1. RECREATIONAL BOATING ACCIDENT REPORT SYSTEM. These electronic records consist of statistical information taken from Boating Accident Reports submitted to the United States Coast Guard in accordance with 46 United Stated Code The reports received are used to generate statistics on marine casualties. The owner/operator of a vessel submits the accident report when as a result of an occurrence that involves the vessel or equipment: (1) a person dies; (2) a person is injured and requires medical treatment beyond first aid; (3) damage to the vessel and other property totals more than \$500 or there is a complete loss of a vessel; or (4) a person disappears from the vessel under circumstances that indicate death or injury. Some of the information covered in the records are: county, state and type of body of water; the number of deaths; the number of injuries; the type of vessel; the type of accident; the cause of the accident; and the type, propulsion, hull material, manufacturer's code and year built of the reporting operator's vessel. [January 1969 and thereafter]
