



ICEGangs

ICEGangs is a web-based system utilized by the U S Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) National Gang Unit to record, track, and analyze information on gangs, gang activities, and suspected or confirmed gang members, and their associates

Gangs are defined as a formal or informal group, club, organization or association, of three (3) or more persons, that has as one of its purposes the commission of criminal activity in the United States or outside of the United States, committed two (2) or more criminal acts on separate or distinct occasions, and the members of which may share a common identifying sign, symbol or name

ICEGangs allows law enforcement officials to

Search for information on gang members, gangs, and commonly used gang symbols and tattoos

Enter new gang members into the database

Add or modify existing information on suspected and/or confirmed gang members/gangs

Create link diagrams to analyze the relationships between gang members/gangs

View statistical reports on gang activity

View reports on gang activity

(2) General Gang Related Information

ICEGang maintains general information on gangs, which is kept in the system as long as the gang organization meets the criteria for a gang (see System Description)

Disposition:

TEMPORARY Cutoff at end of calendar year organization no longer meets the criteria for a gang Destroy/delete five (5) years after cutoff, or when no longer needed for reference or business needs, whichever is later

C. Output

(1) Ad Hoc Reports

~~Data can be queried on an Ad Hoc basis to create various types of reports that are exported to an Excel spreadsheet by system administrators and Security Control Officers (SGO's). These reports can include gang rosters or statistical reports on demographics, and link analysis reports that identify commonalities between records in ICEGangs based on user-defined queries and criteria.~~

Disposition (Media Neutral): GRS 20, item 16

(2) Photographic Lineups

The ICEGangs "Photo Line-up" Tool is used to produce a series of photos of subjects that are identified by a user defined query. These photos are arranged as a photo line-up that is printed and shown to witnesses and victims to help identify suspected gang members or associates.
