Approximately ten days subsequent to the activation of the special investigative unit of the LAPD being organized to investigate the assassination of ROBERT F. KENNEDY, ALVIN TOKUNOW contacted the LAPD. TOKUNOW, according to PENA, is a graduate student at University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA), majoring in art. He is working on his Masters degree and the University had assigned to the students in the class the task of covering the various Presidential candidates during their respective campaigns. The Art Department of the University is preparing a film entitled "Making of a President", and instructed the students to obtain photographs and other information regarding the candidates assigned to them.

In that capacity, TOKUNOW, who was assigned to the late ROBERT F. KENNEDY, followed KENNEDY's campaign and various public appearance, including KENNEDY's appearance at the Ambassador Hotel on 6/5/68. TOKUNOW claimed to have

taken moving pictures of the activities at the hotel, which included a photograph of an individual he claimed bore a strong resemblance to SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN. According to TOKUNOW, the moving film also depicts another dark complected male individual and a female individual in the film presumably with the person he claimed resembled SIRHAN.

TOKUNOW made available the film to the LAPD and a copy of the film was reproduced. Examination of the film by LAPD personnel reflects, according to PENA, it is "cheap Japanese film". A detailed examination of the film, which is not clear, failed to reflect a photograph or picture of anyone resembling SIRHAN. It is to be noted that TOKUNOW contacted the LAPD subsequent to extensive news media stories concerning a female in a polka dot dress having been observed at the Embassy Room of the hotel.

Although TOKUNOW made available his film to the LAPD for examination, he was reluctant at first to do so, claiming he had contacted an attorney. However, subsequently he did make the film available and later was contacted by or he himself contacted a Canadian writer by the name of Mr. CHARACK.

Upon examining the film, Sergeant VARNEY of the LAPD advised TOKUNOW that the film was of no value in their investigation.

Sometime in early August 1968, TOKUNOW again contacted the LAPD to advise that the film in question had been removed from his locker on the UCLA campus. He stated there was no evidence of forcible entry to the locker and expressed the opinion someone was able to pick the lock, which was a simple padlock. He was advised to make a police report of the alleged theft.

TOKUNOW further claimed to have a copy of the original film in his possession which he subsequently took to the "Los Angeles Times" newspaper in Los Angeles, apparently seeking publicity and the "Los Angeles Times"

reporter, ~~JERRY COHEN~~, who is personally acquainted with Lieutenant PENA, contacted PENA. PENA advised COHEN that the film was of no value to the investigation. Personnel, "Los Angeles Times", likewise unable to locate anyone appearing in the film who resembled SIRHAN. After talking with PENA, COHEN refused to write a story involving TOKUNOW. TOKUNOW then apparently contacted a representative of the "Evening Outlook" newspaper in Santa Monica which resulted in the newspaper article which is enclosed.

Lieutenant PENA explained the LAPD will undertake no further investigation regarding this phase of activities.

On 9/12/68, "PETE" PETERSEN, Executive Assistant, in charge of the Nixon for President Los Angeles Campaign Headquarters, 3257 Wilshire Boulevard, telephone 482-4500, advised as follows:

Sometime between eleven and twelve noon, an individual contacted him at the above address and identified himself as a WILLIAM T. HAAG. The individual exhibited a dirty and worn business card bearing his name and the title "Inventor of Automatic Dish and Plate Dispensing System". The card also contained an address of 734 Silver Lake Boulevard, Los Angeles 26, California, telephone 387-8552.

The individual spoke with a slight foreign accent, origin not known, and requested that he discuss a matter with Presidential candidate RICHARD NIXON. The individual said that he was associated with the activity that took place during the night that KENNEDY was assassinated at the Ambassador Hotel. He said that this information was of a confidential nature involving SIRHAN SIRHAN and he wanted to pass it on to Mr. NIXON.

Mr. PETERSEN said that he requested the individual to furnish the information to the New York Office of Mr. NIXON and told him to send it in care of the personal secretary of Mr. NIXON, ROSEMARY WOODS, 450 Park Avenue, New York. Mr. PETERSEN asked the individual if he had reported this information to the authorities and the individual said no.

**ASSASSINATION OF UNITED STATES

At approximately 12:15 A.M., June 5, 1968, Sirhan Bishara Sirhan, born [REDACTED], at Jerusalem, was observed in the kitchen area of the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles, California, to shoot and kill U. S. Senator Robert F. Kennedy and to wound five other persons, using a .22 caliber revolver.

Sirhan Bishara Sirhan was taken into custody by the Los Angeles Police Department and was indicted by the Grand Jury of Los Angeles County for murder on June 7, 1968, and is presently awaiting trial. A photograph of Sirhan is attached.

On June 4, 1968, the primary elections for the State of California were held to indicate a preferential selection of candidates for the forthcoming national elections in November 1968. Senator Kennedy was one of several candidates for the office of the President of the United States representing the Democratic Party and was given a majority of votes, following which he addressed members of his campaign group and well-wishers in the Embassy Ballroom of the Ambassador Hotel. Following his speech, he departed the ballroom via the rear exit of the stage and turned to his right to pass through the kitchen area en route to the Colonial Room, where he was to meet members of the press. The shooting occurred between these two points. A diagram of the area is attached.

The Los Angeles Police Department has requested assistance in the location and interview of various persons who were guests at the Ambassador Hotel on June 4, 5, 1968, to determine if they are in possession of any information regarding the assassination of Senator Kennedy or knowledge of Sirhan Bishara Sirhan.
