The administrative files of the Displaced Persons Commission document how the commission formulated policy and established procedure for the admissions into the United States of the displaced peoples of World War II. These files are used by the Office of Special Investigations attorneys as background and to corroborate charges of inadmissibility into the United States of certain individuals. They may be used as evidence in court.

Disposition: Permanent. Transfer to the National Archives & Records Administration in the year 2000, or upon the dissolution of the Office of Special Investigations, whichever is sooner.
