Mrs. N [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, residence address [REDACTED] Monterey Park, California, advised that she does remember SIRHAN SIRHAN in her Spring 1965 English class. Mrs. S [REDACTED] advised that she recognized his picture on television and in the newspapers but knows nothing of the boy since he rarely attended class and either dropped out or was dismissed from the college during that same semester.

Mrs. S [REDACTED] advised that she knew of no associates or any friendships which SIRHAN might have had. Mrs. S [REDACTED] advised that although SIRHAN had been at Pasadena City College for more than a year, he could still be taking first year English due to the fact that it is not required for graduation and can be taken at the students' option anytime while enrolled.

Mrs. S [REDACTED] advised that had she had SIRHAN in her reading course she might have known more about him since it is smaller and what she termed as intimate. The English 1A class is large and very impersonal and since SIRHAN attended infrequently, she knew nothing more about him other than to recognize his picture and his name.

Mrs. A. C. [redacted] Pasadena City College, Pasadena, California, residence [redacted] Pasadena, California, advised that both she and her husband, M. C. [redacted] reside approximately one block from the SIRHAN residence. Mrs. C. [redacted] advised that neither she nor her husband ever knew the SIRHAN family, but that occasionally a young boy by the name of M. [redacted] would ride his bicycle up and down the street in front of the C. [redacted] residence and occasionally would drive into the driveway and say hello in a neighborly fashion. Mrs. C. [redacted] advised that the boy had never been in her home and that the conversations between them never went any further than an occasional hello.

She stated that it was rumored in the neighborhood, as told to her by her husband, that a few years ago, in approximately 1965 or 1966, this young boy M. [redacted] left home to live with an older woman, reportedly twice his age. Mrs. C. [redacted] stated at that time that it was believed by both she and her husband that the boy could not have been any older than 15 years of age. It was later rumored that there was a death in the family, a sister, and that M. [redacted] was so upset at the loss that it shocked him into returning to the family. Mrs. C. [redacted] advised that as far as she knows this boy has never wandered from his parents' home since. She advised that she has never seen any other member of the family and that she never saw the boy M. [redacted] since his reported return. Her only knowledge of him was as a young boy riding his bicycle on the block.

Mrs. C. [redacted] advised that she was unaware of the fact that M. [redacted] had an older brother and that she does not remember having SIRHAN SIRHAN in her English class at anytime. Mrs. C. [redacted] furnished her seating chart for the fall semester of 1964 and advised that SIRHAN SIRHAN was not listed as a student of hers during that semester.

C [redacted] H [redacted] Los Angeles, California, telephone [redacted] retired, advised the following:

Mr. H [redacted] claimed that he was formerly employed in the Foreign Service by the United States Department of State at Washington, D.C., for a period of 16 years and was given a disability retirement on December 31, 1966 due to health. He had been given general assignments and had worked in the Visa Office and Ammunition Controls. He had spent a number of years on assignments in the Middle East, particularly in Iraq.

During the past few weeks, Mr. H [redacted] had been a volunteer worker for the Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY campaign at the latter's Los Angeles headquarters at 5615 Wilshire Boulevard.

Following the shooting of Senator KENNEDY, and the arrest of SIRHAN SIRHAN charged with shooting the senator on June 5, 1968, there had been some speculation among former workers in the KENNEDY Headquarters, now closed, that SIRHAN SIRHAN may have been at the headquarters as a volunteer worker within the past few days. He recalled specifically that E [redacted] S [redacted] who worked on the information desk and I [redacted] S [redacted] a general assistant volunteer worker at the headquarters, had reported that they thought that they had observed a person closely resembling SIRHAN SIRHAN in the KENNEDY headquarters.

Photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN taken by the Los Angeles Police Department on June 5, 1968, were exhibited to Mr. H [redacted] who said that while the photographs of SIRHAN SIRHAN looked like the young man he had seen at the KENNEDY headquarters within the last two or three days but he could not be positive.

