Gentlemen:

Going through some old newspapers the other day I came upon a dated issue containing an item re Martin Luther King's assassination, captioned: "Kennedy pulled trigger --Carmichael," and which clipping I enclose herewith.

Why? -- well, I read the article and then an amazing thought flashed across my mind. I thought: Stokely Carmichael speaks of avenging Martin Luther King's assassination (please refer to words in clipping underlined in red), of "retaliating" and of actually naming Robert Kennedy as the one upon whom revenge must be taken.

In view of this, I am wondering if it has come to the attention of the F.B.I. that there could perhaps be a connection between the subsequent assassination of Robert F. Kennedy and this Mr. Stokely Carmichael, using Sirhan Sirhan as their gunman?

Anyway, I thought I'd pass this thought for what it might be worth.

On 8/13/68, source advised the following:

Attorney A. L. WILSON originally contacted Attorney RUSSELL PARSONS and "conned" PARSONS into coming into the case to represent SIRHAN SIRHAN. WILSON told PARSONS that money would be available and indicated that the Arab Countries were going to furnish a blank check for legal expenses for SIRHAN.

PARSONS contacted Attorney GRANT COOPER to come into the case with him, COOPER agreed. Later, COOPER advised PARSONS that COOPER could not be mentioned because he was representing MAURICE FRIEDMAN in the Friars Club trial and FRIEDMAN objected to COOPER's name being announced while representing him. FRIEDMAN reportedly said that no attorney of his was going to announce representing an Arab while defending him.

PARSONS informed source on 8/12/68, that Mrs. COOPER was against her husband representing SIRHAN, and COOPER was trying to get out of the case by contacting and urging Attorney EDWARD BENNET WILLIAMS to join with PARSONS and replace COOPER.

WILSON's promise of unlimited funds has not materialized, and to date, PARSONS has received \$35 from donations as his fee.

JOHN BATTAGLIA has won a motion on a hearing on a 2255 in which the hearing is scheduled for 9/5/68 in U. S. District Court, Los Angeles.

Source also mentioned that he had been contacted by a receiver concerning stolen Jade from a Beverly Hills burglary. The receiver is interested in turning the Jade in for the reward. The receiver claims he does not have the property but can obtain it from the burglar. Source said he would attempt to find out from the receiver the identity of the victim and advise.

Review of the Alachua County Sheriff's Office records on 8/9/68, regarding the arrest of HENRY R. RAMISTELLA, on 12/15/63, by the Gainesville Police Department for the illegal purchase of drugs reflected that RAMISTELLA furnished an address of Route 1 Box 228, Reddick, Florida.

Records further reflected RAMISTELLA was charged with fraud in obtaining narcotics and that on 4/13/64, this matter was placed on the absentee docket.

RAMISTELLA was described as a white male; 5'8"; 125 pounds; eyes, blue; hair, brown; complexion, ruddy; date of birth, 3/25/32; place of birth, Bronx, New York; occupation, laborer.

AT OCALA, FLORIDA

On 8/14/68, Mrs. MARIE HOLLAND, Records Supervisor, Ocala PD, advised their records reflect that one HENRY ALEXANDER RAMISTELLA was arrested by their department on 11/14/63, on charge "violation of good order (drunk)". On 8/14/68, Mrs. GRACE WIGELSWORTH, Records Clerk, Marion County SO, Ocala, Fla., advised she could locate no arrest record identifiable with HENRY R. RAMISTELLA or FRANK DONNARUMMA.

Mrs. WIGELSWORTH notarized a complaint form no. 25132 dated 12/17/63, which the complainant W. H. FINIGAN, a State Bureau of Narcotics agent, had contacted the Sheriff's Office at 12:30 A.M., stating that HENRY RONALD RAMISTELLA, date of birth 3/25/32, 5'8", 125 lbs., blue eyes, brown hair, with long crew cut, wearing gray pants and sweater, had come with him from the Alachua County Jail on that evening to perform some work at the Ocala Stud Farm Number 2. The complainant stated they arrived in Ocala at 9:30 P.M. on 12/16/63 and that he has not seen RAMISTELLA since arriving at the farm. The complaint reflects that RAMISTELLA was then in custody in Gainesville on violation of the Narcotic Law. A warrant will be issued in the A.M. of 12/17/63 charging him with this narcotics violation.

On 8/14/68, JK 247-C (Protect Identity), employed Ocala Stud Farm, advised he could locate no record of employment regarding RAMISTELLA or DONNARUMMA in the files of his office.

He further advised this name is not familiar to him as anyone who has been employed at the Ocala Stud Farm in the past.

On 8/16/68, Mr. JOHN HARTIGAN, Farm Manager, Tartan Farms, Ocala, Fla., advised he could find no record of employment for HENRY RONALD RAMISTELLA in the files of his office. He advised he would attempt to make a further search and notify the FBI should he find any pertinent information.

