Letter of Correction or Warning</p> <p>Destroy/removed from the pilot's files after 2 years if no other violation occurs.</p> <p>JUSTIFICATION: The Coast Guard Auxiliary is a nonmilitary volunteer organization of private citizens who own small boats, aircraft, or radio stations. The volunteers assist the Coast Guard by conducting free boating education programs, patrolling marine regattas, participating in search and rescue operations, and conducting courtesy marine examinations to have owners ensure their boats are ready for the water. Auxiliary members use their own vessels to patrol or assist boaters. Personnel records include individual qualifications, such as training in search and rescue, or in boat safety. Records of those who are retired or deceased are transferred to a NARA records center.</p>
