These proposed permanent F&FP records are filed by subject, an estimated thirteen cubic feet of these records are on hand, and an estimated one cubic foot is accumulated annually. The proposed eight year disposition for Rules 19 and 20 records at other Air Staff offices and major commands was based on the relation of F&FP records in structure and content to the DOD FYDP. The indefinite disposition for Rule 21 records at subordinate commands below major command level was based on the fact that these lower commands have limited need for these F&FP records, but need some flexibility in keeping them.		•
