Mrs. A Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, residence Pasadena, California, advised that both she and her husband, M reside approximately one block from the SIRHAN residence. Mrs. Command advised that neither she nor her husband ever knew the SIRHAN family, but that occasionally a young boy by the name of M would ride his bicycle up and down the street in front of the Communication residence and occasionally would drive into the driveway and say hello in a neighborly fashion. Mrs. c advised that the boy had never been in her home and that the conversations between them never went any further than an occasional hello.

She stated that it was rumored in the neighborhood, as told to her by her husband, that a few years ago, in approximately 1965 or 1966, this young boy M left home to live with an older woman, reportedly twice his age. Mrs. C stated at that time that it was believed by both she and her husband that the boy could not have been any older than 15 years of age. It was later rumored that there was a death in the family, a sister, and that Manager was so upset at the loss that it shocked him into returning to the family. Mrs. Can advised that as far as she knows this boy has never wandered from his parents' home since. She advised that she has never seen any other member of the family and that she never saw the boy M since his reported return. Her only knowledge of him was as a young boy riding his bicycle on the block.

Mrs. C advised that she was unaware of the fact that Man had an older brother and that she does not remember having SIRHAN SIRHAN in her English class at anytime. Mrs. C furnished her seating chart for the fall semester of 1964 and advised that SIRHAN SIRHAN was not listed as a student of hers during that semester.

Mr. H claimed that he was formerly employed in the Foreign Service by the United States Department of State at Washington, D.C., for a period of 16 years and was given a disability retirement on December 31, 1966 due to health. He had been given general assignments and had worked in the Visa Office and Ammunition Controls. He had spent a number of years on assignments in the Middle East, particularly in Iraq.

During the past few weeks, Mr. Here had been a volunteer worker for the Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY campaign at the latter's Los Angeles headquarters at 5615 Wilshire Boulevard.

Following the shooting of Senator KENNEDY, and the arrest of SIRHAN SIRHAN charged with shooting the senator on June 5, 1968, there had been some speculation among former workers in the KENNEDY Headquarters, now closed, that SIRHAN SIRHAN may have been at the headquarters as a volunteer worker within the past few days. He recalled specifically that who worked on the information desk and I see a general assistant volunteer worker at the headquarters, had reported that they thought that they had observed a person closely resembling SIRHAN SIRHAN in the KENNEDY headquarters.

Photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN taken by the Los Angeles Police Department on June 5, 1968, were exhibited to Mr. High who said that while the photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN looked like the young man he had seen at the KENNEDY headquarters within the last two or three days but he could not be positive.

On the evening of June 5, 1968, Mr. Kan called Mr. Hand at the latter's residence and discussed briefly the tragic event involving Senator KENNEDY and suggested that he, Mr. Kan and Mr. HENEBRY go out to dinner. Mr. Hand declined and thought it somewhat unusual that Kan would ask him out to dinner under the circumstances and on such short acquaintance. Mr. Kan mentioned that he had to go to San Francisco on business and was expected to return to Los Angeles in a couple of days.

With respect to the young man at the KENNEDY Headquarters who somewhat resembled SIRHAN SIRHAN, Mr. He said that he was one of the group that had been brought in by Mr. Keep but that this young man appeared to be too large for the description of SIRHAN SIRHAN published in the newspaper. Mr. He described the young man who resembled SIRHAN SIRHAN's photograph as being about 20 years of age, close to five feet ten inches in height, and weighing 150 pounds plus.

There were about five 'pops' or 'snaps' which did not sound like a gun.

"I ran from the kitchen, my station, to the Embassy service pantry. I saw a lot of people screaming and crying. I saw people holding a man who had a gun in his hand. I ran over to them and tried to reach over the steamer counter to grap his arm but someone





Rosemead, California, telephone advised that she was employed at the Organic-Pasadena Health Food Store, 1380 North Lake Avenue, Pasadena, California, as manager from December 15, 1967 until March 7, 1968, when she resigned. During this period of time SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN was also employed at this store as a general stock clerk and delivery boy. He had been so employed both part time and full time since prior to Mrs. Description beginning her employment. She advised that she did not know him and had never seen him prior to her employment at this store.

Approximately one and one-half weeks prior to her quitting on March 7, 1968, she submitted her letter of resignation to the owner of the health food store, Jew She advised that she left the employment at the above store on the same date that SIRHAN was fired. On the morning of March 7, 1968, she overheard West tell SIRHAN that he may leave the store, meaning that he was fired. SIRHAN then proceeded to sit down in the store waiting to be paid his wages due. Mrs. Description said the situation at the store at this time was tense after West had fired SIRHAN, and to ease this situation she made a statement to SIRHAN, and to general conversation. When she spoke to him West then came up to her and told her that she was not to speak to SIRHAN since he was no longer working there. Mrs. Description advised that this infuriated her to the extent that she quit her job on the spot.

They never had any political conversations and she cannot recall him talking of any of his personal interests. A large crowd of people immediately gathered around him and then I saw three or four men wrestling with a man who had a gun in his right The man with the gun was standing about eight or ten feet from Senator Kennedy and was a young man about twenty or twenty five years of age. He was wearing a blue sports coat. I just got a glimpse of the side of the man's face and could not identify him from that quick glance other than to say he was a young man. also noticed the man had a lot of black hair which appeared uncombed. The only man I recognized who was wrestling with the man was C the banquet captain. I recall seeing the same man about twenty minutes prior to that time as he was walking into the Colonial Room. The man was alone and I only saw him from the rear, but I recognized him because of the same blue sport coat.

"The men who were wrestling the man with the gun were near the steam tables and they finally got the man on the steam table and held him down. My attention was then directed again to Senator Kennedy who was lying on the floor. I saw blood on his stomach and on the right side of his head. Then the crowd of people moved in around Senator Kennedy and I didn't see him anymore. I then returned to the kitchen area and did not see either Senator Kennedy or the man with the gun again.

"I have seen a photograph of Sirhan Sirhan and I do not know him. Further, I can not positively say he was the same man I observed with the gun the night Senator Kennedy was shot. I do not recall ever seeing anyone resembling Sirhan Sirhan in or around the hotel



She advised that on June 4, 1968, she did not work at the hotel and was unable to furnish any information concerning the shooting of Sentator ROBERT F. KENNEDY.

She further advised, upon viewing the photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, that he was unknown to her, and she did not recall ever having observed him in or around the hotel.
