived at the hotel at approximately 7:30. and went directly to the Embassy Room. She did not leave the room because people were unable to get back into the room without a pass. At the time Kennedy spoke she was standing on the right side of the stage. After the speech she walked towards the exit when she heard screaming. She stayed around the hotel until 2AM. She does not recall seeing Sirhan or any woman in a polka-dot dress. She did not have a camera and does not see anyone that did.

FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION - V-1 KENNEDY, ROBERT FRANCIS

Senator Kennedy was apparently treated by Dr. Bazilauskas and Dr. Holt, with his wife Ethel in attendance. Condition diagnosed as Comatose, weak thready pulse in extremis. Bullet wound right mastoid area with swelling. Responded with heart beat and breathing to CCM & Heart Lung Machine. Sounds good quality later. DTR's normal, elevated knees. Pupils 3-4 mil R&R&E - rigidity began l ext with quivering abdominal tremors.

Treatment: C. Cardiac massage. Adrenalin 1CC 1 M Stat O₂ Airway. H-L machine-cutdown. Dextran 6% IV cutdown Serum Albumen. Blood drawn T&X match. Polysorin oint eyes. Stat to Good Samaritan Hospital. Condition on discharge listed as critical, quivering abdominal and lower ext, on leaving left foot more so.

Senator Kennedy was transported to Good Samaritan Hospital by Ambulance Unit G-16 which was driven by Gilbert Van Ness and attended by Arlyn Nine. This was on advice of Dr. Albert Holt who accompanied Senator Kennedy to Good Samaritan Hospital. Estimated time of departure from Central Receiving Hospital by Unit G-16 was 12:45 A.M. and arrival at Good Samaritan Hospital was approximately 12:48 A.M. where Senator Kennedy was delivered to members of that hospital staff assigned to the Intensive Care Unit. Dr. Holt remained with Senator Kennedy and Unit G-16 departed for other assignments.

FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION - V-1 KENNEDY, ROBERT FRANCIS

During Senator Kennedy's treatment at Central Receiving Hospital an altercation occurred among News Media Personnel and Mrs. Kennedy and other members of Senator Kennedy's Staff.

A resulting injury occurred to Patrick Thorton, 208 St. Andrews Place, Los Angeles, Phone # 384-8560. His MT indicated that he was hit by a camera and suffered a 3/8" contusion laceration left parietal which was cleaned and sutured by Dr. K. Sauer at approximately 1:30 A.M. Mr. Thorton was released and left Central Receiving Hospital under his own power.

At the time of the Kennedy campaign Miss Horenstein worked for the advertising firm of ~~Koxx~~ Papert, Lois & Koenig which was doing the advertising for Kennedy in California. Their office is located in NYC PH#935-5000.

Miss Horenstein went to the hotel with Barbara Barnett (No interview. Doesn't know how she can be contacted except possibly through Rockefeller campaign headquarters in N.Y.C.). She arrived at the hotel at approximately 8PM and went directly to the Embassy Room. At the time of the speech she was standing about 30' back from the right portion of the stage. After the speech she went to exit through the double doors of the Embassy Room when she heard many screams and people saying that Kennedy Had Been shot.

She does not recall seeing Sirhan or any woman in a polka-dot dress. She did not have a camera and doesn't know of anyone that did.

She has not been contacted by the news media or the F.B.I.

Miss Horenstein is presently unemployed and living with a friend in NY. No permanent address as of yet.

On 6-6-68, interview of MRS LEONORA HOSTETTER, 609 E. Norwood, Alhambra, PHONE AT 15095.

HOSTETTER waited on susp SIRHAN along w/a unk other male. They both came into the coffee shop at approx 9:30 a.m. on Election Day. Both ordered coffee and toast. They had 2 pieces of wht paper approx 12" x 15" and each had a pencil. The two papers were lying bet them and upon these papers were drawn ruled lines in various angles similar to the attached. They talked w/ea. other but would stop conversations upon her presence. At approx 10:15 am she noted both were gone.

She positively picked out susp SIRHAN SIRHAN and a near likeness in the standup photo of SIRHAN, ADELL in the group of photos shown to her.

She described the other susp as 1 to 1½" taller than SIRHAN and slight of build compared to SIRHAN. This comparison made as both susp sat at counter.
