**SECTION III – APPRAISER'S COMMENTS**

This job, submitted by the Army, provides for the disposal after 65 years of certain automated indexes used to locate individuals who were the subjects in Army medical research projects. These records clearly lack archival value, particularly since they contain no substantive information concerning the nature of the specific projects. However, they have long term legal rights implications, and accordingly, the 65 year retention period is justified.
