SAMHSA OAS Drug Abuse Warning Network (DAWN)

Description:

DAWN is a large scale data collection system that tracks all types of drug-related emergency department (ED) visits and drug-related deaths, regardless of the drug involved or the reason for drug use. DAWN covers incidents related to non-medical use of prescription and over-the counter medications, use of pharmaceuticals for legitimate therapeutic purposes, and drug abuse. In addition to the abuse of illegal drugs, DAWN collects cases related to overmedication, malicious poisoning, suicide attempts and underage alcohol use, as well as cases involving accidental ingestion or adverse reaction to prescription and over-the counter medications or dietary supplements.

1 Inputs

DAWN files consist of data collection forms supplied by emergency rooms on an ongoing basis in selected standard metropolitan statistical areas, and randomly throughout the country

<u>Disposition</u> TEMPORARY Retain in active file for six months, keep in inactive file and destroy when five years old. (Apply existing authority NC1-90-82-9, item 1b1)

2 Master Data Files

Data consists of date and time of visit, patient demographics (age, race/ethnicity, sex), zip code, a narrative case, description, chief complaints, type of case, diagnoses, disposition, and up to 7 drugs, their route of administration, and whether their presence was confirmed by toxicology DAWN includes all types of drugs Illegal drugs of abuse, Prescription and over-the-counter medications, dietary supplements, non-pharmaceutical inhalants, alcohol in combination with other drugs (adults and children) and alcohol alone (age < 21)

Date Span 1972 to present, survey conducted annually Public Use files currently exist for 1994 and 1997

a Raw Data Files

<u>Disposition</u> PERMANENT Cut off files annually Transfer to the National Archives three years after cutoff (Apply existing authority NC1-90-82-9 item 1 b 3)

NOTE The agency cannot currently transfer raw data files due to access restrictions

b Public Use Data Files The public-use files do not contain indirect identifiers that would lead to the identification of individuals. Statistical disclosure limitation measures have been applied in such a way that all estimates from the public-use files are very close to those from the restricted-use files, and the public-use files have been weighted so that valid inferences can be made for the applicable geographic areas and populations. Some of these files are currently available to the public via the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Data Archive (http://www.icpsr.umich.edu/SAMHDA/index.html)
