All cha	The Forest Service has responsibility for making recommendations on the nation's renewable resources under Public Law 93-378. Recommendations are developed in two steps. First, an Assessment of the demand for and supply of forest and range land renewable resources, including minerals is conducted. Then, a Forest Service Program is developed that responds to the needs identified in the Assessment. Before an assessment is made, the RPA and FRER (Forest Resource and Economic Research) Staffs and designated resource specialists propose studies to gather information and analyze different assumptions made about future demand and supply of renewable resources. The studies provide data and techniques for analysis in the Assessment report, which are jointly prepared by the RPA and FRER staffs. Renewable resources examined include recreation, wilderness, wildlife and fish, range, timber, water, minerals, and their interactions. The results of the studies are also used in preparing an Enviornmental Impact Statement for the Program. Assessment documents are transmitted to Congress every ten years; the Program, every five years.
