	This job seeks the disposal of 48 cubic feet of Navy records recently accessioned from holdings of the Naval Historical Center's Operational Archives Branch at the Washington National Records Center. The first two of the three groups of records have previously been appraised as disposable by NARA's WNRC Records Disposition Project (NN-WS). The first group also appears at one time to have been under agency consideration "for destruction by burning" according to information found inside the FRC cartons. The records herein proposed for disposal have been determined to lack the essential informational, evidential, or intrinsic value necessary to justify their permanent retention. The records are described below in three groups.		
1.	RECORDS OF THE SECURITY REVIEW SECTION, OFFICE OF PUBLIC RELATIONS ca. 1944-48, NHC Entry 66(4), 43 cubic ft. Records relate to manuscripts submitted for security review and possible censorship and consist, for the most part, of routine correspondence along with occasional copies of the manuscripts themselves. The records are virtually unarranged and have no accompanying finding aids or indexes. (Appraised as disposable by NN-WS).		
2.	MISCELLANEOUS COLLECTION OF BOOKS AND PERIODICALS ca. 1940's (filed with RECORDS OF POLITICAL WARFARE SECTION, U.S. NAVAL FORCES EUROPE), NHC Entry 76, 2 cubic ft. Monographs relating to European history and foreign affairs and periodicals such as <u>Free France</u> and the <u>Soviet New Times</u> . The publications
