Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division: Election Monitoring System (EMS)

The Voting Rights Act provides for the appointment of federal observers by order of a federal court pursuant to Section 3(a), or, with regard to political subdivisions covered under Section 4 of the Voting Rights Act, upon the certification by the Attorney General, pursuant to Section 8 (previously Section 6) A total of 149 counties and parishes in 10 states have been certified by the Attorney General: Alaska (1), Alabama (22 counties), Arizona (3), Georgia (29), Louisiana (12), Mississippi (50), New York (3), North Carolina (1), South Carolina (11) and Texas (17).

Section 3(a) of the Voting Rights Act provides that a federal court may authorize the appointment of federal observers by the Director of the Office of Personnel Management to serve in a political subdivision for such period of time as the court deems appropriate to enforce the voting guarantees of the fourteenth or fifteenth amendment A total of 12 political subdivisions in 9 states are currently certified by federal court order California (1), Illinois (1), Louisiana (1), Massachusetts (1), New Jersey (1), New Mexico (2), New York (1) South Dakota (2), and Texas (2).

The monitoring of elections by federal observers is an important aspect of the Voting Section's enforcement efforts. In some instances there are concerns about racial discrimination in the voting process; other times monitoring is done to ensure compliance with bilingual election procedures. The success of the federal observer program in consistently achieving both of these objectives is possible by the long-term commitment of the United States Office of Personnel Management to recruit, train, and supervise these federal employees, who serve as neutral and impartial observers of election-day procedures, and by cooperation and coordination with state and local election officials. At least one Department attorney, in conjunction with OPM personnel, coordinates election activities in the field

In addition to monitoring elections with federal observers, the Voting Section may also monitor elections where federal observers are not authorized. A jurisdiction may ask for the Department to monitor a potentially contentious election or through internal investigations the Department may deem it prudent to monitor a specific election. The Voting Section sends Department attorneys and non-attorneys to gather information and interview voters, poll workers and poll officials.
