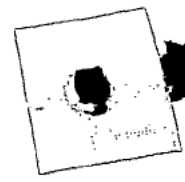

regarding ROBERT ALLEN COUCH are not available without a  
medical release signed by Mr. COUCH. Mr. COUCH was referred  
to the Bureau of Social Services for Nassau County, County  
Seat Drive, Mineola, NY, by the staff at Northeast Nassau  
Psychiatric Hospital, Kings Park, NY.

According to Mrs. SHIRLEY LEVY, Housing Division  
Supervisor, Nassau Department of Social Services, Mr. COUCH  
was referred on 2/13/76, to Mr. STANLEY AUGUSEWICZ, 108 Shields  
Ave., Williston Park, NY, for temporary housing.

On 3/2/76, Mr. AUGUSEWICZ was contacted and advised  
that on date not recalled, he received a telephonic contact  
from an individual who introduced himself as ROBERT COUCH,  
indicating a referral for temporary housing from the Nassau  
County Bureau of Social Services. Mr. AUGUSEWICZ furnished

however, Mr. COUCH never arrived.

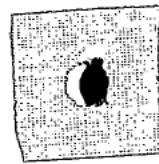
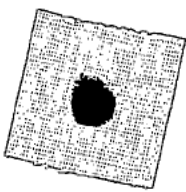

DANIEL T. ESTRADA

On July 6, 1976, Daniel T. Estrada, 1352 Volney Drive, Los Angeles, California, Telephone Number 261-7612, called this office from the East Los Angeles Municipal Court where he was appearing on a narcotics and burglary charge.

Estrada advised that he had information on the Robert Kennedy murder and that the source of his information was Sirhan Sirhan who was in an adjacent cell to him when he was in San Quentin.

Estrada stated that he would provide information in exchange for whatever the Federal Bureau of Investigation could do to help him with the local authorities. Estrada was advised that the Federal Bureau of Investigation would not and could not make any deal with him.

Further Estrada stated that Sirhan had already had a Ronald Wood murdered in the Nevada State Penitentiary because he was talking to Federal agents about the same information.

In connection with another investigation conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, it was learned that Sirhan Sirhan had determined that Ronald Wood, who was incarcerated at San Quentin Penitentiary at the same time as

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Sirhan was going to write an article about Sirhan that would be a complete fabrication and Sirhan was fearful that it would effect his parole status. Sirhan had another inmate at San Quentin Penitentiary write up an affidavit to the effect that Sirhan had never confided in or furnished information to Wood and that Wood intended to fictionalize the information for an alleged magazine article.

Information was received from the Las Vegas Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that Ronald Wood was received at the Nevada State Penitentiary on March 30, 1973, from San Quentin Penitentiary as a protective custody prisoner and was found dead in his cell on September 21, 1974. Wood had been bludgeoned to death and his murder has not been solved to date. Two theories were advanced in connection with this murder, one that he was an informant and another that he was a known drug salesman in prison and that he had sold drugs that were substandard and had refused a refund on these drugs.

No further inquiry or investigation is being conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation on the information furnished by Daniel T. Estrada.

The ENQUIRER has obtained copies of FBI reports relating to the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, released recently under the Freedom of Information Act.

*DeLoach*

A report dated 6/9/68 by Amedee O. Richards, Jr. of the FBI's Los Angeles office contains photographs and captions compiled by an FBI agent and photographer who visited the pantry scene of RFK's shooting at the Ambassador Hotel.

According to the report, two of the photographs (captions E1 and E3 on page 48) show a total of four bullet holes in the doorway area and center door frame -- in addition to two reported bullet marks in a missing panel and a door hinge (photo captions E1 and E4).

In their investigation, the Los Angeles Police Department accounted for all eight bullets fired from the gun of Sirhan Sirhan -- two in Senator Kennedy, five in the other victims, and one lost in a ceiling space.

The bullet hole photographed by the FBI at the scene of the assassination would therefore be in excess of the number that could have been fired from Sirhan Sirhan's gun.

Dear Mr. Cooke:

In response to your letter of June 10, 1976, the photographs in the report to which you refer were made on June 7, 1968, by an FBI photographer with the aid of a Special Agent. These photographs depicted the entire area where Senator Robert F. Kennedy had been before the shooting and the route he took through the kitchen to the point where he was assassinated. These photographs, with the accompanying charts, were made to provide a photographic record of the crime scene for future reference.

Page 46 of the FBI report to which you made reference is a log of all photographs taken as a part of the crime-scene record. The use of the term "bullet hole" in the photographic log was for the convenience of the photographic team in recording information as reported to them. The photographs and log were never purported to be a ballistics report and, of course, the photographs could not be considered as evidence of the existence of bullet holes as you suggested.

