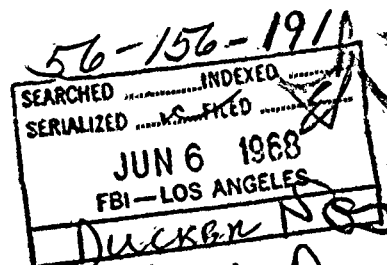

C related he was in the Crocker Citizens Bank, 1360 Santa Monica Mall, Santa Monica, 870-0037, or 8704110 (MR. WILLIAM BECKER), on Monday or Tuesday, between 11-00am and 12-00noon. C said he was standing in line to make a deposit, when he noticed a rather "hippie" looking individual, who had extremely black eyes, and black bushy hair, in front of him. He had a wade of smaller denomination bills, which, when he got to the window, he exchanged for 4 \$100 bills. C said as the man turned to leave C saw him full in the face. H said after seeing pictures of SIRHAN in the news, he is reasonably certain this man was SIRHAN, or at least an excellent look alike. He said if it were in fact SIRHAN he felt this might be of interest. H finished the description of the man by stating he was wearing a white shirt, was slim and short.

On 6/6/68, PCI ALLEN MICHAEL FITZGERALD, a reliable source, furnished the following information to writer:

He was employed at the Green Hotel, 50 East Green Street, Pasadena, California, from approximately May 1967, to the first part of January 1968. The owners at this time were SELMA YOUNIS, her husband JOSEPH GEORGE, and YOUNIS' son, ~~FRED PAULOS~~. YOUNIS gave her husband half interest in the hotel, but when her son and her husband could not get along, she bought back the half interest from the husband for \$46,000. These individuals no longer own this hotel.

YOUNIS is a white, female, age approximately 68 years old, who lives in Beverly Hills, extremely wealthy. Her business address is 1533 South Hoover, phone DU 3-2891. The son is a white, male, age approximately 40, who also lives in Beverly Hills on the corner of Camden and Carmelita, exact location unknown. JOSEPH GEORGE is not his true name but has an Italian sounding last name but was born in Jerusalem. He is described as a white, male, age approximately 38, 5'10", weight 200 pounds. Although GEORGE is YOUNIS' husband and claims to reside with her, he very seldom can be reached at home. GEORGE attempts to be a "fence" and has approached informant on several occasions if he has any "gems" to sell.

While working at the Green Hotel, GEORGE made it known in uncertain terms that he is pro-Arab and anti-Jewish.

Informant recalls numerous meetings at the Hotel of persons who appeared to be of Arab extraction with GEORGE. These individuals would meet at the hotel and then go up to a room. Some of these meetings were in the afternoon, possibly between noon and 6:00 p.m., but for the most part between 6:00 p.m., and 9:00 p.m.

Informant described GEORGE as a "violently fanatic: pro-Arab." In fact, if anyone would come out in the paper expressing their views for pro-Israel, he indicated that they should be shot. Informant recalls quite specifically that the individual who murdered Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY attended these meetings on numerous occasions. Informant was never in attendance at these meetings but saw them before they went up to the meetings. Informant recalled that these meetings were being held two or three times a week between May 1967, and to the first part of January 1968. Informant does not recall any names of any of the individuals who attended these meetings.

Informant stated that the son has talked to the informant regarding conversations between him and his step-father. To informant's knowledge, the son and the mother are not fully implicated or have any feelings such as GEORGE does. Informant recalls that GEORGE has talked about getting guns, swords, etc.

Writer received call late on 6/5/68 from person who identified ~~self~~ self as MATHEW J. GOLDEN, 1427 North Orange Dr., Los Angeles, phone HO 3-8427.

~~GOLDEN~~ stated that about 1½ blocks south of his residence on Orange, a large sign has been attached to the residence there covering the whole length of the yard, which stated in effect: "ASSASSINATION IS THE AMERICAN WAY". Stated this sign went up almost immediately after KENNEDY was assassinated on 6/5/68.

GOLDEN stated that this upset him and wanted something done about it. Writer thanked him for the info. GOLDEN stated he did not know who lived at the residence nor did he have the address, but stated it was easy to locate because of the nature or the sign.

At 1:20 p.m., 6/5/68, Mrs. CHARLES WEINER, 1482 Shennandoah, Los Angeles, California, telephone ~~657-3569~~, telephonically advised the Los Angeles Office as follows:

While observing television on the morning of 6/5/68 concerning captioned matter, a photograph of SIRHAN SIRHAN was shown with a commentary that the motivation of SIRHAN in shooting Senator KENNEDY was unknown. Further that investigation to determine a motive was being conducted.

Mrs. WEINER stated that in conversation with her husband, CHARLES, they concluded from observing SIRHAN's photograph that he appeared to be of Arabic origin. They concluded that a possible motive for shooting Senator KENNEDY could be the cause of Senator KENNEDY's apparent endorsement of the Jewish people and the country of Israel.

