Typical subjects include prison mess duty rosters; removal of unopened packages from the prison confines; use of recreational facilities (e.g., radio, television, films, etc.); establishment of an alert plan; notice of official holidays.

2. Minutes of the Prison Board Meetings, ca. 1947-58, 3 in.

Proceedings of the War Criminal Prison Board, beginning with their initial meeting in December, 1947. Files contain data describing the location, physical size and condition, available facilities, immate capacity and current prisoner population of Landsberg Prison. The 1947 file addresses the estimated number of additional arrivals to be expected as a result of the trials then underway at Dachau and Nurnberg. The prisoner rehabilitation program launched in September, 1947, is discussed in considerable detail, as are such subjects as prison administration, personnel requirements and what was the appropriate representation of military, U.S. civilians, and indigenous European nationals among the prison staff; prison discipline. Cases of individual prisoners are referred to in the context of requests for clemency and release received from relatives and/or legal counsel, and complaints as to conditions in the prison. For example, one inmate complained of the effect of hearing fellow-prisoners being executed: " ... every Friday night they had to hear the awful noises of the weekly executions. ... He says these procedures pressed on their nerves especially in the next morning [when] they have to pass the gallows from which prisoners are still hanging."

Other items of note include a report summarizing a study of the prisoners' diet by the Post Surgeon; a series of pie charts which detail the types of work engaged in by prisoners at Landsberg and the percentage of the prison population involved in each; another chart indicating the original professions of the inmates; a history of the prison from the time of its construction in 1905-08 to 1954.
