



THEY DID NOT ARRIVE IN VENETIAN ROOM OF AMBASSADOR HOTEL, LOS ANGELES, UNTIL AFTER ELEVEN THIRTY P.M., JUNE FOUR, LAST, FOR RAFFERTY'S VICTORY CELEBRATION. NEITHER HAD PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE OF SIRHAN'S POSSIBLE PRESENCE IN VENETIAN ROOM THAT EVENING, HOWEVER, FITZPATRICK SAID HIS WIFE CLAIMED HAVING EARLIER SEEN SIRHAN THERE. THEY KNEW OF NO SECURITY GUARDS IN VENETIAN ROOM OR OF RESTRICTED INVITATIONAL ENTRY. SUCH ARRANGEMENTS, IF ANY, WOULD HAVE BEEN HANDLED BY RAFFERTY'S CAMPAIGN HEADQUARTERS IN LOS ANGELES. Enclosed for Sacramento is one copy of a pamphlet entitled "The Grapes", written by GARY ALLEN.

For the information of the Bureau and Sacramento, referenced San Francisco airtel contained the following information:

On 6/20/68, DIETER W. BAYER, 1332 Grand Avenue, Pacifica, California, home telephone 355-0251, appeared at this office with the enclosed reprint and said that he believed SIRHAN B. SIRHAN appears in the photo on Page 4.

BAYER said he has been trying to contact GARY ALLEN in Los Angeles through the John Birch Society and has been unable to do so to date. He hoped that ALLEN would be able to reveal the source of the picture as the article doesnot show this.

BAYER further indicated that he is an amateur photog-rapher and he enlarged this picture and is satisfied in his own mind that it is identical to SIRHAN. BAYER said that he obtained the reprint from a public source, stating that he is collecting articles on communism in this country. He is an escapee from East Germany and has been in this country since 1961.

On 6/18/68, REX NEVINS, Reporter for the Riverside Press-Enterprise, Indio, California, advised that REX WESTERFIELD, Public Relations Director for Western Division, John Birch Society, held a press conference in Indio that afternoon concerning CAESAR CHAVEZ, Director of United Farm Workers Organizing Committee, AFL-CIO, who is in Indio Area attempting to organize grape workers. WESTERFIELD identified various persons connected with CHAVEZ movement as communists or communist sympathizers. He distributed an article entitled "The Grapes", concerning the Delano Grape Strike, which appeared in the June, 1966, issue of "American Opinion", Page 4. There is a picture in this article of over twenty persons, among whom was SAM KUSHNER, whom WESTERFIELD identified as communist. At press conference, WESTERFIELD pointed to young man in photograph, who was wearing light colored sweater, and commented that "The FBI was investigating this man as SIRHAN SIRHAN." NEVINS compared a newspaper photograph of SIRHAN with picture of man in light colored sweater and said there was close resemblance.

KUSHNER is a member of the Southern California District Communist Party and was active in covering Delano Grape Strike for Daily People's World.

Information received from Rampart Detective Division, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), that on 6/8/68, KENNETH GIEG, Route 2, Box 427, Bakersfield, advised LAPD as follows:

GIEG is a horse owner and on Friday, May 31, was at the Club House at Hollywood Park with his brother. While there, they were standing next to a young male (later identified as SIRHAN SIRHAN). During the course of the afternoon they talked back and forth about horses. From suspect's conversation, they determined suspect had worked around horses but he denied this saying he did nothing for a living. Suspect claimed he spent a lot of time at the track, but as a horse player. The only extra conversation concerned the Jews and their ability to be around money. The suspect was alone and talked about nothing of importance.

Reference is made to our communication of June 6, 1968, concerning Mrs. Nadia J. Morales, 915 15th Street, Apartment B, Modesto, California.

Anna Campbell, Personnel Director, Good Samaritan Hospital, Los Angeles, California, advised on June 11, 1968, that Nadia J. Morales formerly employed as helper in hospital's dietary foods Section. Campbell advised hospital records reflect Morales to have been very unsatisfactory employee who was unable to perform even relatively uncomplicated work.

Hospital records failed to reflect any doctor on the Good Samaritan Hospital staff named Cohan Hoseld, Cohan Russell, or any similar name. Also, hospital records failed to reflect any employee named Vincente who works in the hospital bakery.