Mrs. WEINER stated that the reason she was furnishing this information is that she wanted to "go on record as having proposed this as a possible motive for the shooting."

She was picking up some cardboard boxes and C asked her what she was doing. (He said he always tries to talk to the good looking girls). She replied she was going to move. As the conversation continued, C found out the girl had been living there in the neighborhood about three weeks. She had come from "back east." Further she stated she "had come out here to help my country and do good." She related she was going to move to Hollywood, into a house (location unknown to C).</p> <p>C said he asked her why she wanted to move and she replied, "Its going to be big trouble if they do what they say they're going to do.... and I mean BIG trouble." Mrs. BISHOPP advised that she had been watching television on 6/5/68, and saw the televised talk of the late Sen. ROBERT KENNEDY. On the screen she observed a female, dressed in a light dress, pass in front of the chairs on which persons present in the room were sitting. Mrs. BISHOPP felt the woman might be the one being sought as having a possible ~~kid~~ connection with this case (the woman in the polka-dot dress). Mrs. BISHOPP said she could not recall whether the woman was wearing a polka-dot dress, but suggested that film of above be reviewed and persons in audience be interviewed for any information they might have concerning the above-described female.

The following is submitted for your information.

On 6/5/68 at approximately 1:30 p.m. the writer contacted District Director GEORGE C. ROSENBERG, INS, to determine the availability of their files on the SIRHAN family. Mr. ROSENBERG advised that all information in his possession concerning the SIRHAN family was available to the FBI to the point of removing the files from INS custody and taking them to the Bureau office.

Mr. ROSENBERG stated that there was one problem in connection with the Bureau having access to the files at the moment. He said the Attorney General's office had requested that a summary on the SIRHAN family was to be prepared by INS and Mr. ROSENBERG's orders were to prepare the summaries and dispatch them to Washington in the custody of a commercial airline pilot.

In further conversation with Mr. ROSENBERG and in conveying to him the urgent need for the files by this Bureau, he made the file available on each member of the family as he completed dictation and arranged for the use of INS personnel and equipment to duplicate the file for FBI use.

In view of the demand placed on Mr. ROSENBERG, the above arrangement appeared to be the most reasonable and expeditious for the benefit of this Bureau.

At approximately 4:00 p.m. Mr. ROSENBERG advised that he had received a phone call from the Commissioner's office, INS, Washington, D.C., advising him that that office had received a complaint from this Bureau to the effect that the Los Angeles office of INS was not cooperating. The writer explained to Mr. ROSENBERG that the statement apparently was not founded on fact in view of the arrangements which had been worked out.

Mr. ROSENBERG stated that having as many years of Government service as he has, that he can readily understand how misunderstandings may happen. He appeared to hold no animosity and took the entire matter as normal operating difficulties.

It is noted that as the files were made available and duplicated, information was hand carried to the FBI office during the afternoon from approximately 2:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m., when the last and largest file concerning MUNIR SIRHAN had been duplicated.

It is also to be noted that after the suspect in the KENSALT case was identified, it took some time for INS to locate the files and deliver them to Mr. ROSENBERG's office since several of the files were in the storage center in San Pedro.

In your conversation with Mr. ROSENBERG in the future, you may wish to make reference to this affair and indicate to him our appreciation for his cooperation under the circumstances.

HARRIET GOLDSTEIN, Age 19, 1917 South Corning Street, Los Angeles, was interviewed in the presence of her parents, SAUL and EDITH GOLDSTEIN by SA's MORRISON and ROBERT E. SAGE. She advised that about 3:30 P.M., 6/6/68, her mother was driving through the alley located at the rear of the Daylite Market, 1830 South La Cienega Blvd., when her mother observed a green May Co. shopping bag lying in the middle of the alley. Upon checking the bag, her mother observed it contained a woman's polka dot dress along with miscellaneous items of women's undergarments and cosmetics. Mrs. GOLDSTEIN took the bag and contents home which she described as follows:

one polka dot dress, white dots with dark grey background, low waistline, sleeveless with pleated front sash, size estimated as 9-11

one pair of black patent shoes

one black slip

one brassiere, padded, size 34

girdle with nylon stockings attached

cosmetics including lipstick, eyebrow pencil, bobby pins

The above items were in new or almost new condition and contained no indication of ownership. HARRIET was aware of the publicity being given the unknown lady in the polka dot dress and after getting no response from the LAPD, notified the LA District Attorney's Office. Between 5:30 P.M. and 6:00 P.M., two detectives from the LAPD, names unrecalled, stopped by and picked up the above items. The detectives stated they were working out of the office of the Chief of Police.

EDITH GOLDSTEIN verified the above information and was unable to furnish any additional information.

On above date at 5:55 PM, writer received call from person who identified self as PETE NOYES of KNXT News.

