By a letter of March 30, 1978, NCD advised the Army that its disposition for File Number 217-11 (Tumor registry file) was unscheduled and would need the Archivist's approval. NCl-AU-83-53 is the Army's request to schedule that series.

SECTION III - APPRAISER'S COMMENTS

Because of the continuing importance of these records—mostly accounts of the diagnosis and treatment of tumors—to medical science and individual physicians, military medical staffs cannot put a disposal date on these records. Yet that same importance requires that the records be kept available for frequent and easy consultation. Thus the Army proposes that the records be kept at military medical facilities—not retired to FRCs—suntil military medical staffs determine that the records are disposable.

As specific case files eventually will lose their value to the Army (or any others) in documenting diagnosis and treatment or in furnishing material for research about tumors, the non-archival series does not possess permanent scientific, legal, or value, though the proposed disposition does satisfy the Army's needs. I therefore recommend that NCl-AU-83-53 be approved.
