After December, 1966, correspondence documenting the activities of the Business and Defense Services Administration and its successor, the Bureau of Domestic Commerce, was integrated into the file.</del></p> <p>The files are generally divided into the following elements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a. A white copy file containing the second copy of each outgoing piece of correspondence. Arranged alphabetically by name of addressee, this copy shows the subject classification in the upper left hand corner and serves as a finding medium for outgoing correspondence.</li><li>b. A general subject file arranged in accordance with the appropriate file manual. Between 1945 and 1949, the Federal Economic Administration Subject-Numeric Classification System was used. The Dewey Decimal System followed from 1950 to 1968. Thereafter, an alpha-numeric classification scheme was employed. Copies of the latter two are attached for your reference.</li><li>c. Record copies of publications, operations memoranda and the like arranged chronologically.
