### 1 <u>Mineral Property Files</u> (New item)

The Mineral Property Files (MPF's) contain hard copy geologic, engineering, and other mining-related information that document, via U.S. Bureau of Mines investigations dating from the 1920s, the mineral potential of thousands of U.S. mine The information was acquired under a variety of Federal sites. defense-related programs such as the War Mineral Report investigations, the Defense Mineral Exploration Administration program, strategic and critical minerals program, and other USBM mineral assessment programs authorized by Federal mineral, environmental, and land-use planning legislation. technical information may include field notes, mine/qeologic/drill hole maps, drill hole logs, sample analyses, drilling and engineering plans and project expenses, quantitative mineral reserves estimates, cost estimates, technical correspondence and reports, and photographs. MPF's contain, in addition to a large amount of nonconfidential data, some company-provided proprietary data and USBM economic evaluations whose confidentiality is provided for by Federal statute (P.L. 96-479, P.L. 62-386).

#### PERMANENT

- a. For non-proprietary and non-confidential data, transfer immediately to the National Archives.
- b. For proprietary and other confidential data, transfer to the Federal Records Center upon closure of the USBM. After 30 years, transfer to the National Archives.

#### 2 Mineral Land Assessment Reports (New item)

The Mineral Land Assessment reports are internal government reports that document the technical results of USBM mineral assessments for Federal land management agencies, mainly, the U.S. Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management. The reports convey information and judgements about the future mineral supply potential of Federal lands obtained through field geologic investigations and economic assessments. The reports also contain inventory and environmental site characterization information on inactive and abandoned mine land sites on Federal lands. These assessments were conducted under the Wilderness Act of 1964, the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976, the Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning Act of 1974, as amended, the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act of 1980, the National Environmental Policy Act, etc., and support Federal land management decisions.

PERMANENT. Transfer to the National Archives upon closure of USBM.