He stated that he, about 45 minutes ago, had received a call from a woman who identified herself as HARRIET GOLDSTEIN of 1917 South Corning St., Los Angeles, phone 870-7923.

GOLDSTEIN stated that her mother, name not provided, had earlier today found in an alleyway, a large bag that contained a black and white polka dot dress, a purse with no identification and some beads.

NOYES stated he did not get any more info but remember the woman stating that she had called the LAPD who had laughed at her. GOLDSTEIN did not furnish the location of the alley where the bag was found.

NOYES stated he was furnishing this info for whatever action may be deemed appropriate. Stated he was thinking of possible connection with DAPD APB re 2 - LA pick up on unknown woman wearing polka dot dress who was allegedly heard shouting as she left the place of the assassination something to the effect that "we got him".

Was at school in 1948 when owing to Arab/Israeli conflict fled and took refuge in Jerusalem, Old City where he is still living. Since that time he is unemployed.

Applicant lived in the New City of Jerusalem till 1948 when the Palestine conflict started. As the Jordanian and Israeli troops were fighting each other for the occupation of the City he fled under bombardment and took refuge in the Old City.

Elements of hardship:

Applicant lost his home and belongings in Palestine as a result of the Arab/Israeli conflict. In Jordan he was unable to continue his studies and had to leave his school and look for employment in order to earn his living. But owing to lack of work in Jordan he has been unable to find a decent job and could not therefore resettle in a normal life. His desire is to join his parents, sisters and brothers who immigrated to USA in 1956 under the Refugee Relief Act of 1953.

Applicant fled from the New City of Jerusalem for fear of persecution by the Jews because of race and religion. He cannot return to his home in Israel even if he wanted to and can claim no compensation for what he has lost there.

Although he is not likely to be persecuted in Jordan yet he may not be able to resettle in Jordan and will be dependent of UNRWA's assistance for many years to come.

Effect on welfare of U.S. if applicant admitted:

Mr. Sirhan is a well educated, ambitious young man who can speak enough English to make himself understood. Although he has no proper skill yet he should be able to find some employment in an Office or a Factory with which he could earn his living and become self-supporting.

His parents, brothers and sisters immigrated to USA in 1956 under the Refugee Relief Act of 1953 and are eager to have him join them.

We strongly recommend that this young man be given the chance to join his parents under the present Public Law as otherwise he will have to wait for many, many years before his turn on the Israeli quota is reached.

A CWS assurance was provided for him under RRA 1953 but this was received too late to allow the US Consul process the case under that Act.

Observations of consular officer, where appropriate:

Collected evidence and notes of the interview to verify the facts of the case. The applicant was interviewed on October 14, 1958, at the American Embassy, Amman, Jordan, November 28, 1958.

Mr. Sirhan is applying, together with his brother, Saidallah Sirhan, (Amman Case No. 194) for consideration as a refugee-escapee. Both he and his brother are holders of a current U.N.R.W.A. ration card No. [redacted]. His parents and all other members of his immediate family are residing in the United States. They were issued visas as Palestinian refugees in 1956, under the provisions of the Refugee Relief Act of 1953, and are anxious to have the remaining members of the family join them in the United States. Mr. Sirhan speaks a fair amount of English.

Mr. Sirhan is a well educated, ambitious young man who can speak enough English to make himself understood. Although he has no proper skill yet he should be able to find some employment in an Office or a Factory with which he could earn his living and become self-supporting.

Elements of hardship:

Applicant lost his home and belongings in Palestine as a result of the Arab/Israeli conflict. In Jordan he was unable to continue his studies and had to leave his school and look for employment in order to earn his living. But owing to lack of work in Jordan he has been unable to find a decent job and could not therefore resettle in a normal life. His desire is to join his parents, sisters and brothers who immigrated to USA in 1956 under the Refugee Relief Act of 1955.

Applicant fled from the New City of Jerusalem, for fear of persecution by the Jews because of race and religion. He cannot return to his home in Israel even if he wanted to and can claim no compensation for what he has lost there.

Although he is not likely to be persecuted in Jordan yet he may not be able to resettle in Jordan and will be dependent of UNRWA's assistance for many years to come.

Mr. Sirhan has had elementary education and can only speak little English. However he is willing to do any job in order to earn his living and become self-supporting.

His parents, brothers and sisters immigrated to USA in 1953 under the Refugee Relief Act of 1953 and are eager to have him join them.

We strongly recommend that this young man be given the chance to join his parents under the present Public Law as otherwise he will have to wait for many, many years before his turn on the Israeli quota is reached.

A CWS assurance was provided for him under RRA 1953 but this was received too late to allow the US Consul process the case under that Act.

His brother, Shareef, is also applying as a refugee-escapee (Amman Case No. 193) and Mr. Sirhan's parents and all other immediate family members, except brother Shareef, are residing in the United States. They immigrated in 1956 as Palestinian refugees. Mr. Sirhan is a housepainter by profession and knows some English.