Mr. H [redacted] mentioned that there had been a number of young people volunteer workers at the headquarters who

appeared to be of Middle East descent and that they had been brought into the headquarters by one K [redacted] K [redacted] who had showed up there around June 1, 1968. K [redacted] who claimed to be from Iran, had engaged Mr. H [redacted] from time to time in some conversation. K [redacted] spoke fluent English with a slight accent. He appeared to be about 55 years of age, male Caucasian, complexion not too dark, clean shaven, black hair, graying, five feet six inches to five feet seven inches, stocky build, wore long sideburns, strong facial features, dressed like a Hollywood film character actor. On one occasion Mr. H [redacted] noted him wearing a turtleneck sweater.

It was recalled that Mrs. M [redacted] S [redacted] who handled the headquarters office had brought K [redacted] to Mr. H [redacted] and introduced him.

K [redacted] on at least one or two occasions, was accompanied by a young female Caucasian, about 23 years of age, five feet four inches, dark hair, attractive. She appeared to have more Caucasian features than Middle East features. This girl, who was described as a sister by Mr. K [redacted] was seated most of the day when working. She used modern aluminum crutches and held one leg up. This leg was not in a cast.

Mr. K [redacted] claimed that he had been flying around to various Senator KENNEDY Campaign Headquarters and mentioned that he had a crew of approximately 20 young people which he had brought to headquarters to work for Senator KENNEDY.

Mr. K [redacted] worked late at the headquarters on election day, June 4, 1968, and said that he did not think he would go to the campaign party at the Ambassador Hotel that night.

Mr. H [redacted] said that he could speak and understand Arabic and that while he did not have too much contact with Mr. K [redacted] the latter seemed to be friendly because of their common knowledge of Middle East languages.

On the evening of June 5, 1968, Mr. K [redacted] called Mr. H [redacted] at the latter's residence and discussed briefly the tragic event involving Senator KENNEDY and suggested that he, Mr. K [redacted] and Mr. HENEERY go out to dinner. Mr. H [redacted] declined and thought it somewhat unusual that K [redacted] would ask him out to dinner under the circumstances and on such short acquaintance. Mr. K [redacted] mentioned that he had to go to San Francisco on business and was expected to return to Los Angeles in a couple of days.

With respect to the young man at the KENNEDY Headquarters who somewhat resembled SIRHAN SIRHAN, Mr. H [redacted] said that he was one of the group that had been brought in by Mr. K [redacted] but that this young man appeared to be too large for the description of SIRHAN SIRHAN published in the newspaper. Mr. H [redacted] described the young man who resembled SIRHAN SIRHAN's photograph as being about 20 years of age, close to five feet ten inches in height, and weighing 150 pounds plus.

Mr. K [redacted] had asked Mr. H [redacted] for the latter's name and address which had been furnished to him and Mr. K [redacted] had furnished an address at the headquarters of 10554 1/2 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles.

Mr. H [redacted], following examination of a photograph of S [redacted] S [redacted] taken December 18, 1963, and of A [redacted] S [redacted] taken June 5, 1968, both brothers of SIRHAN SIRHAN, said he could not identify the photograph with any persons who had worked or been seen at the Senator KENNEDY Campaign Headquarters or elsewhere.

Mr. B. [REDACTED] television actor, was contacted following an attempt to contact him through his agent, J. [REDACTED] M. [REDACTED] Los Angeles, California, telephone number [REDACTED]. He was informed that an interview was desired regarding any knowledge he may have of SIRHAN SIRHAN, who had been accused of shooting Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY. SIRHAN reportedly had worked as an exercise boy at [REDACTED] Corona, California, a horse ranch where Mr. E. [REDACTED] was said to have kept horses.

Mr. E. [REDACTED] said he could relate what information he had inasmuch as he did not recall SIRHAN. Two or three years ago he stabled some horses at the above ranch, owned by B. [REDACTED] A. [REDACTED]. His horses had been handled by F. [REDACTED] D. [REDACTED], who was no longer employed at this ranch. BURT would probably know F. [REDACTED] whereabouts. There were several apprentice boys who handled E. [REDACTED] horses whom F. [REDACTED] would know or recall. It was possible SIRHAN may have been at the ranch at that time.

