In this disposition request, Army is proposing to increase the retention period for its Reserve Unit Attendance Files (FN 1003-05) from the current 50 years to 100. This change is based on anticipated reference need as well as a change in the pertinent law. These records are key source of certifying reservists for retirement pay at age 60 and in providing benefits to their heirs. The records, which are maintained at RCPAC, total around 7,500 cubic feet in volume; they are now being microfilmed (per NCl-AU-78-89) and the hardcopy destroyed. I recommend approval. NNM's concurrence is not required.