Dorothy McDaniel, Chief Dietitian, Good Samaritan Hospital, advised that Nadia J. Morales was poor employee and would have been terminated had she not resigned on April 1, 1968. Morales was incompetent in her work and unable to get along with fellow employees. McDaniel advised that in her opinion Morales was an emotionally maladjusted person.

Joyce Freeman, Dietitian, Good Samaritan Hospital, advised that Nadia J. Morales worked under her direct supervision. Morales was grossly incompetent and unable to perform simple work in an acceptable manner. Morales felt that the other kitchen help did not care for her as she was of Arab extraction and most of the other kitchen help was of Spanish descent. Freeman advised that Morales was such an incompetent employee that other employees did resent Morales to a degree. Miss Freeman is of the opinion that Morales may have an emotional problem.

Dorothy McDaniel made available a letter from Mrs. Morales postmarked May 29, 1968, at Modesto, California, wherein Morales writes that, "The old man that wears glasses he works in the bakery" had made her baby [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Morales wrote that the unnamed person's wife was hitting the child and making the child perform such acts.

Severino Navarro, Baker, Good Samaritan Hospital, is described as an elderly man who wears glasses. Navarro advised that his wife does baby-sit at times but that he does not recall knowing Morales. He stated that he is quite certain that his wife never baby-sat for any one named Morales.

6/29/68, SA WM. ANDREWS, Los Angeles telephonically advised that Det. LYLE SANDLIN Los Angeles Police Department is assigned to the Special Unit investigating the KENSALT case, and had planned to interview OWEN, at Palo Alto, but had decided against the interview at this time and planned to wait until OWEN returned to SANTA ANA.

ANDREWS advised that they have learned that OWENS has hired an attorney, ~~MEM~~ GEORGE DAVIS, to represent him, for what reason is unknown, but OWENS will be interviewed by the press in the near future at which time OWENS will have a sack over his head so he can not be identified, due to the threats allegedly made against him.

ANDREWS advised that no such threats are known by the LA office or the Los Angeles PD. He noted the PD considers OWENS to be somewhat "unstable".

ANDREWS said as yet OWENS has not been interviewed by the FBI, BUT WILL PROBABLY be interviewed when he returns to his home.

On 6/10/68 SOCS - 8-C advised that he had learned that MRS. MARY SMITH, who takes new subscriptions for telephone service at the Pacific Telephone Company, 14 and K Streets, Sacramento recalled taking a request for one SIRHAM BISHARA SIRHAM, from one named IRVINE STROLL (ph).

On 6/10/68 MARY SMITH, 7321 Idlewild, Sacramento, California, advised that sometime during the latter part of May 1968 she had accepted a new service order in the name of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN from one IRVIN STROLL (ph), whom she described as follows:

Sex: Male
Race: Negro
Age: Mid twenties
Hair: Black, short and curly
Height: 5'5"
Build: Medium
Weight: 150
Wearing: bright green blouse shirt, chain pendant brownish in color, dark trousers, dark shoes.
Marks or scars: None visible

She stated that this individual advised that he was making the request for a friend (SIRHAN) who was in Los Angeles and that he would be residing with friends named EVELYN and JOE. He advised that he would not be at the address (which she could not recall) as he had to return to Los Angeles.

MRS. SMITH claimed that MARY THERESA JONES, a cashier in the office would recall this individual, as she had sent him to her to place the deposit.

MRS. MARY THERESA JONES, 2557 33rd. Street, Sacramento, California advised that she recalled accepting a cash deposit from an individual answering the above description, but that this to her recollection had occurred on June 5, 1968 in the afternoon. She was certain of the date inasmuch as it had been such a slow afternoon. She could not recall the name, however, noting that she merely accepted the money.

MRS. JONES stated that she had not considered the above until hearing the name of the person who killed Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY and recalling the above order.

She advised that on the afternoon of June 5, 1968 she attempted to locate in the files, the order placed by this individual, but could not. She then dismissed the whole thing until the following Saturday when she read the name of JESUS PEREZ as one of the persons who was wounded in the fusillade of shots in the hallway where the Senator was killed. She remembered that a person with the same name had come in about fifteen minutes later and had requested telephone ~~xxx~~ service. She added that her recollection of the PEREZ whom she waited on did not resemble the picture of the PEREZ appearing in the Sacramento Union of 6/8/68. However, due to the circumstances she decided to inform her supervisor MR. TERROL J. WILSON, Manager of the Commercial Department.

