F. ARRANGEMENT AND NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION.

Arranged by subject. All folders are labelled with the file designation CO-3-34040 which was the general subject number used by USSS for records relating to the assassination. All USSS documents (approx. 450) have their own control number. Other agency records (approx. 150) were not renumbered by the Service.

Investigative reports, correspondence, interviews, biographical profiles, transcripts of telephone conversations, internal memoranda, and other records prepared or gathered by the United States Secret Service concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. Although records dated as early as 1954 and as late as 1977 are found in this series, the great majority of the file was created by the Protective Research Section (predecessor of the present Intelligence Division) during the period November, 1963 to April, 1964. As the Federal Bureau of Investigation assumed greater responsibility for the assassination investigation, the role of the Protective Research Section diminished. After March, 1964, the PRS functioned primarily as liaison between the Service and the Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy.

Approximately one-third of the 600 documents in this series were received by the Service from other agencies including the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Central Intelligence Agency, State Department, and Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms. Exhibit materials found in the series included tape recordings of interviews and photographs of the President's limousine and the general area where the assassination occurred.
