

H.J.Res. 412 authorizes and requests the President to proclaim "Amelia Earhart Day" on May 20, 1982, fifty years after she became the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean. She accomplished that feat on May 20-21, 1932, between Harbour Grace, Newfoundland, and Ireland.

Ms. Earhart was also, in 1928, the first woman passenger to cross the Atlantic. In 1935, she became the first person to fly solo from Hawaii to the U.S. mainland, a longer distance than from the United States to Europe. She also set numerous speed and altitude records in various airplanes and autogiros, forerunners of the helicopter. She became the first woman in American history to be awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

In June 1937, she attempted the first round-the-world flight near the equator. After completing more than two-thirds of the distance, her plane vanished after taking off from New Guinea for Howland Island in the South Pacific.

AMELIA EARHART DAY

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

A PROCLAMATION

On May 20, 1932, Amelia Earhart set out from Harbour Grace, Newfoundland, to conquer the airwaves across the Atlantic Ocean. Fifteen^a hours later, she landed safely in Ireland to become the first woman to pilot an airplane across the Atlantic.

In 1935, she became the first person to fly solo from Hawaii to the United States mainland, covering an even greater distance than on the Atlantic flight. That same year, she made the first nonstop flight from Mexico to New York.

Pioneer aviatrix, adventurer, journalist, and ~~educator~~ nurse,
^{Amelia} Miss Earhart captured the hearts of the American people with her daring exploits. She encouraged the development of commercial aviation, then a fledgling industry, and paved the way for women to enter the field of aviation. She set ^{many} numerous speed and altitude records in various airplanes and autogiros, the forerunner to the helicopter, and was the first woman to be awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

In June 1937, Amelia Earhart attempted the first round-the-world flight near the equator with her co-pilot, Frederick J. Noonan, in a twin-engined Lockheed Electra. On July 2, during the ^{their} pair's flight from New Guinea to Howland Island in the Central Pacific, troubled~~ly~~ developed ~~some~~ aboard the

aircraft. Radio contact was lost, and no trace of either the plane or its crew was ever found. *(Amelia Earhart)*





Joint Resolution

To authorize and request the President to designate May 20, 1982, as "Amelia Earhart Day".

Whereas Amelia Earhart was the first woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean as a passenger;

Whereas Amelia Earhart set a number of altitude and speed records in various airplanes and autogiros, forerunners of the helicopter;

Whereas Amelia Earhart was widely hailed as an aviator and an inspiring example to all;

Whereas Amelia Earhart worked for the promotion of sound aeronautics and was a strong influence in breaking down resistance to aviation;

Whereas Amelia Earhart was the first woman in American history to be awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross;

Whereas Amelia Earhart was the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean on May 20-21, 1932: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the President is authorized and requested to designate May 20, 1982, as "Amelia Earhart Day", as a tribute to that most daring of the pioneer women aviators, and to call upon Federal, State, and local government agencies and the people of the United States to observe such day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.