MR. TERROL J. WILSON advised that as a result of the above he had requested an exhaustive search to be made of the records of new and old service in the names of SIRHAN SIRHAN, IRVIN STROLL, IRVIN STROHL, and JESUS PEREZ.

MRS. SMITH SUBSEQUENTLY ADVISED that on the day Senator KENNEDY, she first heard the news at 6:00 AM and was greatly shocked. At no time during the day, subsequent to her arrival at work, between 8:00 AM and 8:15 AM did she hear anything further in the news until that evening. She noted that at no time did she leave the building during the day, that there are no radios or television sets in the space where she was during the day, and she did not discuss the above with anyone at all during the day. However, she claimed she started searching for the names SIRHAN and STROLL (ph) that same afternoon, 6/5/68. (It should be noted that the name of SIRHAN was not in the news until later on in the day, subsequent to 8:15 am).

MR. WILSON on 6/18/68 advised that after an exhaustive search of every possible record, v.g. published and unpublished numbers, requests for new service, chronologically searched 5/24/68 and 6/5/68, as well as all deposits made between those dates, no record could be located for any of the above names. He did note that on 5/31/68 one JESUS CHAVEZ made a request for telephone service and that MRS. SMITH feels that this is the person whom she took for JESUS PEREZ.

MRS. WILSON also advised that MRS. SMITH now feels that she is being followed by two negroes in a blue car, and that this would tie in with her impression that the SIRHAN is Muslim, that the negro who placed had the appearance of being a Muslim and that all this may tie in. Mr. WILSON advised that in view of this, plus the fact that no record could be located of any requests for telephone under any of the names suggested by MRS. SMITH he wondered if MRS. SMITH may not be emotionally overcome in this matter. It should also be noted that MRS. SMITH claimed to be searching the records for telephone service in the name of SIRHAN during a period of time she admits she had not yet heard the name.

In view of the above no further action is recommended.

GIEG, he took up a conversation with a man he now believes to be identical to SIRHAN SIRHAN. He stated he did not know it was SIRHAN until he viewed recent photographs of SIRHAN in newspapers and on television. SIRHAN appeared well educated, spoke intelligently with good English and had only a slight trace of an accent. He stated during the early part of the races SIRHAN's only conversation was about the various horses and matters generally pertaining to racing. He said that later, during possibly the fifth or sixth race, a man's name which appeared to be Jewish appeared on the card and SIRHAN stated he was "an Arab" and began degrading the Jews. He advised SIRHAN was standing with him and his brother from about the third race until they left at the end of the eighth race for a total time span of about one and a half to two hours.

He stated that during that time he did not observe anyone in the area who appeared to know SIRHAN and SIRHAN talked to no one but them.

He said SIRHAN did not "flash around" a lot of money nor act like he had a lot of money. He added he did not observe a billfold but rather noted he took his bills from a small roll. He was of the opinion that this man he believes to be SIRHAN was the type of person who spent a lot of time around racetracks and based his opinion on the fact he observed this man to be knowledgeable about horses and races and interested in the same.

Mrs HEIDI BUSSE HANF, 1225 East Eighth Street, Davis, California, furnished the following information:

Mrs. HANF stated that on Thursday, May 16, 1968, she was standing in a hallway behind the stage at Fireborn Hall, University of California, Davis, California, prior to the arrival of Senator ROBERT F. KEENE, who was to speak to students and faculty on that date. She stated that approximately 3:10 p.m., while back stage she noticed an individual whom she described as Middle Eastern in appearance, dark curly hair, 5 feet 4 inches, slim build in his early 20s, wearing a checked blue and white sport shirt, open at the collar, and dark jeans. She stated that she was only a few feet away from this individual and that he appeared to be smiling as if somewhat uneasy. She added he had the features, which gave him a sensitive face.

