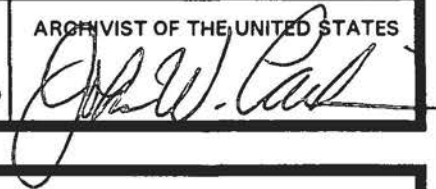


ACTIVE ITEMS. These items, unless subsequently superseded, may be used by the agency to disposition records. It is the responsibility of the user to verify the items are still active.

The Staff served as the focal point for information relating to organizations (or related individuals) involved in tax strike, tax resister, and tax protester activities. It consolidated data and made appropriate dissemination of information relevant to tax enforcement. In doing so, the Staff established liaison with the Federal investigative and law enforcement agencies, and with Senate and House Investigating Committees, which were involved in investigations of these organizations and related individuals.
