	Federal, State, and local law enforcement agencies use information from the system for enforcement of boating laws 'or theft and fraud investigations. In addition, when encountering a vessel suspected of illegal activity, information from the system increases safety by assisting boarding officers in determining how best to approach the vessel. In States that do not have an approved system, the U.S. Coast Guard is responsible for administering the system. Currently, all 56 States and Territories have approved numbering systems. States submit reports annually to the Coast Guard on the number, size, construction and machinery of vessels they have numbered. This information is used by the Coast Guard in (1) publication of an annual "Boating Statistics" report required by 46 U.S.C. 6102(b), and (2) for allocation of Federal funds to assist States in carrying out the Recreational Boating Safety (RBS) Program established by 46 U.S.C. chapter 131.
