GENERAL AGENCY MISSION

UNICOR is the legal trade name for the Federal Prison Industries (FPI), a wholly-owned, Government corporation established by Congress on June 23, 1934. Its mission is to employ and provide job skills training to the greatest practicable number of inmates confined within the Federal Bureau of Prisons; contribute to the safety and security of our Nation's Federal correctional facilities by keeping inmates constructively occupied; produce market-priced quality goods and services for sale to the Federal Government; operate in a self-sustaining manner, and minimize FPI's impact on private business and labor

UNICOR'S Intranet:

UNICOR's Intranet was built to share information within the organization more efficiently. In 1996, the intranet was introduced and started being developed, and by 1998, it was fully functioning. UNICOR's intranet is a place where UNICOR employees download business forms, share internal news, copies of documents, and files. A share folder structure allows business group's postings of department's information (web pages, uploads). The HTML and Active Server Pages that make up the site are developed in-house and are stored in Visual SourceSafe (UNICOR-VSS) system, which also provides information version control/chronological file management.

A INPUT. Uploads of files and information originating from the Millenium System (N1-129-04-08) such as orders, production, and operations reports. Copies of documents and web-page updates and uploads stored in the UNICOR's VSS System. Non-database input consisting of PDF, DOC, and/or HTML files use to provide news, publications, reports, instructions, phone number directories, office procedures/forms, and news summaries related to each department or business group.

Disposition Temporary Destroy when superceded, obsolete, or no longer needed for reference purposes, whichever is later.

B OUTPUT Phone list information, copies of Millennium-related reports, group event news and schedule, completed forms, and system-related administrative requests (system change requests/changes)

C. DATA Copies of electronic files (HTML/PDF/DOC), images (JPEG), kept in other systems such as Millennium, UNICOR-VSS system, and/or other electronic sources (user's home directories or share directory on the server). User information extracted from a connection to the intranet site and includes the user's internet domain name, IP address, browser and operating system, date and time of connection, areas accessed, information requested, possible errors encountered, and the intranet site from which the connection took place, among other system information elements, primarily collected for statistical analysis and technical improvements to the site.

Disposition Temporary Destroy when no longer needed for reference, trends, analysis or law-enforcement purposes.

D SYSTEM DOCUMENTATION Technical information (including record layout and code books) and instructional documentation demonstrating the use of the system, location of files, tables, and programming parameters, and other system functions

Disposition Temporary Destroy when superceded or no longer needed for system support and/or programming reference purposes, whichever is later