On Sunday, June 9, 1968, Mr. E. [REDACTED] received a call from G. [REDACTED] R. [REDACTED], a representative of "Life" magazine, seeking data and photographs of SIRHAN at the ranch as "Life" was doing a story on SIRHAN. Mr. E. [REDACTED] checked through his photographs taken of his horses and came up with one showing an exercise boy who could have been SIRHAN, but E. [REDACTED] was not sure as only half of this boy's face showed in the photograph. It was given to the "Life" representative who could be reached at telephone number [REDACTED] if it was desired to see the photograph.

The exercise boys were paid by the owner of the ranch and E. [REDACTED] paid a fee to the ranch to stable his horses.

E [REDACTED] B [REDACTED], employee of the Ace Guard Service, Granada Hills, California, was interviewed at his residence, [REDACTED] Granada Hills. He advised that he was on guard duty at the Ambassador Hotel on the evening of June 4, 1968, starting at 6:00 p.m. Prior to taking up a position on the fifth floor in the vicinity of the KENNEDY suite (the Presidential suite of the Ambassador) W [REDACTED] G [REDACTED] Security Officer of the Ambassador, had displayed to him an orange colored pamphlet with black lettering which bore the caption, "Kill KENNEDY." G [REDACTED] then instructed him not to permit the passing of such pamphlets in the area where he, B [REDACTED] was working on the fifth floor that evening. B [REDACTED] said he could not recall any other specific details concerning the pamphlet except that it had some kind of insignia indicating the source of the pamphlet.

B [REDACTED] also stated that among the persons he had permitted to enter the KENNEDY suite earlier on the evening of June 4, 1968, were the following CBS and newspaper men:

He was born [REDACTED] at Sonora, Mexico. His Social Security Number is [REDACTED]. He has been in the United States since approximately 1962 and has been employed by the hotel for approximately 1½ years.

On June 4, 1968, he began work at the hotel at approximately 4 PM and continued to work at the hotel until approximately 3:30 AM on June 5, 1968. He worked at various places in the hotel during his tour of duty.

Between midnight and 12:30 AM on June 5, 1968, he was in the vicinity of the Palm Court Room. He did not hear the shooting that took place at the hotel.

At approximately 12:30 AM, on June 5, 1968, he heard that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY had been shot and this was his first knowledge of the shooting.

S [REDACTED] advised that he has seen photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN in the newspapers and that prior to having seen these photographs, he does not recall ever having seen SIRHAN. He was shown a photograph of SIRHAN.

J. S. [redacted] Los Angeles, California, telephone PL 1-9962, was interviewed at the Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, where he is employed as a banquet houseman. He furnished the following information:

He was born [redacted] at Shreveport, Louisiana. His Social Security Number is [redacted].

On June 4, 1968, he worked at the hotel from approximately 4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. He remained at the hotel until approximately 1:00 a.m., June 5, 1968. At approximately 12:15 a.m. on June 5, 1968, he was in the hallway, which is located behind the Embassy Room. His position in the hallway was toward the inside stairway, which leads from the Embassy Room level to the Ambassador Room level.

At about that time he heard several noises, which he thought were balloons exploding. The noises seemed to sound one right after another.

He went to the room where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was shot, but he did not see Senator KENNEDY. He saw a man being held on one of the steam tables in the room and he believes R. G. [redacted] and two other individuals were holding this man on the table. He does not recall whether the man on the table was holding a gun at the time.

He was shown a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and he advised that he saw this individual's picture in the newspaper and also observed SIRHAN on television, the day following the shooting. He believes SIRHAN is the same person he observed being held on the steam table.

He was born [REDACTED] in Budapest, Hungary. He is five feet ten inches tall, weighs 180 pounds, and has blond hair. His Social Security Number is [REDACTED]. He was admitted to the United States on February 25, 1957. He has been employed at the Ambassador Hotel since June 1, 1968.

On June 4, 1968, he worked at the hotel from approximately 3:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. He left the hotel sometime between 11:00 p.m. and midnight, June 4, 1968.

He was at home sleeping on June 5, 1968 at approximately 2:00 a.m., when his father woke him and advised him that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and others had been shot at the Ambassador Hotel.

He was shown a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and he advised he had seen this individual's picture in the newspaper and also had observed SIRHAN on television. He stated that prior to seeing SIRHAN's photograph in the newspaper, he does not recall ever having seen SIRHAN before.