She added that this individual had been present when she first went back stage at 3:10 p.m., and does not know how long he had been there. She stated she observed Professor JAMES McEWY, III talking to a policeman and noted shortly thereafter that this individual was gone. She had never seen this individual before, nor has she seen him since. She stated that she has seen newspaper photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, the accused assassin of Senator ROBERT F. KEENE, and that while there is a definite resemblance between this individual and SIRHAN, she did not believe they were identical.

She was present in the hallway behind the stage at Freeborn Hall, University of California, Davis, California, on May 16, 1968, during the afternoon Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was to speak there.

Sometime before the Senator's arrival, approximately 3:30 p.m., she observed a young man standing in the hallway, and he is described as follows:

She stated that she observed this individual from about seven feet away and had the impression she had seen him before, possibly on campus. She added he smiled at her like he knew her.

She noted that this individual had some features similar to those of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN, such as the hair, and complexion. However, upon viewing photographs of SIRHAN two taken at the scene of the shooting of Senator KENNEDY, as SIRHAN was being led away, one photograph taken by the Los Angeles Police Department, and the copy of SIRHAN's photograph appearing on his California drivers license, she stated that this definitely is not the same individual she observed in the hallway at Fræborn Hall.

On Saturday, June 1, 1968, she attended a gala event which took place at the auditorium, Civic Center, San Francisco, California, where Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY was to appear. She was accompanied by RONALD JONES, Holiday Gardens, Apartment 15A, Vallejo, California. During the gala she was seated in Section 5, Row S, Seat 8. Seated next to her was a young man who was with a female companion. During the time the Senator spoke they booed him and refused to stand up to pledge allegiance to the flag. She stated she has seen numerous photographs of SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN and that this definitely is not the same man.

She described him as follows:

Mrs. LOUISE FITZPATRICK, 4345 Rio Tinto Avenue, advised that she is the wife of BARNEY FITZPATRICK, who is a Special Assistant to Dr. MAX RAFFERTY of the California Department of Education, and that she attended a party and victory celebration for Doctor RAFFERTY in the Venetian Room of The Ambassador Hotel in Los Angeles on the night of June 4-5, 1968.

She recalled that at approximately midnight, Doctor RAFFERTY appeared before television cameras in the Venetian Room to deliver a victory speech following his apparent winning of the election.

Approximately ten minutes prior to this time, she observed a person in the middle of the Venetian Room whom she believed resembled SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN. This person was wearing light-colored trousers and a blue, lightweight nylon jacket, zipped up the front. She did not know any other person who noticed this individual or if he was accompanied by anyone else, and she did not see him again. She stated she only had a fleeting glance at this person but remembered him because he appeared to be a Mexican or similar minority racial group member. She said he appeared to be tired and thought at the time that he was one of several young people who had been working as stagehands and helpers in the Venetian Room.

Doctor MAX RAFFERTY, Superintendent of Public Instruction and Director of Education, California State Department of Education, 721 Capitol Mall, advised that during the evening of June 4, 1968, he remained in a private room at The Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles.

During this period he was viewing television election returns with close friends and political supporters concerning his candidacy for the Republican nomination to a seat in the United States Congress.

Shortly after 11:30 p.m. it became apparent that he had won the election so he and his group went to the Venetian Room of The Ambassador Hotel, where his main victory celebration was in progress, attended by 300 to 400 persons.

Doctor RAFFERTY said that at about midnight he began addressing the group in the Venetian Room but was interrupted with the news that Senator ROBERT F. KENNEDY had been shot. He was immediately escorted to another room in the hotel where he remained for the rest of the night under protection of the Los Angeles Police Department.

Doctor RAFFERTY related that he had no personal knowledge of the possible presence of KENNEDY murder suspect SIRHAN BISHARA SIRHAN in the Venetian Room on the

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night of June 4-5, 1968. He added, however, that it was his understanding that the wife of his Special Assistant, BARNEY FITZPATRICK, had claimed to have seen SIRHAN there.

Doctor RAFFERTY noted that the June 21, 1968, issue of "Life Magazine" carried allegations that SIRHAN had been thrown out of the Venetian Room and had been refused a drink by a bar hostess there but that no such information had come to his attention from any source who attended the party.

Doctor RAFFERTY said that he did not know if any security guards were present in the Venetian Room or if invitations had been required to gain entry there; however, this information would be readily available at his campaign headquarters in Los Angeles.
