Dear Mr. Delery:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open George W. Bush Presidential records in response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests listed in Attachment A.

These records, consisting of 83,133 pages, 22,605 assets and 6 video clips, have been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 23,196 pages and 4,971 assets restricted in whole and 2,921 pages and 3,698 assets restricted in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 57,016 pages, 13,936 assets, and 6 video clips in whole and 2,921 pages and 3,698 assets in part. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President George W. Bush's representative, Freddy Ford, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is August 17, 2023, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

Bush Presidential electronic records proposed for opening are correspondence regarding vandalism by the previous administration, failed email deliveries from outgoing staff, emails from the public, articles and newsletters concerning the Florida recount, and articles discussing the handling of 9/11 by a hypothetical Gore Administration. Emails that mention Al Gore but that are not specifically about him include policy papers, speech drafts, polls, legislative hearing transcripts, press briefing transcripts, political reports, RNC newsletters, miscellaneous articles and unsolicited resumes. All personally identifiable information in these records has been withheld. These materials are from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS) and RNC Personal Storage Table (PST) Search and Access Sets.

Final iterations of presidential speeches and remarks are included as well. Additionally, this FOIA includes presidential directives and drafts thereof, credentials for newly appointed ambassadors, a white paper entitled U.S. Foreign Aid: Meeting the Challenges of the Twenty-First Century, and a letter from Daniel Pearl's wife to President George W. Bush and the accompanying response. One will find routine head of state correspondence including thank-you letters for gifts received by President George W. Bush and for routine White House visits or trips abroad, as well as correspondence from Prime Minister Shaukat Aziz of Pakistan, Prime Minister Chaudhry Shujaat Hussain of Pakistan, Chancellor Gerhard Schroder of Germany, and President Hosni Mubarak of Egypt. In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to you, as former President George W. Bush's representative, of our intent to open George W. Bush Presidential records. These records were processed under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests described in Attachment A.

These records, consisting of 83,133 pages, 22,605 assets and 6 video clips, have been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 23,196 pages and 4,971 assets restricted in whole and 2,921 pages and 3,698 assets restricted in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 57,016 pages, 13,936 assets, and 6 video clips in whole and 2,921 pages and 3,698 assets in part. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing the incumbent President of our intent to release these George W. Bush Presidential records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is August 17, 2023, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.