N [REDACTED] V [REDACTED], Los Angeles, telephone number 387-4835, was interviewed at the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, where he is employed as a room service waiter. He furnished the following information:

He was born [REDACTED] at Huanuco, Peru. His Social Security Number is [REDACTED]. He served two years in the United States Army from September 1965 to September 1967 and his Army Serial Number is [REDACTED].

He worked for the hotel for a short period before going into the Army and he has been back at work approximately one week.

On June 4, 1968, he began work at the hotel at approximately 4:30 PM and continued at work at the hotel until approximately 1 AM, June 5, 1968.

At approximately 12:15 AM, on June 5, 1968, he was in the room service section of the hotel. He heard what he thought were two small firecrackers exploding. After a two or three second pause, he heard several other explosions which he assumed were small firecrackers.

Shortly after hearing the explosions, a person (identity not known) said that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY had been shot. He went to the doorway and observed Senator KENNEDY and one other man lying on the floor. There was quite a commotion taking place in the room where Senator KENNEDY was lying.

As he was standing at the door, he was told by his supervisor to get back to work, and he returned to his work area. V [REDACTED] stated that he did not observe the man who fired the shots.

He advised that he has seen photographs in the newspapers of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and prior to having seen these photographs of SIRHAN in the newspaper, he does not recall ever having seen this individual. He was shown a photograph of SIRHAN.

He was born [REDACTED] at Cortland, New York. His Social Security Number is [REDACTED]. He is employed by R. A. Watt, Incorporated, Gardena, California.

He is a roommate of J [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] the Convention Manager for the Ambassador Hotel.

On June 4, 1968, he was in the Embassy Room of the hotel with S [REDACTED]. He was also at various other locations with S [REDACTED] in the hotel on June 4, 1968.

He and S [REDACTED] were together in the Embassy Room when Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY completed his victory speech and he observed Senator KENNEDY leaving the platform and going out of the Embassy Room through the door to the rear of the platform. When Senator KENNEDY left the platform, he and S [REDACTED] walked out of the Embassy Room through the front doors of the Embassy Room, towards the lobby and as they were exiting the room, Mr. U [REDACTED] T [REDACTED] one of the Vice Presidents of the hotel, came running out and told S [REDACTED] to call a doctor.

S [REDACTED] departed to call a doctor and he, E [REDACTED], returned to the Embassy Room to the platform area. As he got to the platform area, he observed a lady being carried into the Embassy Room and noticed she had a head wound.

When he was returning to the platform area in the Embassy Room, he believes he heard a female voice state "We shot him". He assumed at the time this person meant we the people were the cause of the Senator being shot and therefore, "We shot him." E [REDACTED] advised he did not see this individual, but only heard the voice and could not recall any unusual tone to the voice.

He left the Embassy Room shortly after hearing this individual and he went out into the lobby of the hotel where numerous people were milling around and talking about the shooting. He heard several other people in the audience state something to the effect "We shot him." and from the other conversations he was able to determine that they meant that the people were the cause of Senator KENNEDY being shot and it was in this context that they said, "We shot him."

E [REDACTED] stated that while he was touring the hotel with S [REDACTED] during the evening of June 4, 1968, he noticed that there were quite a few shoddily dressed individuals in the hotel.

On June 5, 1968, he saw SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN's photograph in the newspaper, and he immediately recalled having seen SIRHAN in the Embassy Room at approximately 10:00 p.m. on June 4, 1968. He was unable to describe the clothing that SIRHAN had on at the time, but only recalls he did not fit in with other individuals in the room. He believes SIRHAN had on some sort of dungarees and a jacket. At the time he observed SIRHAN, SIRHAN was standing alone. He did not notice anyone else in SIRHAN's company.

He was shown a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, and he advised that SIRHAN is the individual he observed in the Embassy Room at approximately 10:00 p.m. on June 4, 1968.

E [REDACTED] stated he does not recall having seen any woman in a polka dot dress or wearing a piece of clothing with a polka dot design at the Ambassador Hotel on June 4 or 5, 1968.

