This is Joe Marks from Politico. I believe Meg Phillips passed this email along earlier. I'm following up on the email NARA sent State seeking assurances that information contained in Sec. Clinton's server would be turned over to NARA. State told me earlier that they would respond by the Friday deadline but would leave it to NARA to release the email. <http://images.politico.com/global/2015/03/18/narastateltrhrcemails.pdf>

I'm hoping, first, that I can get a copy of the response letter from you when it comes out.

Second, I'm wondering if NARA has any intention of requesting that the server be put in government custody. A former records official told me about a process identified by the Supreme Court in the Kissinger case whereby the Archivist of the US can request that the Attorney General take measures under the Federal Records Act to obtain records – or in this case, the server. Has there been any discussion of this?
