Most of these records represent single arrests for non-serious offenses. Positive activity within these records is at an identification rate of approximately 0.07%. Inasmuch as these records are not automated and have a low activity rate, searching is a time consuming and labor intensive effort which significantly increases the length of the FBI response time to the law enforcement and civil community.</p>

Manual Records</p> <p>(a) Criminal Fingerprint Cards/Records</p> <p>Single arrest fingerprint cards, and corresponding manual or automated indices generated in connection with the single arrest or incarceration of individuals.</p> <p>DESTROY all fingerprint cards, manual record information, and corresponding indices when records indicate that individual was born prior to 1/1/29.</p> <p>2. Automated Records</p> <p>These records have not been entered into the current or any previous CJIS Division automated fingerprint system. Since these fingerprint records have not been converted to electronic images, the FBI will not be able to search electronic fingerprint submissions against these manual records in the Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System (IAFIS) which is currently under development and scheduled to become operational in 1999. With the low activity rate (0.07%), conversion is deemed to be un-necessary and not cost effective.</p>
