1. NAME OF SYSTEM: Fire Effects Information System (FEIS)

Applicability: Agency-wide

Description: The Fire Effects Information System provides up-to-date summaries of scientific knowledge about fire effects on plants and animals. The FEIS database contains literature reviews taken from current English-language literature of almost 900 plant species, about 100 animal species, and 16 Kuchler plant communities found on the North American continent. The emphasis of each review is fire and how it affects each species.

a. Inputs Information found within the FEIS is received from scientific literature, government publications, internet, and individual researchers and managers.

TEMPORARY. Delete/Destroy after the data has been entered into the master file or database and Verified, or when no longer required to support reconstruction.

b. Master File. Literature reviews dating from 1986 – present.

PERMANENT. Copy data offline annually. Transfer an annual snapshot to the National Archives at the end of each calendar year in accordance with 36 CFR 1228.270

c. Outputs. Online literature reviews.

TEMPORARY. Destroy/Delete when no longer needed for agency business.

d. Documentation. User guides for plant species and web-based tutorials.

PERMANENT. Transfer to the National Archives along with the Master File (Item 1b) in accordance with 36 CFR 1228.270
