	<p>OPERATIONS DATABASE (OPSDB)</p> <p>Background Operations Database (OPSDSB) supports the FORSCOM Operation Center and HQ FORSCOM OPSDS provides the FOC staff software to record, track and monitor current operations including world crisis, training exercises, national and regional emergencies and military deployments OPSDS is a classified system The OPSDS Message Tracking Module came on-line in 1999 The Message Tracking Module of the OPSDS provides the means to store AUTODIN messages The information contained in the database is from 2000 forward OPSDS contains AUTODIN messages, faxes, memorandums for record, e-mails, and word documents which are considered classified Authorized users retrieve stored information by querying by date and/or operation or group pick lists OPSDS is client server technology and is only available within HQ FORSCOM AUTODIN messages, faxes, memorandum for record, and word documents are grouped by operation inbound and outbound traffic into an Oracle database for extraction as flat files and native documents which are transferred to CD-ROMs The inputs are from AUTODIN messages (depord, warnord, exord, planord sitreps, etc) an stored in binary or text format in the database</p>
