1	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Japanese American Redress Verification Information System (JARVIS)</u></p> <p>The Office of Redress Administration (ORA) was established within the Civil Rights Division of the Department of Justice to implement Section 105 of the Civil Liberties Act of 1988, Public Law 100-383. This section of the Act provided for restitution to persons of Japanese ancestry who were evacuated, relocated, interned, or otherwise deprived of their liberty and property as a result of U.S. Government actions during World War II. Tax-free redress payments in the sum of \$20,000 were to be paid to each of the affected individuals who met the eligibility requirements. JARVIS has been developed to assist ORA in the fulfillment of this legal requirement.</p> <p><u>Master File.</u></p> <p>Data consists of Department of Justice identification numbers (DJ number), potential recipient contact information such as name, address, social security number, and date of birth; contact data with each recipient; data used to verify contacts</p> <p><i>cc Agency, NWML</i></p>