The FBI conducted no ballistics examination in this case. All such leads were conducted by the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD). The results of the FBI's investigation into the assassination of Senator Robert F. Kennedy were furnished to the Office of the District Attorney in Los Angeles and to the LAPD as they were compiled. This information consisted of numerous investigative reports, including the report of Special Agent Amedee O. Richards, Jr., dated June 9, 1968, to which you referred in your letter. The FBI reports the results of investigation conducted and does not draw conclusions.

For your information, a firearms expert from the FBI Laboratory was a member of a special seven-man panel of firearms experts called by Los Angeles Superior Court Judge Robert A. Wenke in September, 1975, to study the firearms evidence from the Robert F. Kennedy assassination. The panel members, working independently, examined all of the firearms evidence available in this investigation and unanimously concluded that there was no substantive evidence to support the so-called "second gun" theory.

KRANZ is a Special Counsel appointed by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors to investigate the murder of Senator KENNEDY.

According to this article, Special Counsel KRANZ has found no evidence or possibility of evidence of any cover-up by law enforcement agencies to protect their reputation or preserve their original conviction.

According to this article, the report of the findings by KRANZ was to be released on Tuesday, 4/5/77.

KRANZ was appointed as a Special Counsel in this matter by the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors on 8/12/75, to investigate independently the assassination of Senator ROBERT KENNEDY.

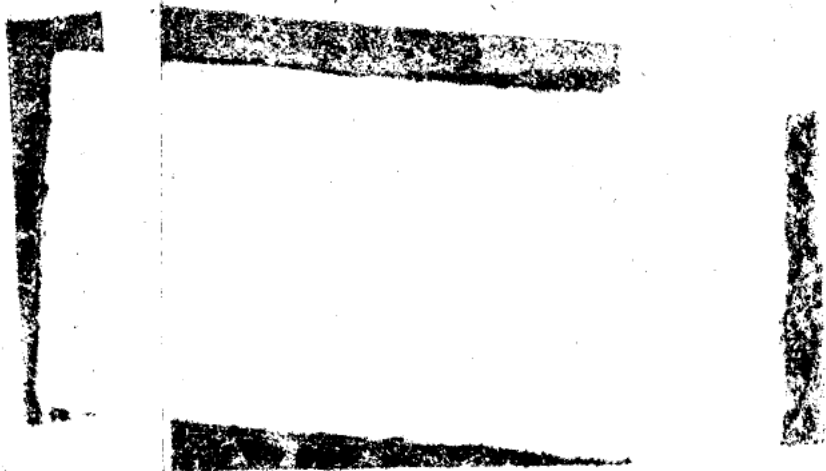

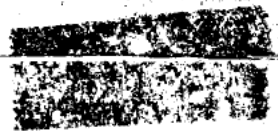
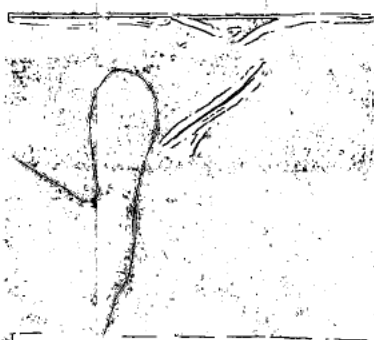

ON OR ABOUT JUNE 5-6, 1968 I, WILLIAM A. BAILEY, employed at that time as a SPECIAL AGENT of the FBI (Assigned to the Los Angeles office) was present in the preparation room of the Ambassador Hotel. Approx. 4-6 hours after the attempt on Sen. Robt. F. Kennedy's life. The PANTRY was referred to as the preparation room.

At that time I was assigned to interview witnesses present at the time of the shooting. I was also charged with the responsibility of recreating the circumstances under which same took place. This necessitated a careful examination of the entire room + its contents.

At one point during these observations I (and several other agents) noted at least two (2) small caliber bullet holes in the center part of the two doors leading from the preparation room. There was no question in any of our minds as to the fact that they were bullet holes + were not caused by fire cracker or other equipment in the preparation room.

I resigned from the FBI in Jan, 1971 and have been employed as an Assistant Professor of Police Science at Gloucester County College, Sewell, New Jersey since that time.

The above statement is in my printing + was furnished freely + voluntarily to Mr. Vincent Bugliosi on Nov. 14, 1976 at Glassboro State College, Glassboro, New Jersey.

JAMES MARTIN, Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) Investigations, Phoenix, Arizona, telephonically advised Phoenix FBI on 8/30/77 that an individual by the name of BOYD JHORAN, aka BOYD JORDAN, is currently under investigation by INS to determine his citizenship status. MARTIN stated that INS has received information through the Phoenix Police Department, Organized Crime Unit, to the effect that JHORAN has made statements that he was present with SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN at the scene of captioned matter and knows that "SIRHAN was not the only gunman involved in the shooting of ROBERT F. KENNEDY."
