1. (Internal Use Only - LLM) Met with Congressman John O. Marsh (D., Va.) in the Capitol regarding his letter to Mr. Helms concerning the upcoming Tenth Anniversary of the Hungarian Revolt. Mr. Marsh indicated that he would not expect a written reply to his letter from Mr. Helms; that he had sent the letter to some 25 different addressees; and he, Marsh, will be mounting a campaign in Congress, which will receive support from both sides of the aisle, to use the Tenth Anniversary to throw light on this "Achilles Heel". Mr. Marsh was very pleased that we had taken the time to drop by and see him on this, and I said I would extend his thanks to Mr. Helms for him.

2. (Internal Use Only - LLM) Met with Miss McFerran, case worker in the office of Senator Javits, concerning the Frederick Colgan matter. Miss McFerran is completely satisfied with our handling of the case which she will consider closed out in their office, at least for the time being, upon the receipt of the copy of our letter to Mrs. Colgan, which I said we would be pleased to forward to her. As soon as I left Senator Javits' office, I arranged for a call for Mr. Emmons Brown of the IG Staff so that the letter to Mrs. Colgan could be released. (See Memorandum For the Record.)

3. (Internal Use Only - LLM) Met with Mr. John A. Jackson, Executive Secretary to Senator Saltonstall, concerning his earlier inquiry to Mr. Warner on the Amelia Earhart matter. I told Mr. Jackson that there was absolutely no connection between Miss Earhart and intelligence, and he said that this confirmed what he had heard from other sources. I further indicated that while we have no information on the subject, it is our understanding that the Department of State may have some information which may or may not be usefully; and Mr. Jackson said he would check with the Department.
