Bureau consists of the Director's Office, the Section of Tariffs, the Section of Rates and Informal Cases, the Suspension and Fourth Section Board, and the Special Permission Board.

The Board considers applications made under Section 15 (7), 216 (g), 218 (c), 307 (g) and (i), and 406 (e), relating to the initial disposition (1) by declining to suspend or (2) by entering an order of investigation or (3) by entering an order of investigation and suspension, either on its own motion or on petitions or requests for suspension of schedules and tariffs; and relating to authority to institute investigations into rates, fares, charges, and practices of carriers under Parts I, II, III and IV, as ancillary to such investigations or such investigation and suspension proceedings; and the authority, prior to submission of evidence, to enter orders discontinuing any proceeding when the schedules of tariffs under, which the proceeding arose have been cancelled.
