The FCC base maps are dated 1946 and printed at the scale of 1:5,000,000. The maps are cloth backed and currently post bound. It appears that these maps were used by FCC to plot station locations in an effort to avoid radio interference on the same broadcast frequency by maintaining a visual record of stations already assigned that frequency. New stations were added to (and removed from) the appropriate frequency map as a part of the braodcast license approval process. The creating/maintaining office was either the Chief Engineer or the Broadcast Bureau.