E [REDACTED] advised he did not hear the shooting at the hotel just after midnight on June 5, 1968, and was not aware that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and others had been shot until he heard it being discussed by the people in the hotel.

On June 10, 1968, N [REDACTED] Y [REDACTED], a cook at the Ambassador Hotel, 3400 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, was interviewed at the hotel at which time he furnished the following signed statement:

"June 10, 1968  
Ambassador Hotel,  
Los Angeles, California

"I, N [REDACTED] Y [REDACTED], hereby furnish the following voluntary statement to F [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] who has identified himself to me as a special agent of the F.B.I.

"I have been advised that I could be required to appear before a court of law.

"I was born on [REDACTED] in Japan and arrived in the United States approximately five years ago. I reside at 2877 Edgehill Drive, Los Angeles, California and have been employed as a cook at the Ambassador Hotel since January, 1968. On June 4, 1968, I was working from 5 PM to 1 AM on June 5, 1968 in the 'coldmeat' department in the kitchen. I don't remember exactly at what time but it was shortly after 12 midnight when I heard a noise which sounded like a 'snap' of a party streamer. There were about five 'pops' or 'snaps' which did not sound like a gun.

"I ran from the kitchen, my station, to the Embassy service pantry. I saw a lot of people screaming and crying. I saw people holding a man who had a gun in his hand. I ran over to them and tried to reach over the steamer counter to grasp his arm but someone

area. I was standing between the pantry and the kitchen, about ten to fifteen feet from Senator Kennedy when I heard several loud noises which sounded like shots. At that time Senator Kennedy was shaking hands with the two cooks and I saw him double up and fall backwards to the floor. A large crowd of people immediately gathered around him and then I saw three or four men wrestling with a man who had a gun in his right hand. The man with the gun was standing about eight or ten feet from Senator Kennedy and was a young man about twenty or twenty five years of age. He was wearing a blue sports coat. I just got a glimpse of the side of the man's face and could not identify him from that quick glance other than to say he was a young man. I also noticed the man had a lot of black hair which appeared uncombed. The only man I recognized who was wrestling with the man was C. Y., the banquet captain. I recall seeing the same man about twenty minutes prior to that time as he was walking into the Colonial Room. The man was alone and I only saw him from the rear, but I recognized him because of the same blue sport coat.

"The men who were wrestling the man with the gun were near the steam tables and they finally got the man on the steam table and held him down. My attention was then directed again to Senator Kennedy who was lying on the floor. I saw blood on his stomach and on the right side of his head. Then the crowd of people moved in around Senator Kennedy and I didn't see him anymore. I then returned to the kitchen area and did not see either Senator Kennedy or the man with the gun again.

"I have seen a photograph of Sirhan Sirhan and I do not know him. Further, I can not positively say he was the same man I observed with the gun the night Senator Kennedy was shot. I do not recall ever seeing anyone resembling Sirhan Sirhan in or around the hotel

She stated that at about midnight she was at the room service desk located just off the main kitchen of the hotel, when Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY, his wife and party estimated to be about six people, came through the kitchen area enroute to the Embassy Room. She recalled that Senator KENNEDY was immediately preceded through the kitchen by Mr. U [REDACTED] T [REDACTED] Vice President and Banquet and Sales Manager of the hotel. Miss A [REDACTED] recalled that Senator KENNEDY stopped and shook hands with C [REDACTED] S [REDACTED] L [REDACTED] C [REDACTED] and herself. Miss A [REDACTED] advised she returned to her office, which is located at the rear of the room service desk, to work on payroll records, when she heard a loud noise which sounded like a balloon breaking, followed by five or six additional popping sounds. She stated the noise seemed to come from the direction of the Embassy Room and as she got up and started toward the Embassy Room, she rounded the corner by the ice machines and observed a man on the floor with a large group of people clustered around him. She stated at that time she did not know the man on the floor was Senator KENNEDY. She immediately instructed the employees who were in the area to return to the room service area in the kitchen. She stated within a very few minutes, the police and ambulance arrived and she did not observe anything else other than several unknown people running around the kitchen, and a great deal of noise and confusion.

Miss A [REDACTED] viewed a photograph of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and stated she had never seen SIRHAN before, during, or after the shooting and was unable to furnish any additional information.