On 9/5/68, Mr. HARTIGAN was recontacted at which time he viewed photographs of HENRY ALEXANDER RAMISTELLA and advised he believes this individual is identical to one RONNIE W. SCOTT who formerly worked at the Tartan Farms as an Exercise Boy from 9/28/63 through 11/28/63. According to Mr. HARTIGAN, SCOTT gave as his address 67 Sillmore, Providence, Rhode Island. SCOTT's Social Security Number is listed as [REDACTED]

It is noted that RAMISTELLA's Social Security Number is listed as [REDACTED]

According to Mr. HARTIGAN, SCOTT's work was excellent; however, he was released due to the fact that he a narcotics addict. The records reflect that SCOTT was absent from employment on 11/14/63 until 11/21/63.

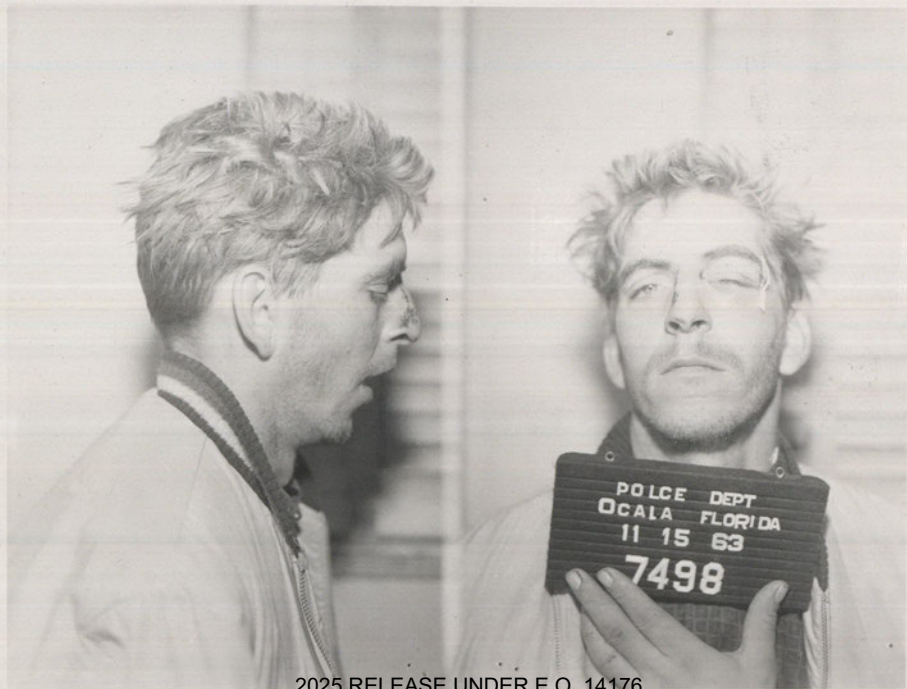
HARTIGAN reiterated that he could locate no employment record whatsoever at Tartan Farms under the name RAMISTELLA or DONNARUMMA.

HARTIGAN described SCOTT as a white male, 5'8", 120 lbs., with heavy beetle-type eyebrows, hair - dark brown and parted. He advised that SCOTT was always neat in his appearance and was an excellent Exercise Boy and rider.

On 9/5/68, Mr. MANNY TORTURA, Farm Manager, Bonnie Heath (Thoroughbred Horse Farm), viewed photograph of HENRY ALEXANDER RAMISTELLA and checked records of his office and advised he could locate no record of employment for this person. He further advised this photograph was not familiar to him.

This pointed out that Mr. HARTIGAN, Mr. TORTURA, and JK 247-C could suggest no one who might know the present whereabouts of RAMISTELLA.

On 8/2/68, SA GEORGE M. KLING contacted Mrs. MARY E. WAITES, 804 1/2 Lucile Avenue, telephone number 663-5553, Los Angeles, California, when at that time Mrs. WAITES stated that she thought she had met Mrs. SIRHAN in Cleveland, Ohio, in October 1954. WAITES stated that she could not be positive that it was Mrs. SIRHAN, but that the photograph she had observed of Mrs. SIRHAN in the Los Angeles newspapers appeared familiar to her. WAITES stated that the lady she met in Cleveland, Ohio, whom she thought was Mrs. SIRHAN, had been at her aunt's home in Cleveland for a few minutes. She stated that she recalled nothing about any conversation that was held on that occasion. WAITES further advised that she had recently been released from the Camarillo Mental Hospital, Camarillo, California, after having suffered a nervous breakdown. She stated that she was still having some mental problems.

WAITES stated she could provide no further information and provided this information in the event it might be of possible assistance to the FBI.
