# **National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH)**

## **Description:**

Begun in 1971, the National Household Survey on Drug Abuse (renamed in 2002 to the National Survey on Drug Use and Health [NSDUH]) is an annual survey of the civilian, non-institutionalized population of the United States aged 12 years old or older NSDUH is the primary source of information on the use of illicit drugs, alcohol, and tobacco in the civilian, non-institutionalized population of the United States aged 12 years old or older Measures related to mental health problems also are presented, including data on serious mental illness, depression, and the co-occurrence of substance use and metal health problems. The survey interviews approximately 67,500 persons each year.

# 1 Inputs

Input data files consist of raw data on substance use, mental health, and demographics collected by field interviewers on computers at the respondents' place of residence

NOTE If data is are directly submitted in electronic format there is no input record to dispose of-

#### 2 Master Data Files Reporting Data

The data files include information such as interviewee's demographics (age, sex, ethnicity, race, marital status), drug or substance used (marijuana, alcohol, hallucinogens, cocaine, non-prescription medications), frequency of substance use, mental health problems (adult and/or youth depression, psychological distress) and mental health service utilization, among others. In addition, variables representing sample design, statistical adjustments, and records are also included in the micro-data files in order to produce trend data, special reports, or conduct methodological studies as needed.
